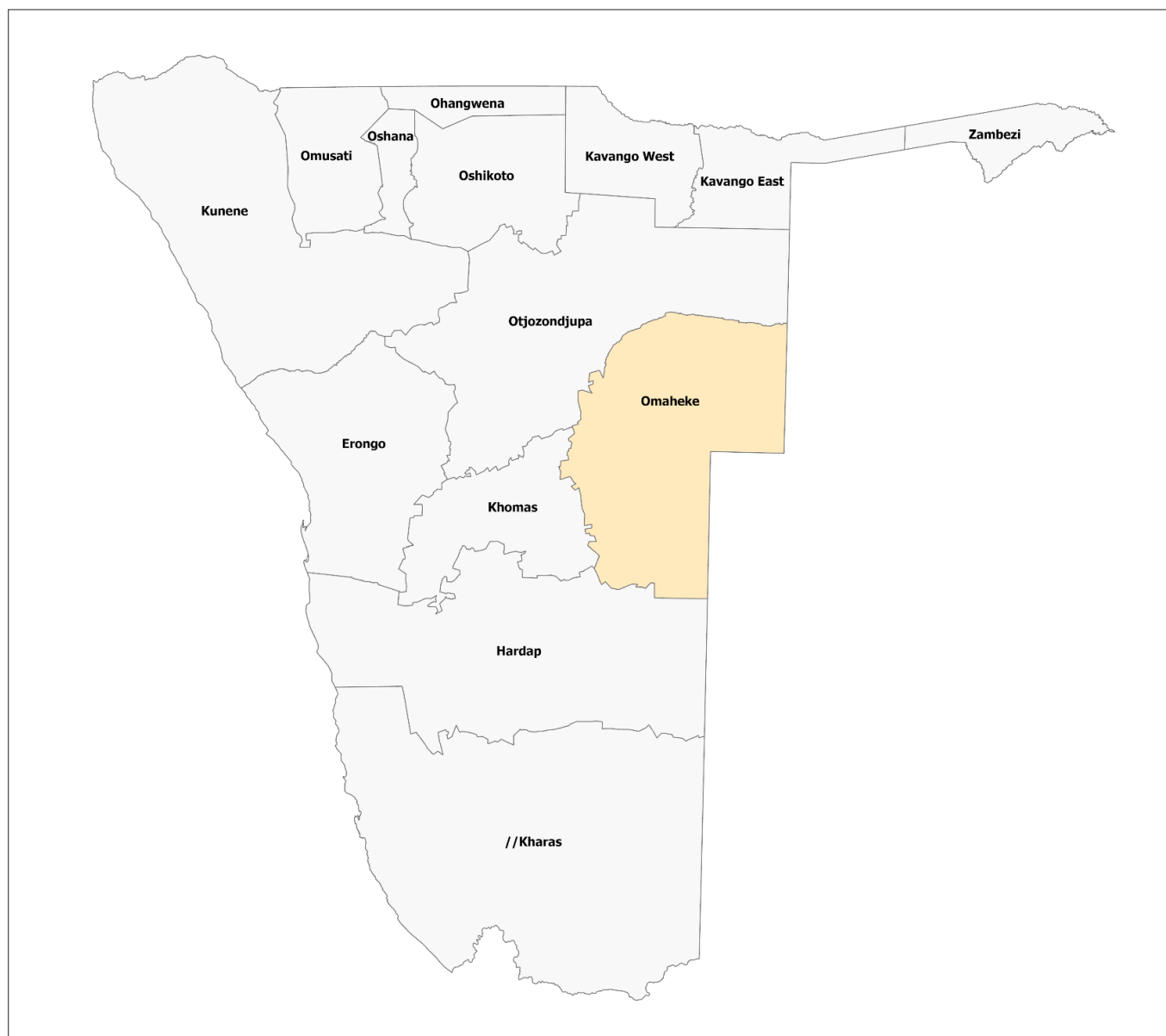

FOREWORD



The Government of the Republic of Namibia, through the Namibia Statistics Agency, conducted the fourth Namibia Population and Housing Census in September 2023 with the 24th of September 2023 being the census reference night (CRN). The Population and Housing Census (PHC) is the most comprehensive and reliable national data resource that provides critical input into national development planning and programs. The census further provides data to measure the impact of various development programs embarked upon by Government, NGOs, and other stakeholders in Namibia. The data produced from the 2023 census gave impetus to developing baselines for the national development plans such as the Sixth National Development Plan (6th NDP), and the Vision 2030.

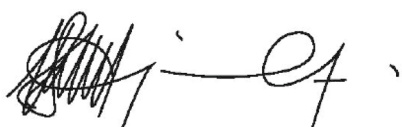
This report highlights key findings from an initial analysis of the 2023 census data, concentrating on the **Omaheke region** at urban, rural, and constituency levels. The results are essential for guiding the Government, development partners, civil society organizations, and the public on aspects such as the region's population size, population distribution, and population composition among other factors. Also please take note that similar reports for the other thirteen regions were also produced and published.

Please note that some statistical indicators presented in this Regional Profile may differ slightly from those published in the 2023 Census Main Report. These insignificant differences are primarily due to revisions made after the release of the 2023 Census Main report and during further data validation and analysis at the regional level. Users are advised to interpret the figures in these regional reports with this context in mind.

I would like to express our sincere gratitude to all the partners who supported and contributed to the success of the 2023 Namibia Population and Housing Census. This includes the Government of the Republic of Namibia, various Ministries and Government institutions, Mobile Telecommunications Limited (MTC Namibia), Namibian Broadcasting Corporation (NBC), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA), Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) and the United Kingdom's Office of National Statistics (ONS) for their invaluable support in numerous ways.

CHAPTER 1 : INTRODUCTION

The Namibia Statistics Agency (NSA) is mandated by Part III, Section 7, sub-section 2 (d) of the Statistics Act No.9 of 2011, to conduct Population and Housing Censuses every ten (10) years. This places a legal obligation on all NSA employees and stakeholders involved in the implementation of the Namibia 2023 Population and Housing Census (henceforth referred to as the 2023 Census) to record, process, analyze and disseminate responses received during the 2023 census enumeration truthfully and accurately. The Statistics Act, through Part VIII, Sections 44 and 45 underscores the importance of data security in that all personnel involved in the 2023 Census sign the Oath of Secrecy that ensures data collected in the 2023 Census that could be linked to individuals and households are kept strictly confidential.

The 2023 Census was the fourth undertaking since Namibia's independence in 1990, and the first spatially enabled digital census in the country. The first complete census was conducted in 1991, followed by the second and third censuses, conducted in 2001 and 2011 respectively.

The main objective of the 2023 Census is to provide up-to-date demographic and socio-economic statistical information about the population and their living conditions, necessary for evidence-based planning, decision-making, and policy formulation. The 2023 Census further provides data for monitoring and evaluation of development programs at national, regional, and constituency levels while also providing the indicators to evaluate progress against national and international Agenda such as Vision 2030, National Development Plans (NDPs), Harambee Prosperity Plan, Sectoral Plans, Africa Agenda 2063 and the Agenda 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The 2023 Census enumeration was carried out over three weeks from 18 September to 06 October 2023. The first week (18 – 23 September 2023) was dedicated to the household listing exercise and thereafter the enumeration of all persons and housing units took place from 24 September to 06 October 2023). The 2023 Census Reference Night (CRN) was the night of the 24 September 2023.

The 2023 Census targeted the population in conventional/private households including those in institutions for example, in school hostels, army/police barracks, hospitals wards, correctional facilities and special population groups such as the homeless, travelers, sea workers etc. Therefore, the actual population presented in this report reflects the Namibia population on the CRN census in 2023.

This report presents highlights from basic analysis of the 2023 census data and presents results at regional, urban, rural and constituency levels.

1.1. Methodology

The 2023 Census adopted a de facto method of enumeration, which is the enumeration of all persons in the country at a particular point in time. The Census project was implemented in three broad phases as per the international standards and best practices. as follows:

1.1.1. Pre-Enumeration phase

This phase covered census planning, census mapping, census tools development such as questionnaire development, edit rules, scripting of the questionnaire, Computer-Assisted-Personal-Interviews (CAPI) application development and testing, and the like. phase kicked off with the census mapping exercise in October 2019 and concluded with the Census pilot in November 2021.

The census mapping, in particular, entails visiting and enumerating all structures in the country including the collection of basic information on their use. The purpose of this exercise was to demarcate the entire country into uniquely defined units known as Enumeration Areas (EAs) in preparation for the census enumeration. A total of 8,738 EAs were demarcated nationally and formed the basis for all census logistics.

Similarly, the census pilot was undertaken to assess the readiness of all census tools, processes and logistical arrangements. The pilot was implemented in 109 purposively selected EAs (54 EAs from urban areas and 55 EAs from rural areas) across the country.

1.1.2. Enumeration phase

The enumeration phase comprised of the finalization of census tools, census publicity and advocacy, recruitment and training of field staff, transport and logistics, listing, main enumeration, and data transmission.

The main enumeration commenced country-wide from 25 September 2023 to 06 October 2023, however, with extensions for final verifications, the fieldwork only concluded officially on 05 November 2023. Three different questionnaires were administered: Form A for Private/conventional households and Form B for Institutional (School hostels, Army barracks, prisons, University hostel, etc.) households and Form C for Special populations (Hospitals - inpatient, hotels, travelers, homeless, etc.). Form A had individual/person records, household records, and mortality records. While Form B only had individual/personal records. In contrast, Form C had only 8 individual/person records.

The deployment comprised of assigning an enumerator to an EA in urban areas, while in rural areas, two enumerators were allocated to an EA in a sweeping mode. These field staff were supported by a team supervisor, constituency supervisor, constituency IT field technician, constituency fleet officer, constituency publicity officer, deputy regional census coordinator, and regional census coordinator. All these levels ensured daily data transmission from the field to the head office server to avoid loss of data.

Finally, to safeguard the quality of the 2023 Census data, a total quality assurance approach based on the Namibia Quality Assurance Framework for Statistics (NQAFS) was adopted. This approach ensured the quality of digital tile packages, printed maps, questionnaires, applications, field manuals, and training of all census staff. The census data quality assurance manual was developed to inform fieldwork procedures, plans, and guidelines. In addition, the census dashboard that extracts data from the central server was developed and used by the data monitoring team to check for data inconsistencies and flag out areas of concern during enumeration.

The summary checks on the data received from the central server were shared with the regional field staff and verification was carried out during data collection to ensure data quality. Furthermore, the NSA conducted a Post Enumeration Survey (PES) to measure the coverage and content error of census data.

During enumeration, the census situation room was set up at the head office to provide overall management oversight of the enumeration progress using the census dashboard and daily regional reports. This platform provided an opportunity to timely resolve issues and challenges experienced in the field on a daily basis.

1.1.3. Post-Enumeration Phase

The post-enumeration activities include the data processing, release of preliminary results, and thematic analysis and dissemination of census results. The use of technology at all stages of the census enabled timely processing of census data and the production of reports. The quality of the census data can be affirmed by the results of Post Enumeration Surveys.

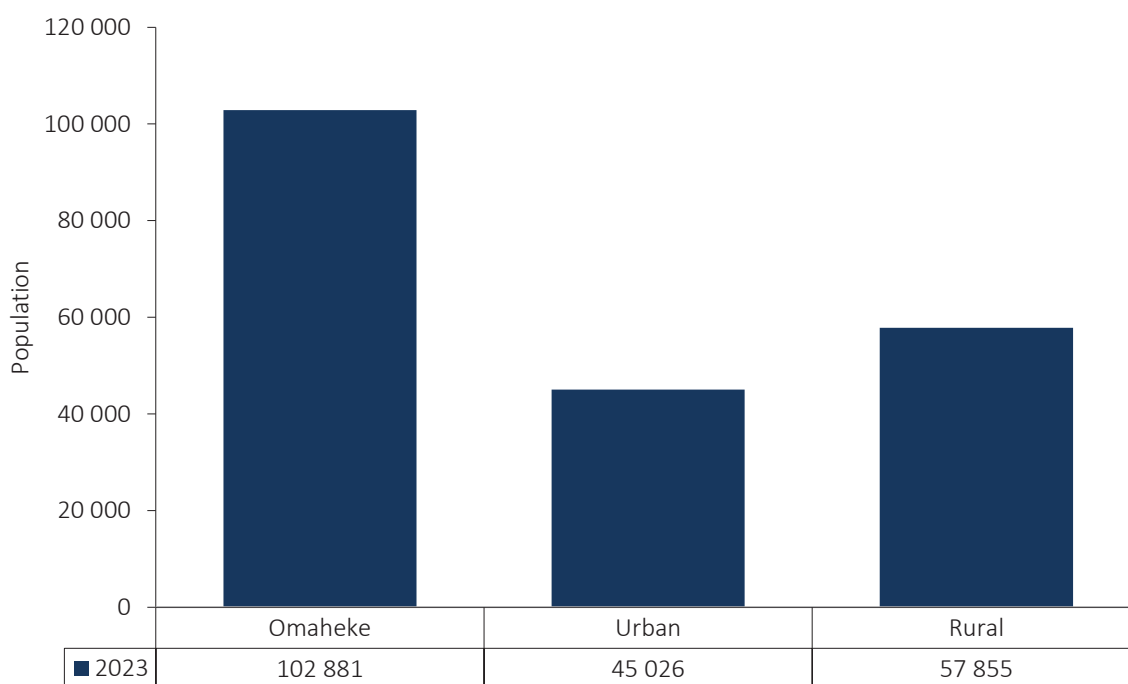
CHAPTER 2 : POPULATION SIZE, GROWTH AND COMPOSITION

This chapter presents highlights of the population characteristics related to size, growth and composition for Kavango East region based on the 2011 and 2023 census results.

2.1. Population size and Growth

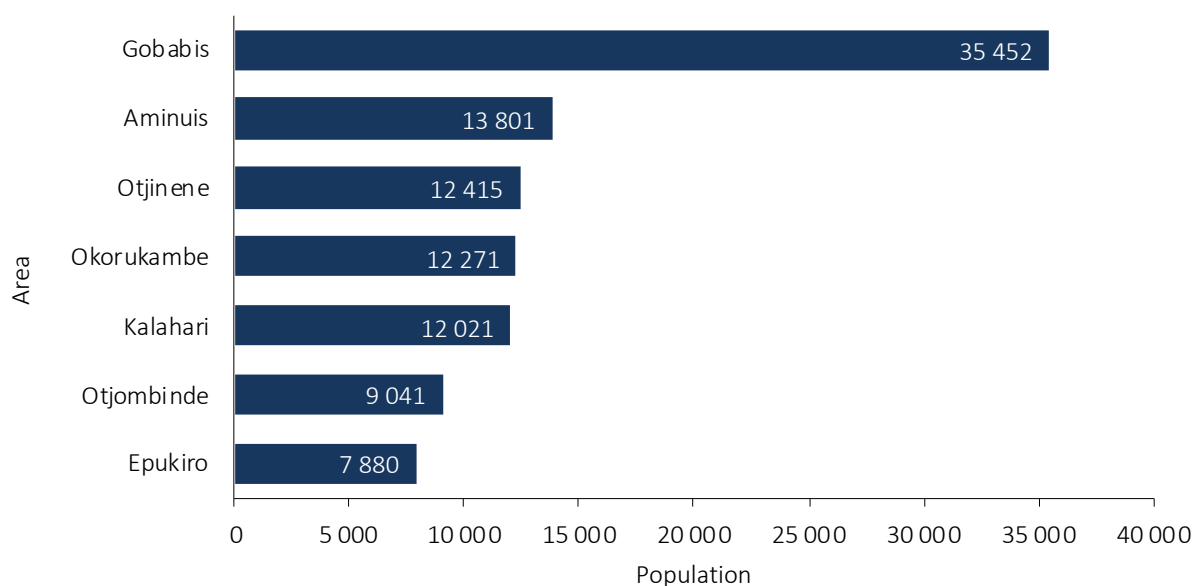
The population of Omaheke region was 102,881, in 2023. More people reside in rural areas (57,855) compared to 45,026 people in urban areas.

The largest population in Omaheke was found in Gobabis (35,452) while the constituency with the least population was Epukiro (7,880).

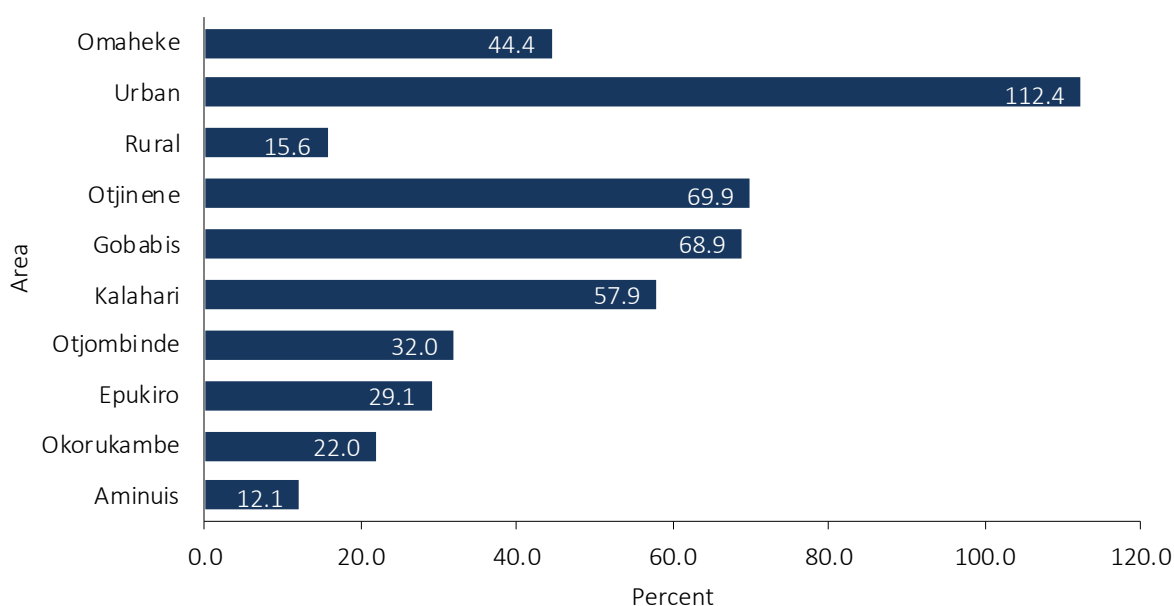
Figure 2.2: Population size by constituency: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census



The population of Omaheke increased by 44.4 percent between 2011 and 2023. The urban population has increased significantly, by 112.4 percent, and the rural population increased, by 15.6 percent. The population increased in all the constituencies, with percentage changes varied significantly, ranging from 12.1 percent in Aminuis to 69.9 percent in Otjinene.

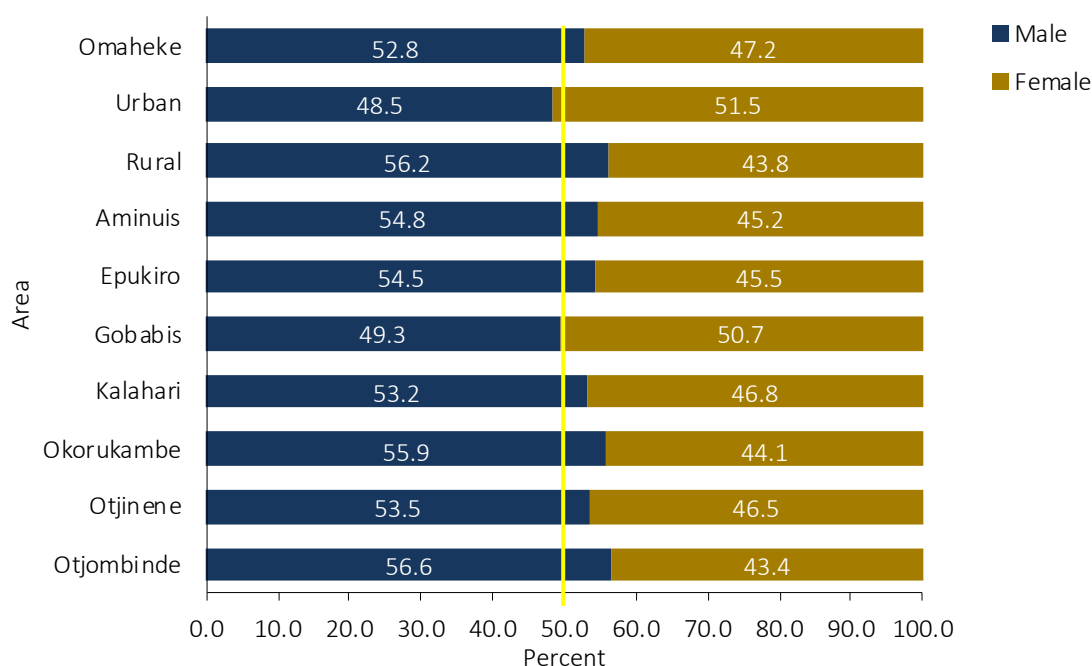

2.2. Sex composition

There were more males (52.8%) than females (47.2%) in Omaheke region. There were significantly more males relatively to females in rural (56.2%) than urban (48.5%) areas. This overall pattern is replicated in all the constituencies except Gobabis where there were more females (50.7%) than males (49.3%).

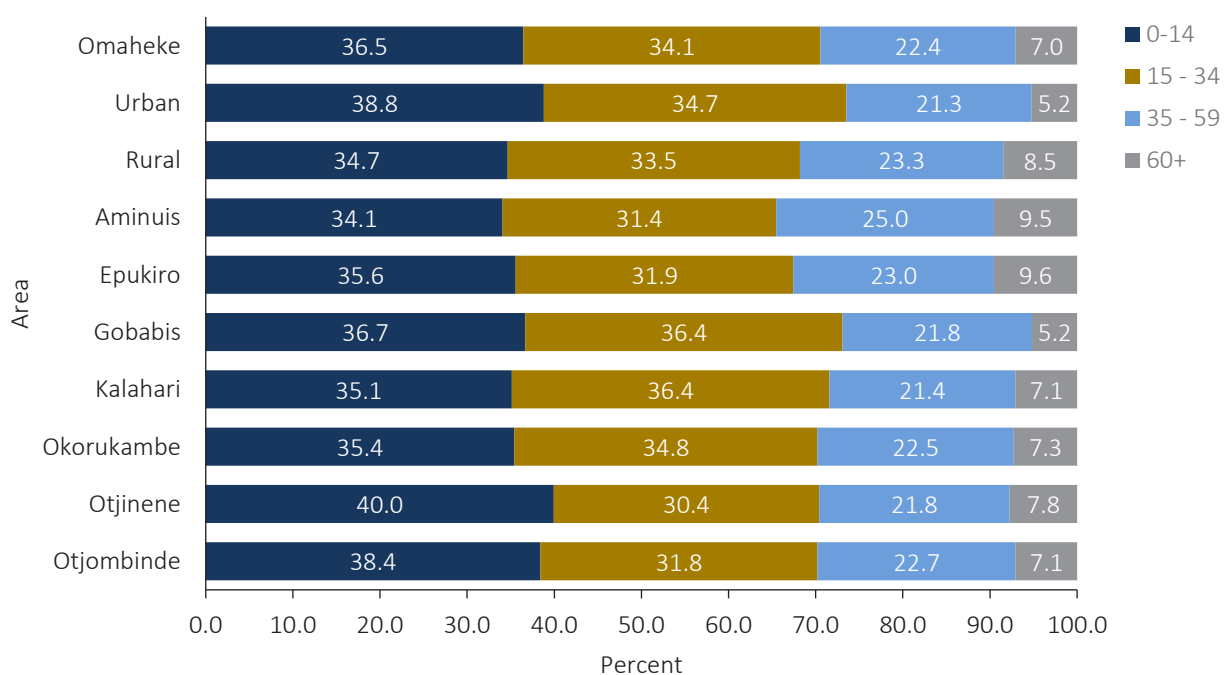
Figure 2.4: Percent population share [Composition] by area and sex: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census



2.3. Age structure

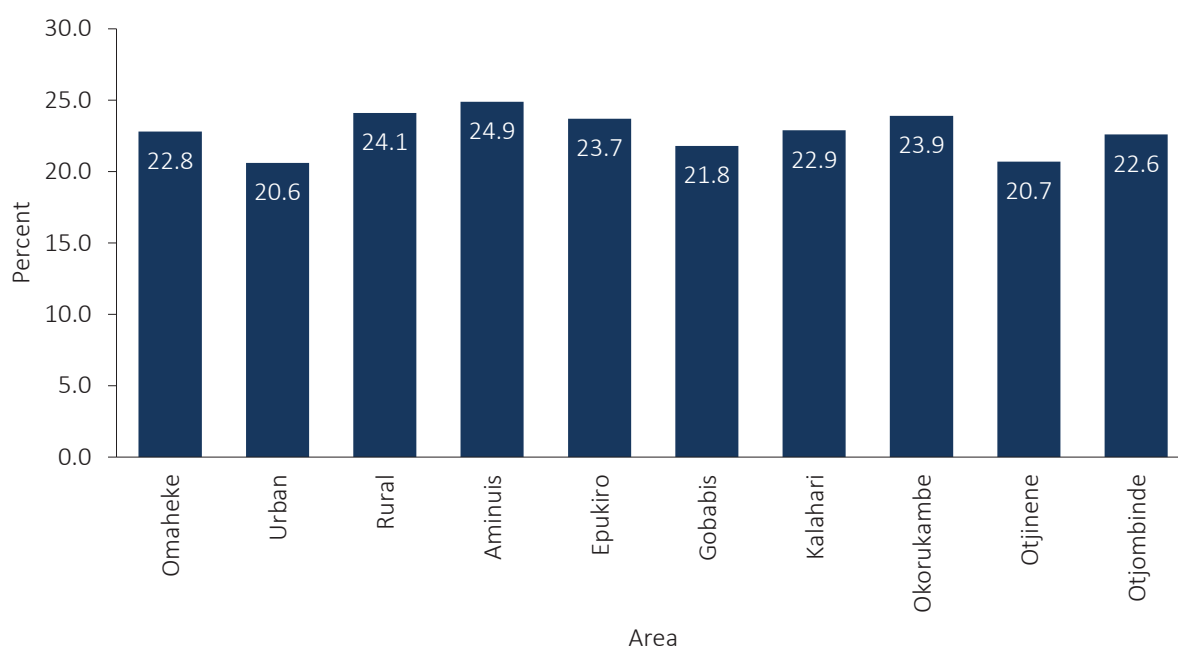
Omaheke region is dominated by the young and youthful population. Persons aged 0-14 and 15-34 years constituted over two-thirds (70.5%) of the population. This regional pattern is replicated in all areas, except in Aminuis constituency (65.5%).

The median age of the population in Omaheke region was 22.8 years. The population was younger in urban (20.6 years) compared to rural (24.1 years) areas. However, significant variation was observed across the constituencies, the least being Otjinene (20.7 years) and the highest being Aminuis (24.9 years).

2.4. Population density

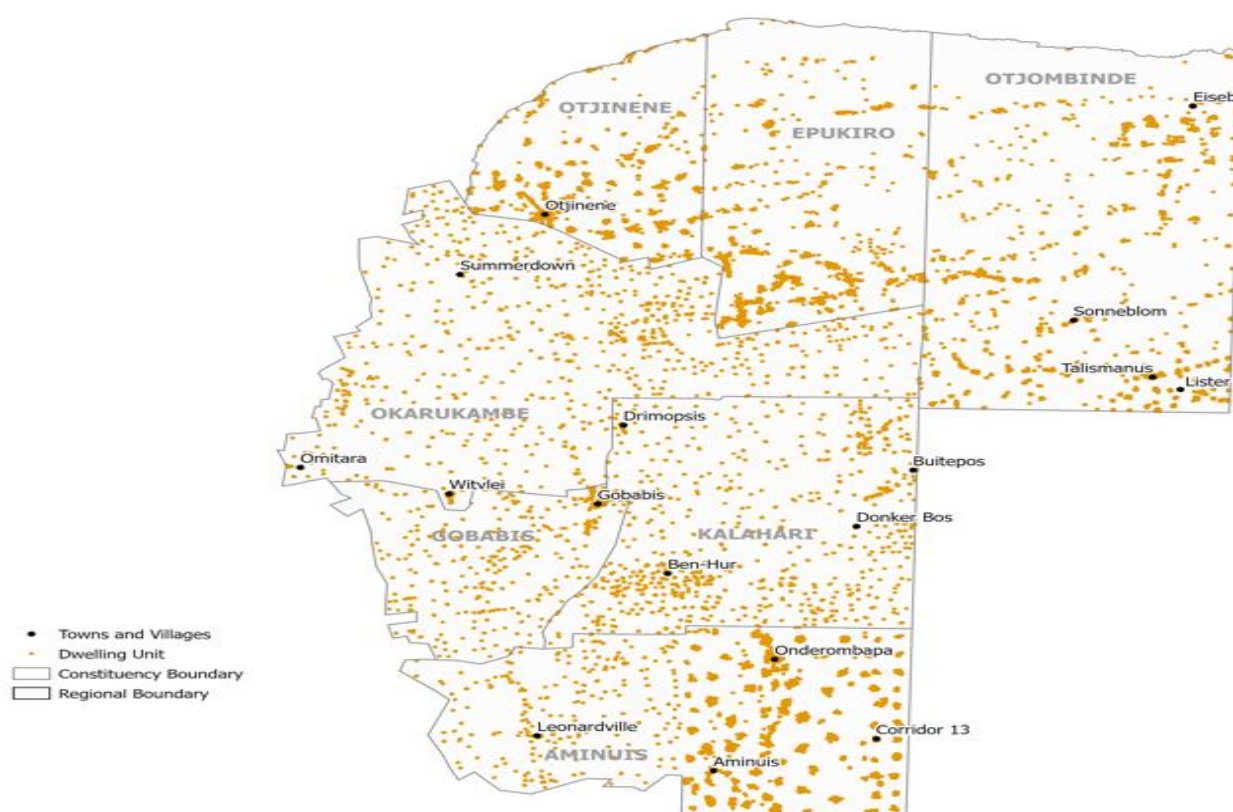

The Omaheke region is predominantly sparsely populated, with the highest concentration of residential dwellings found in four constituencies (Gobabis, Otjinene, Aminuis and Kalahari). Urban areas serve as primary population hubs, while the rest of the region remains largely rural with scattered dwellings.

Figure 2.7: Concentration of residential structures: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census



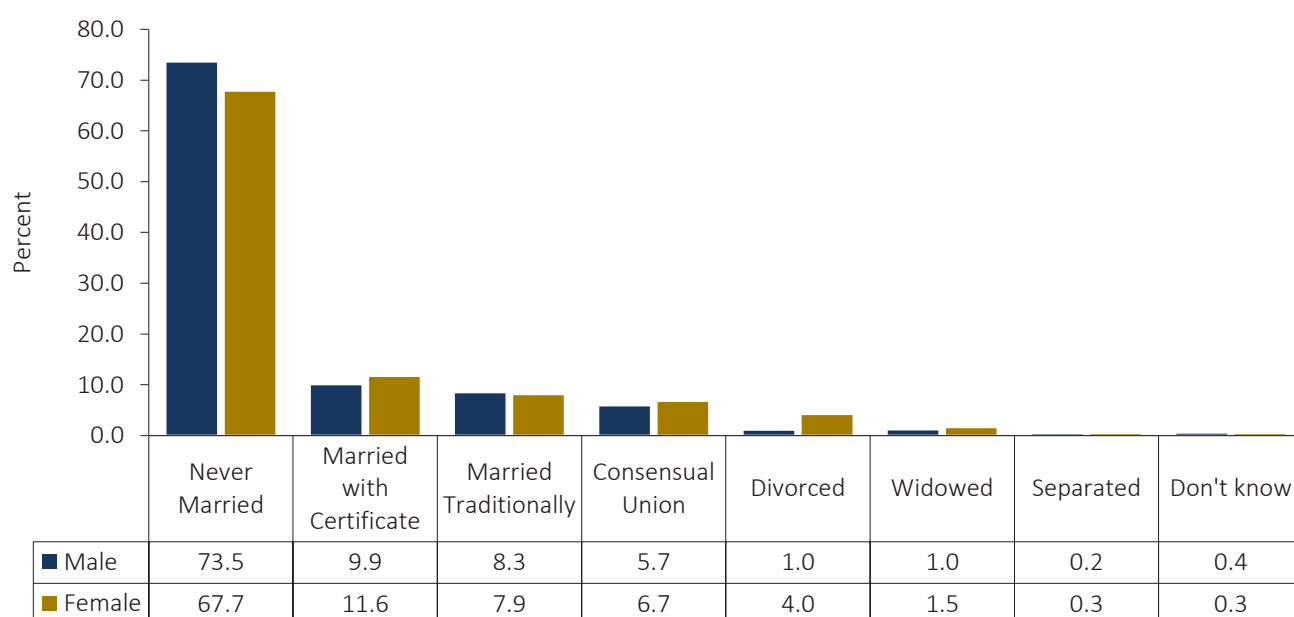
CHAPTER 3 : BACKGROUND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

This chapter provides information on marital status, citizenship, birth registration, national ID, difficulties in performing activities and functioning, albinism, and orphanhood.

3.1. Marital Status and Age at first marriage

In Omaheke region, 73.5 percent of the male population aged 15 years and above were never married, compared to 67.7 percent of females.

The median age at first marriage/consensual union in Omaheke was 30.0, with males having a higher median age (32.1) than females (27.5) and the same trend was observed across all areas

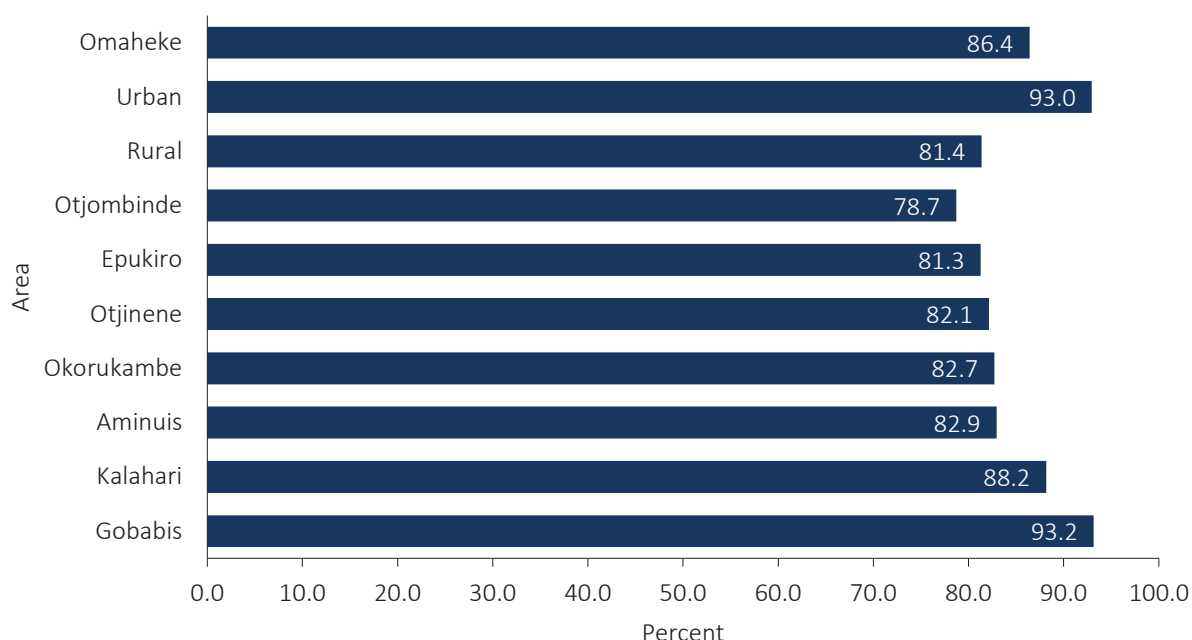
This section provides information on Namibian birth registration status, national ID and death registration.

3.2.1 Birth registration

This subsection provides information on Namibian birth registration status, which is needed to access social services, such as social grants and educational services.

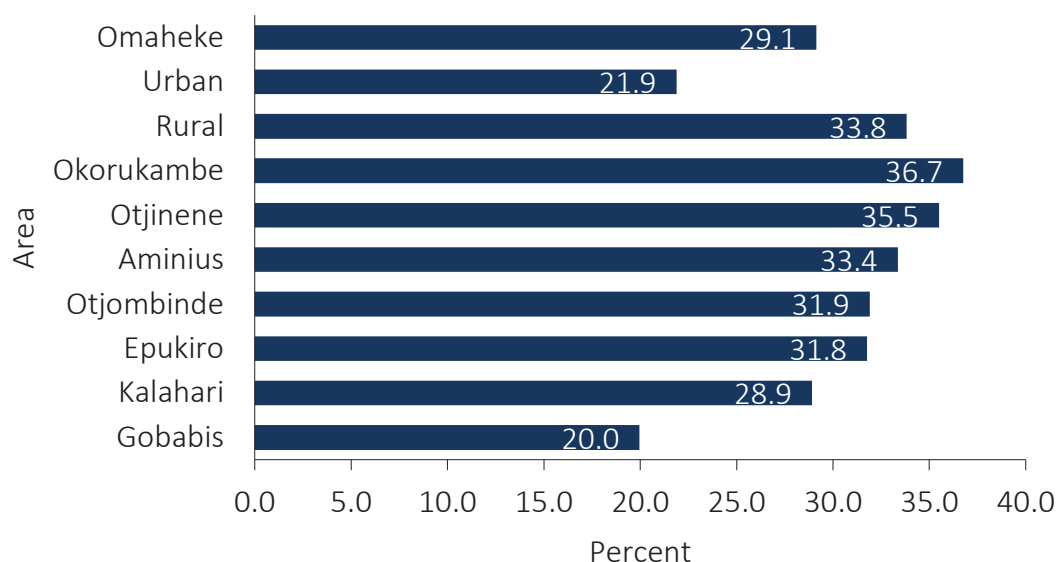
Over 90 percent of the urban population in Omaheke region were issued with birth certificate by the Namibian government which is above the regional average (86.4%). Gobabis constituency (93.2%) had the highest population issued with birth certificate while Otjombinde (78.7%) had the lowest.

The percentage on children aged 0–4 years without birth certificate in Omaheke was 29.1 percent. This percentage was higher in rural (33.8%) areas compared to urban (21.9%). At constituency level, Okorukambe (36.7%) had the highest percentage while Gobabis (20.0%) the least.

Figure 3.3: Percent distribution of population aged 0 – 4 years without birth certificate by area: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census

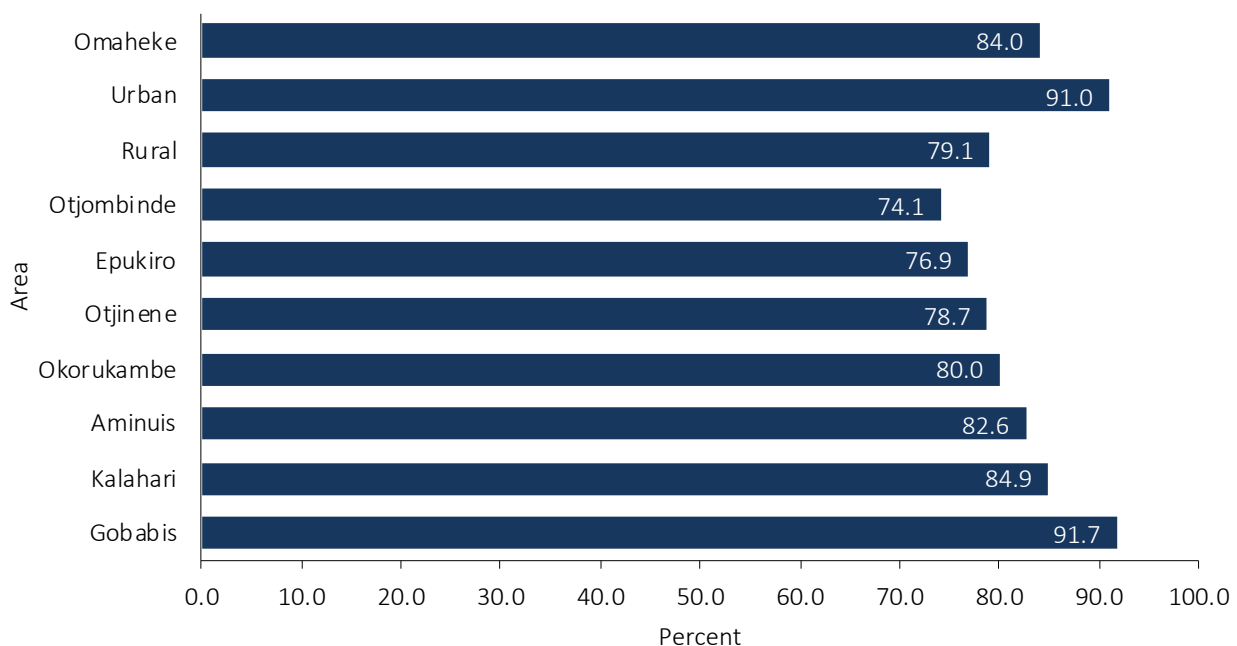


3.2.2. National Identification document (ID)

This section provides information that determines the coverage of Identification Documents (ID cards) in circulation. There are two types of ID: New blue/pink (issued after independence) and SWA ID (issued before independence).

There were 84.0 percent of the population aged 16 years and above in Omaheke region issued with a new Namibian ID. Urban area (91.0%) had a higher percentage of ID holders compared to rural areas (79.1%). At the constituency level, Gobabis (91.7%) had the highest percentage while Otjombinde (74.1%) the least.

Figure 3.4: Percent distribution of population aged 16 years and above with new Namibian ID by area: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census

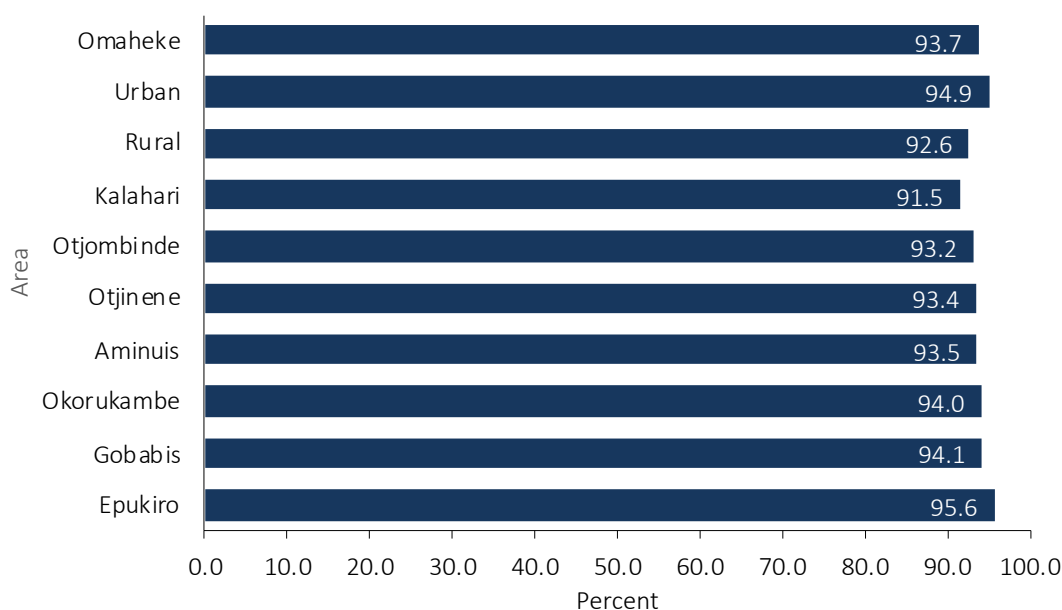

3.2.3. Death registration

Over 90 percent of deaths in the Omaheke region were registered. This overall pattern is replicated in all the areas. Epukiro constituency (95.6%) had the highest percentage of registered deaths, while Kalahari (91.5%) had the lowest.

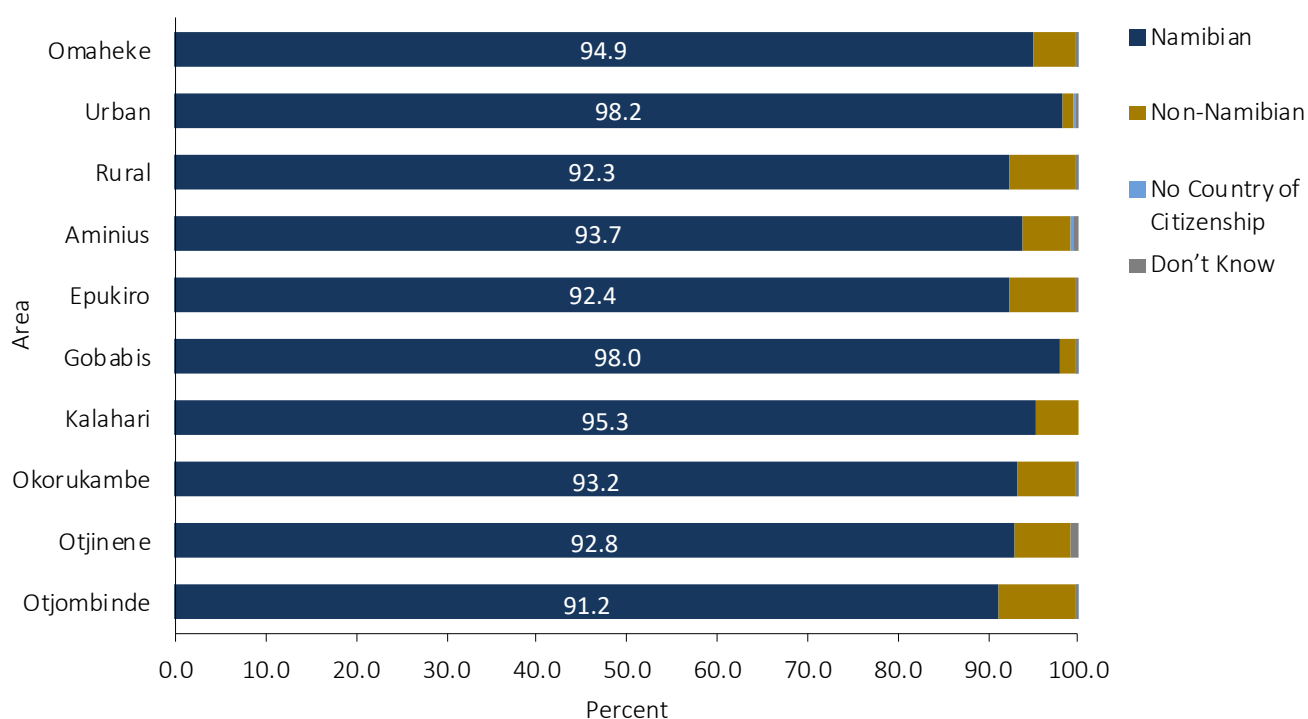
Figure 3.5: Registered deaths by area: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census



3.3. Citizenship

Note: No country of citizenship means that a person does not officially belong to any country. They don't have the legal status of being a citizen of any country. This situation can happen if someone is stateless, meaning they aren't recognized as a citizen by any country.

Among Namibia's neighbouring countries, Angolan nationals accounted for the largest share of non-Namibian citizens enumerated (84.6%), whereas individuals from Zambia constituted the lowest percentage (0.3%).

3.5. Difficulty in performing activities

This section aims to provide information on the general health and functioning of the population aged five years and older based on six Washington Group (WG) short set of functional questions/domains; namely seeing, hearing, communicating, walking or climbing stairs, remembering or concentrating and self-care.

Over 90 percent of the population aged 5 years and above in Omaheke region had no difficulty in performing an activity in five measured domains, with the exception of 'seeing', which had a lower percentage of 85.0.

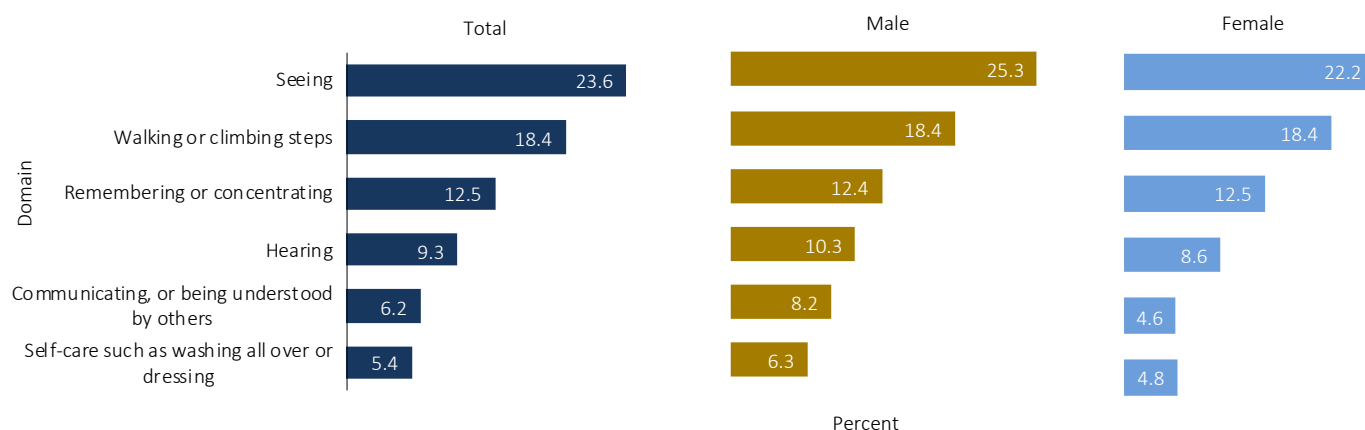

3.6. Albinism

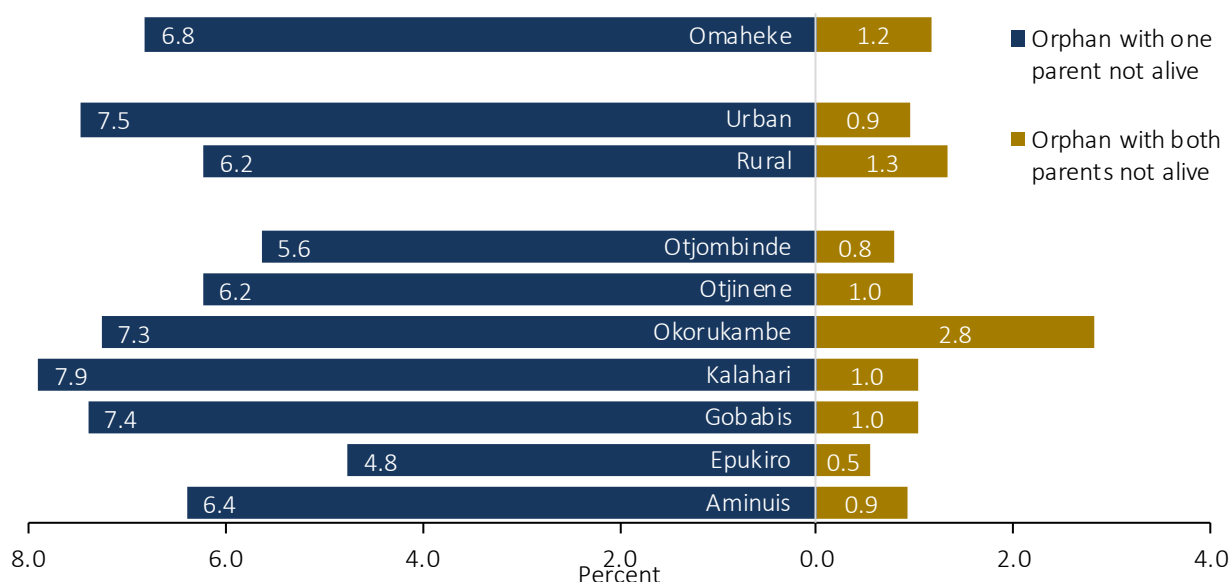

3.7. Orphanhood

Information on orphanhood was collected to provide information on the number of orphans. The term orphanhood refers to persons aged 17 years and below who have lost either one or both parents.

In Omaheke region, that 6.8 percent of the children had lost one parent, with 1.2 percent indicated to have lost both parents. Orphanhood was more prevalent in rural (1.3%) than in urban (0.9%) areas and at constituency level, Okorukambe (2.8%) had the highest percentage of orphans without both parents while Epukiro (0.5%) had the least.

CHAPTER 4 : SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

The chapter focuses on the socioeconomic characteristics of the population, providing essential information for decision-making, planning, and monitoring of development programs and policies.

4.1. Information and Communication Technology (ICT)

This section provides valuable information on ICT which is required by institutions that deal with ICT infrastructure and regulations.

Most persons 3 years and above in Omaheke region had access to information through SMS (43.3%). The same pattern is observed in rural areas (41.2%), however in urban areas, the majority had access to information through Radio (46.9%).

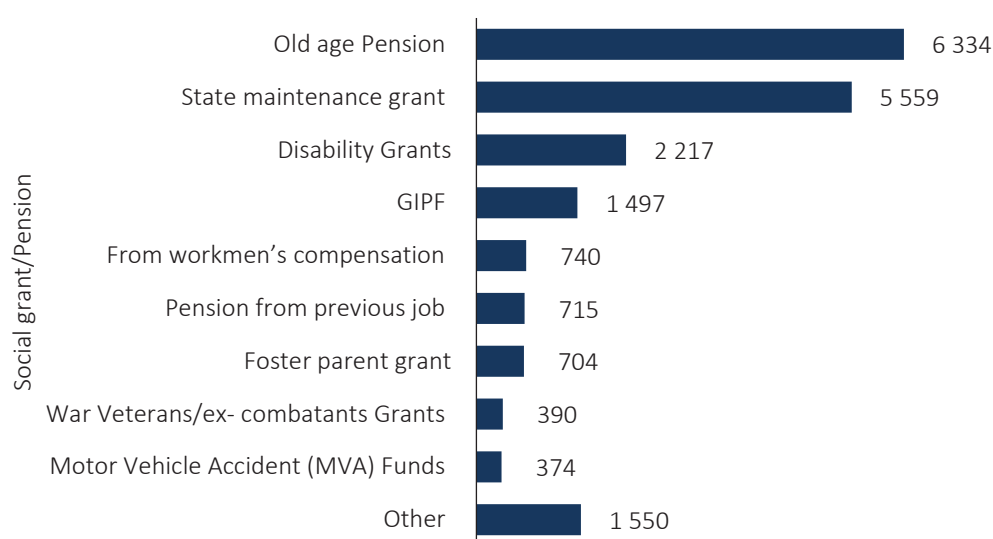

4.3. Sports activities

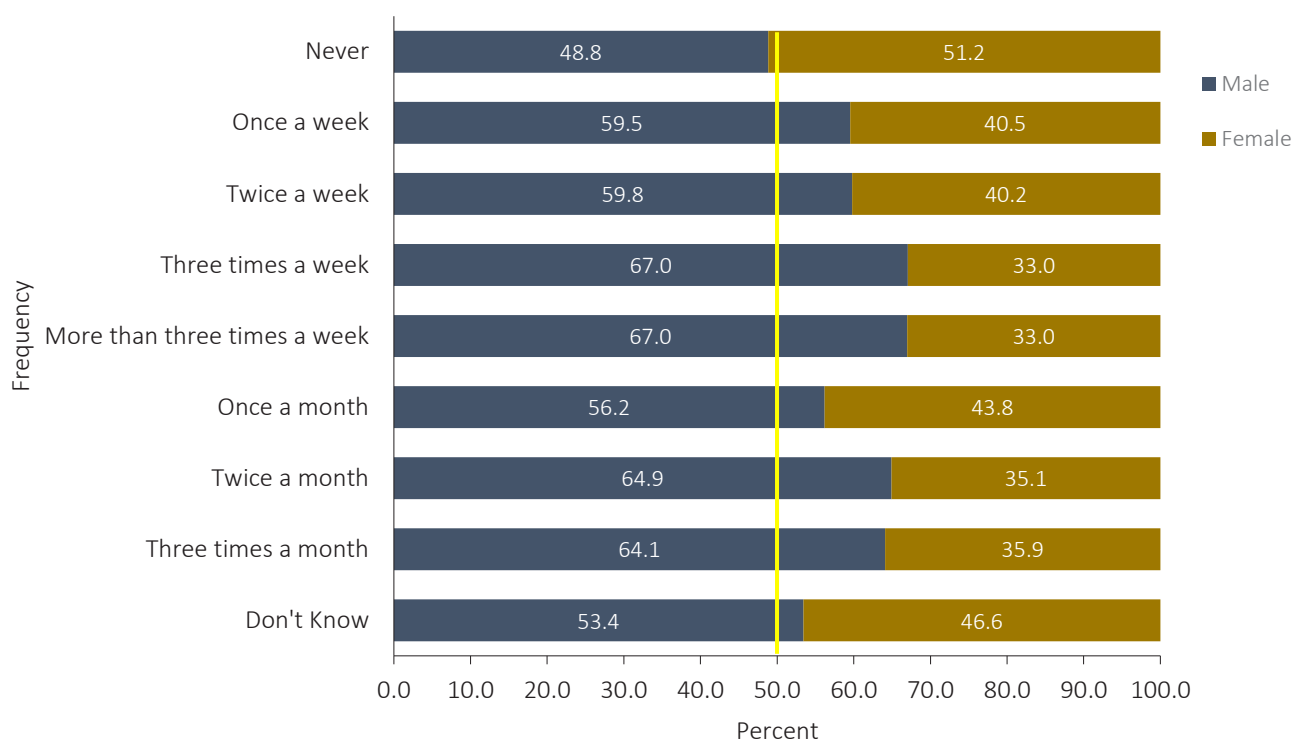

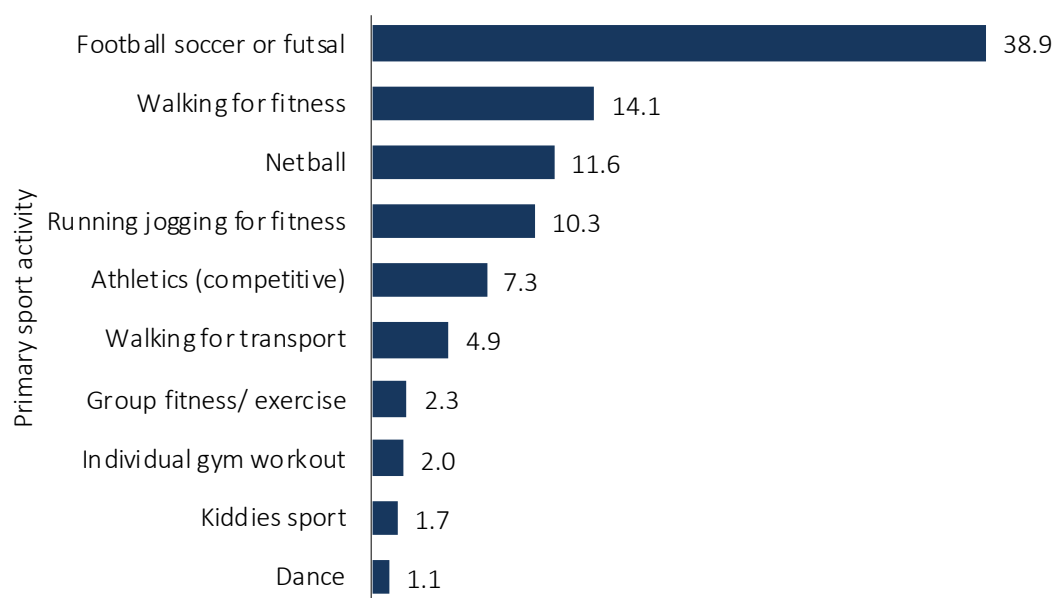

Figure 4.3: Percent distribution of population aged 4 years and above participating in top ten primary sport activities: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census



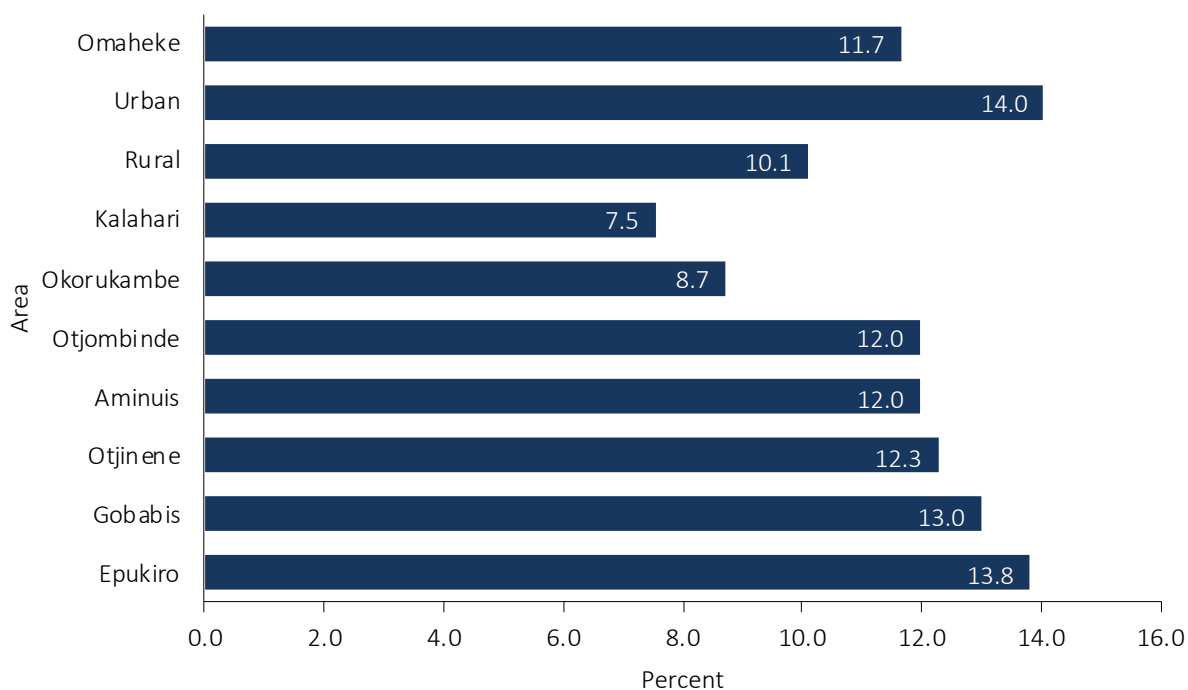
4.4. Early Childhood Development (ECD), Literacy and Education

4.4.1. ECD

This section presents information on ECD attendance and the main reason for not attending for children aged 0 – 5 years.

Overall, 11.7 percent of the population aged 0-5 years were enrolled in ECD programs. Urban areas had a higher enrolment of children in ECD programs compared to rural areas.

In Omaheke region, the primary reason for not attending ECD programmes was ‘too young to attend’, while the least was illness. This pattern was replicated across all areas in the region.

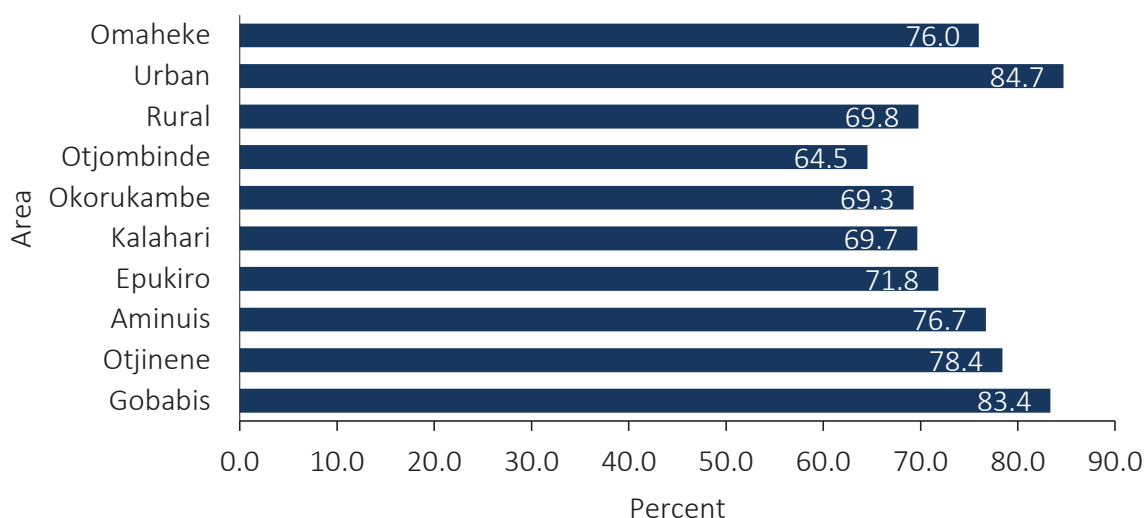

4.4.2. Literacy

In Omaheke region, 76.0 percent of persons aged 15 and above can read and write. Literacy rates were higher in urban (84.7%) than in rural (69.8%) areas. At constituency level, Gobabis (83.4%) had the highest literacy rate, while Otjombinde (64.5%) had the lowest.

Figure 4.5: Literacy rate for population aged 15 years and above by area: Omaheke region, Namibia, Census 2023



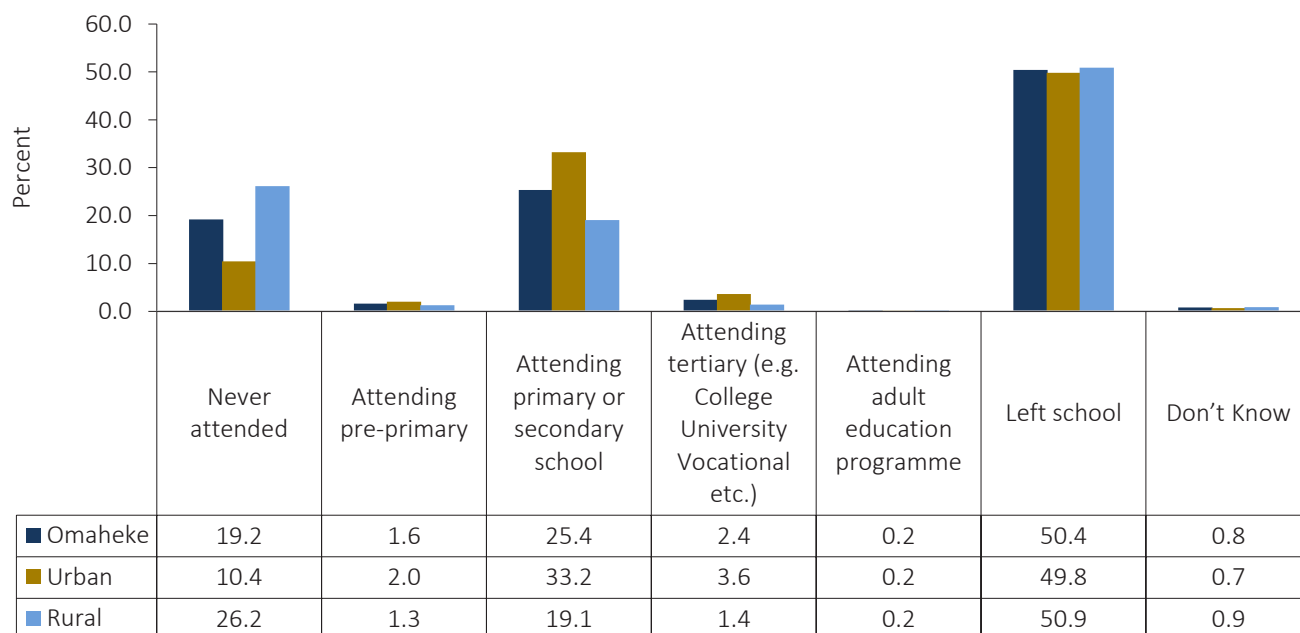
4.4.3. Education

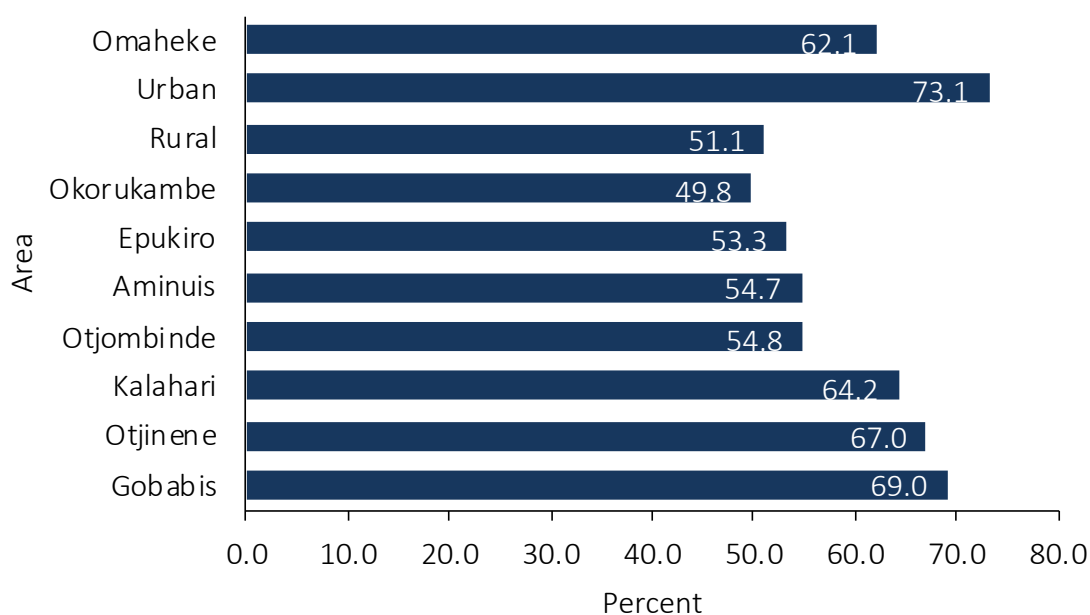
Figure 4.6: Percent distribution of the population aged 6 years and above by area and school attendance: Omaheke region, Namibia, Census 2023



4.4.3.2. School Enrolment

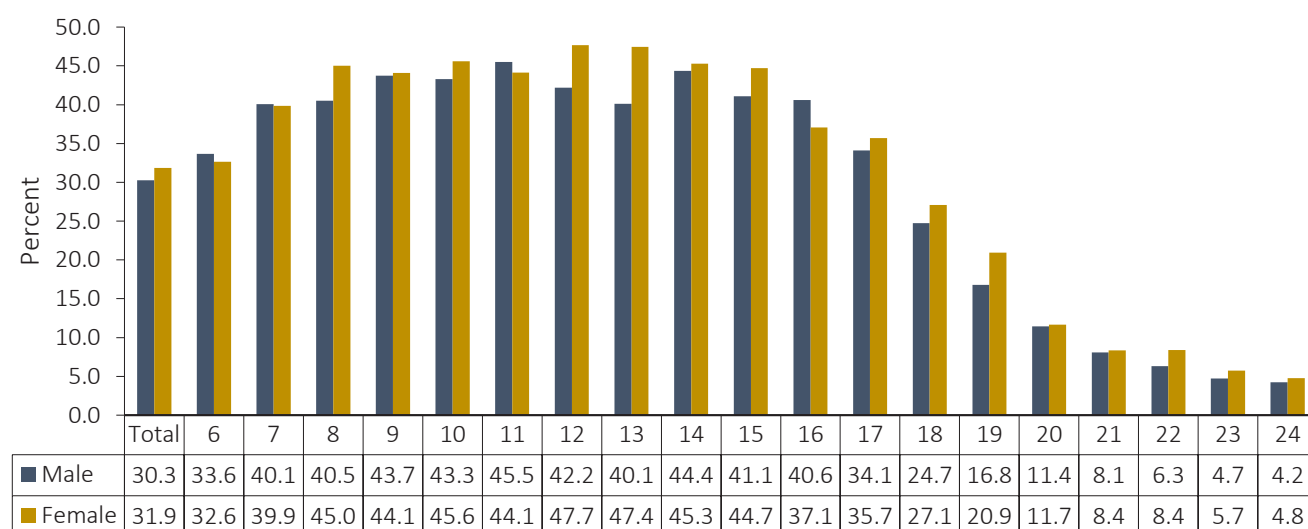

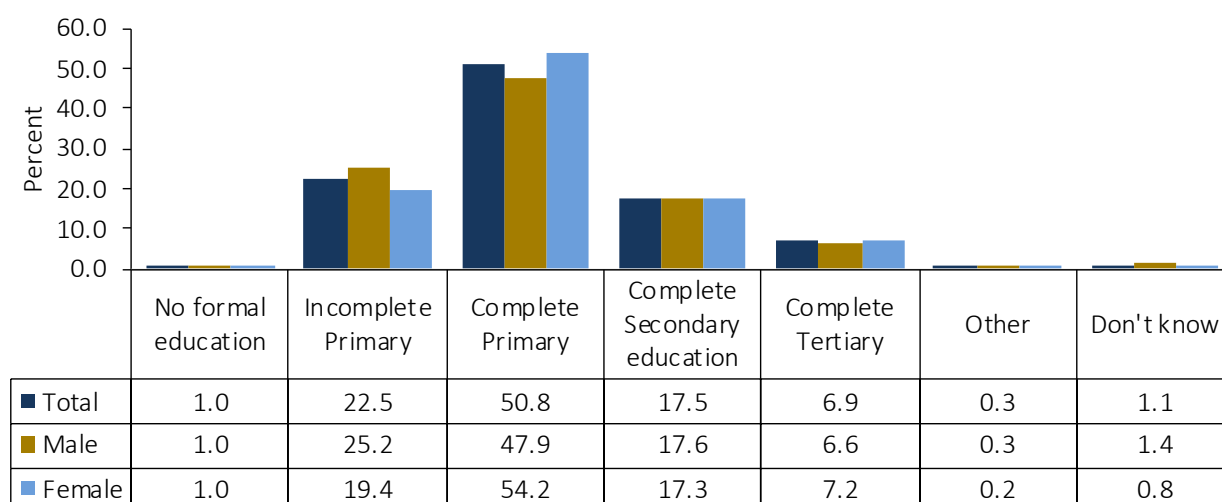
Figure 4.8: Enrolment rate for school going population (6 – 24 years) by sex and age: Omaheke region, Namibia, Census 2023



4.4.3.3. Educational Attainment

The largest percentage, 50.8 percent of the population aged 15 years and above in Omaheke region completed primary education, followed by 22.5 percent who did not complete primary, while only 1.0 percent had no formal education.

Figure 4.9: Percent of the population aged 15 years and above who left school by highest level of education attainment and sex: Omaheke region, Namibia, Census 2023



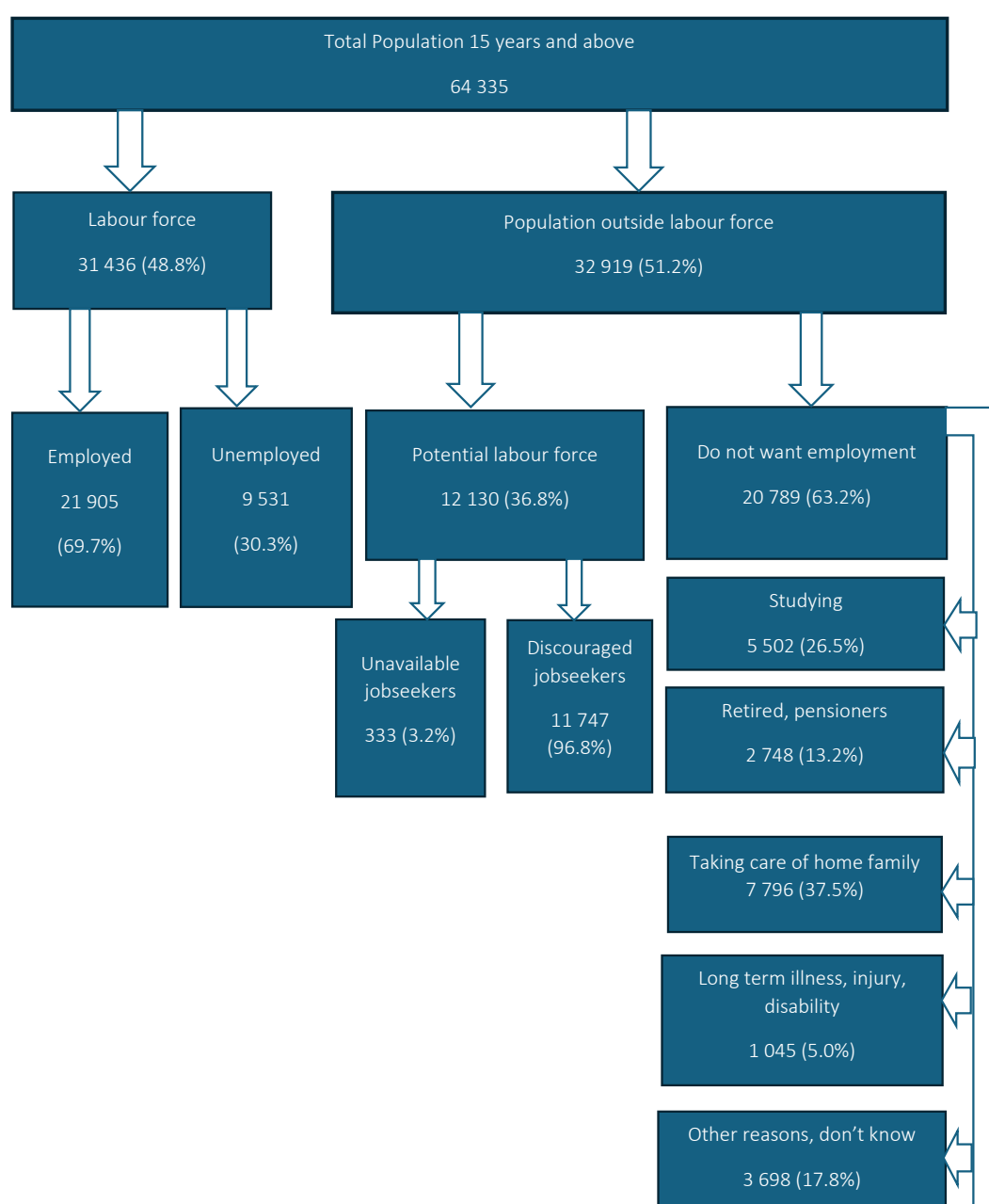

4.5. Labour Force Characteristics

The 2023 PHC adopted the ICLS 19 resolution 1 standard questions as set up by the ILO to measure the economic activity status. The 19th ICLS was to update the previous standards on statistics of the economically active population, employment, and unemployment (13th ICLS, 1982) by setting up a new framework for work and labor market statistics. This section provides an overview of economic activity. Detailed statistics are presented in the Namibia 2023 PHC Labour Force thematic report.

In Omaheke region, 30.3 percent of population in labour force were unemployed. It is important to highlight that a significant percentage (96.8%) of the potential labour force were discouraged jobseekers.

Figure 4.10: Population aged 15 years and above by activity status: Omaheke region, Namibia, Census 2023

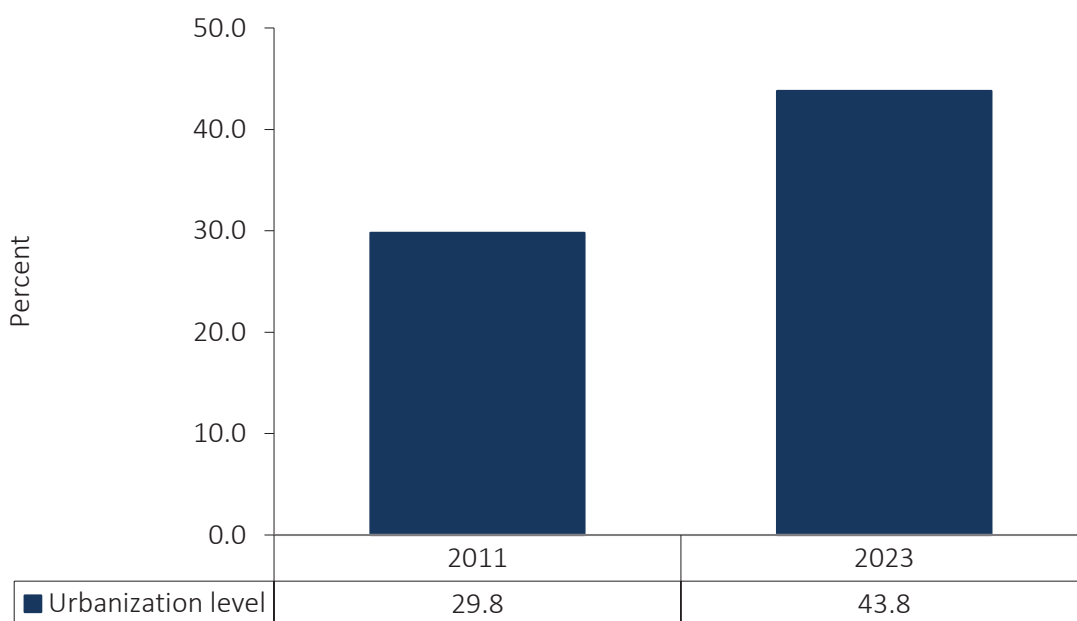


4.6. Urbanization

The level of urbanization indicates the relative number of inhabitants in urban areas compared to rural areas.

Urbanization level has increased from 29.8 percent in 2011 to 43.8 percent in 2023 in Omaheke region.

Out of all the 4 urban localities in Omaheke region, Gobabis was the most populous town across the two census years 2011 and 2023 with 19,101 and 33,418 persons, respectively. Otjinene (227.1%) had the highest population increase, while Witvlei (72.8%) had the lowest population increase.

CHAPTER 5 : POPULATION DYNAMICS

This chapter analyses component of population change: fertility and mortality, presented at regional, urban/rural and constituency levels.

5.1. Fertility

This section presents the basic direct fertility indicators such as Crude Birth Rate (CBR), age at first live birth and birth delivery assistance for women aged 15 – 49 years.

5.1.1. Crude Birth Rate (CBR)

Women in Omaheke region gave birth to 3,507 babies in the year preceding the Census, which equates to the CBR of 34.1 births per 1,000 population. The CBR was higher in urban than rural areas with 39.2 and 30.1 births per 1,000 population, respectively. However, significant variation was observed across the constituencies, the highest being Gobabis (39.9 births per 1,000 population) and the least being Kalahari (27.2 births per 1,000 population).

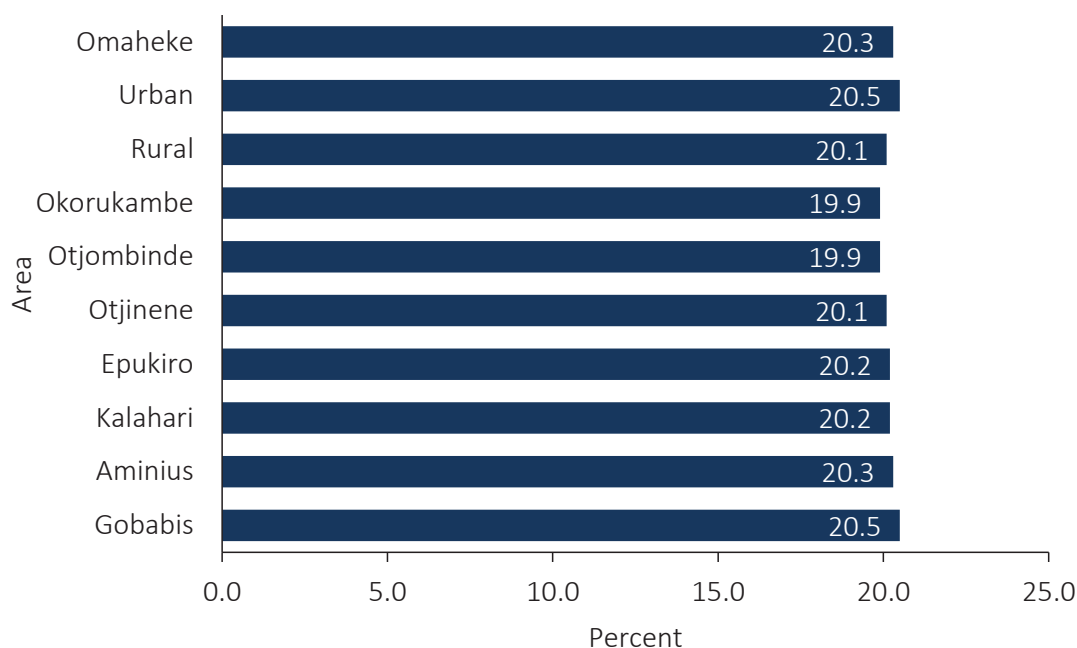

5.1.2. Age at First Live Birth

Median age of mothers at their first live birth in Omaheke region was 20.3 years. Mothers in rural (20.1 years) gave birth at a younger age compared to mothers in urban (20.5 years) areas.

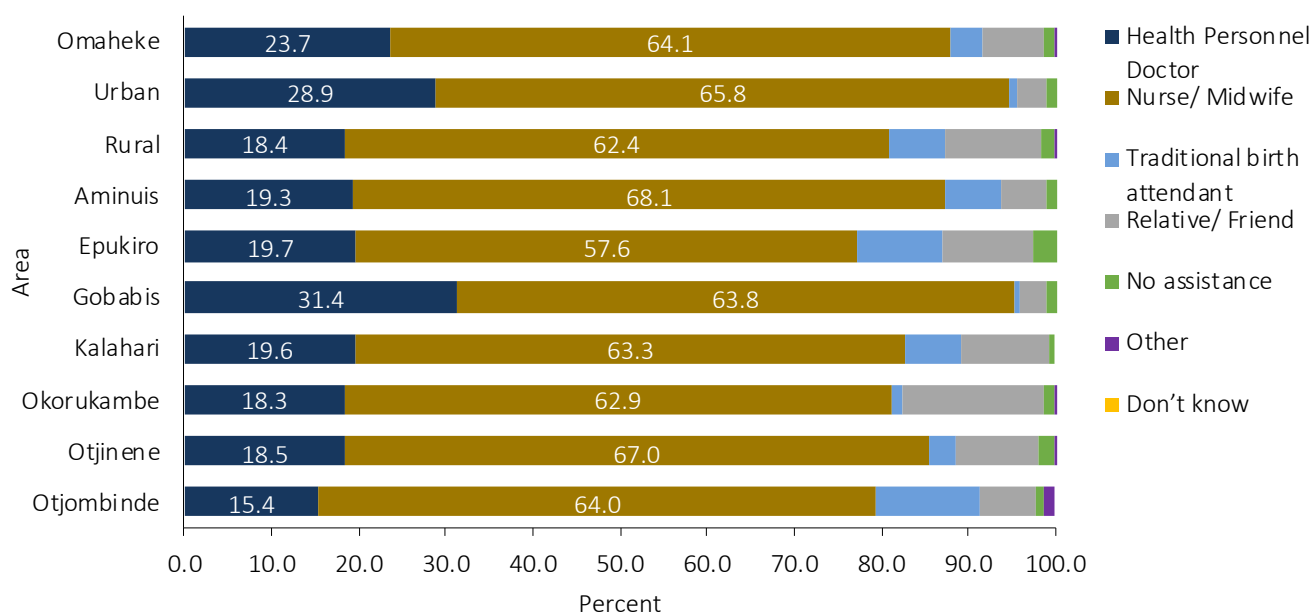
Figure 5.1: Median age of mother at first live birth by area: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census



5.1.3. Birth Delivery Assistance

In Omaheke region, 87.8 percent of births were attended by medical professionals (medical doctors and nurse/midwives). However, it is worth noting that rural area (19.1%) and Epukiro constituency (23.1) had a significant number of births attended by non-medical professionals (Traditional birth attendant, Relative/ Friend and No assistance).

5.2. Mortality

This section provides information on deaths that occurred in the household in the last 12 months (October 2022 to September 2023) as well as the direct estimates of Crude Death Rates (CDR) which portray the overall mortality pattern in the country.

5.2.1. Crude Death Rate (CDR)

There were 1,128 deaths reported in the year preceding the census which gives a CDR of 11.0 deaths per 1,000 population in Omaheke region. The CDR was higher in urban (11.9 deaths per 1,000 population) than urban areas (10.3 deaths per 1,000 population). The highest CDR was recorded in Otjinene (13.5 deaths per 1,000 population) while the lowest was in Okorukambe constituency (6.8 deaths per 1,000 population).

5.2.2. Reported deaths

Deaths reported in Omaheke region were prevalent among infants (under the age of one year) and among elderly aged 80 years and above. Overall, the number of male deaths reported was higher than female deaths.

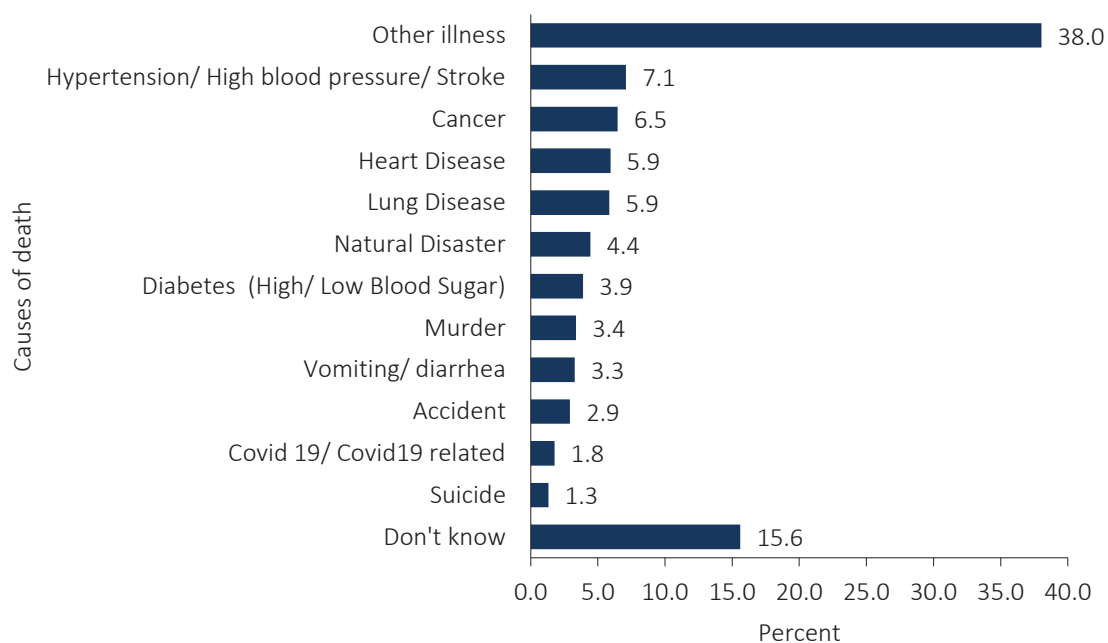

5.2.3. Causes of deaths

The highest cause of deaths in Omaheke region was other illness (38.0%) while suicide (1.3%) was the least cause of deaths.

CHAPTER 6 : HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

This chapter provides information on household characteristics, particularly on household size, head of household, main source of income/livelihood, main language spoken at home, and assets. Furthermore, it analyses the characteristics of housing (type of housing, tenure, building materials), covering all structures used as dwelling units and amenities.

6.1. Number of households

The number of households in Omaheke increased by 74.3 percent between 2011 and 2023. The number of households in urban areas increased significantly by 114.7 percent.

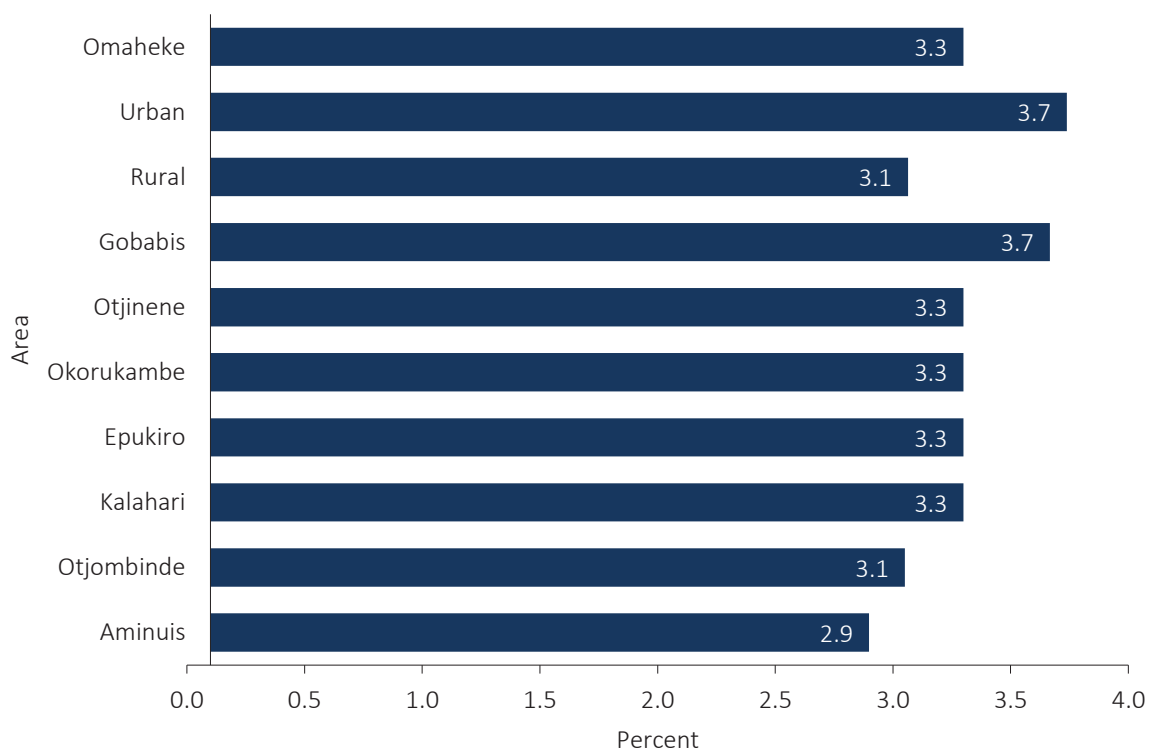

6.2. Household size

The average households' size of Omaheke region was 3.3 persons. Urban households' size was higher than rural areas at 3.7 and 3.1 persons, respectively. Gobabis constituency had a higher household size (3.7 persons) while Aminuis constituency had the lowest (2.9 persons).

Figure 6.1: Average household size by area: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census

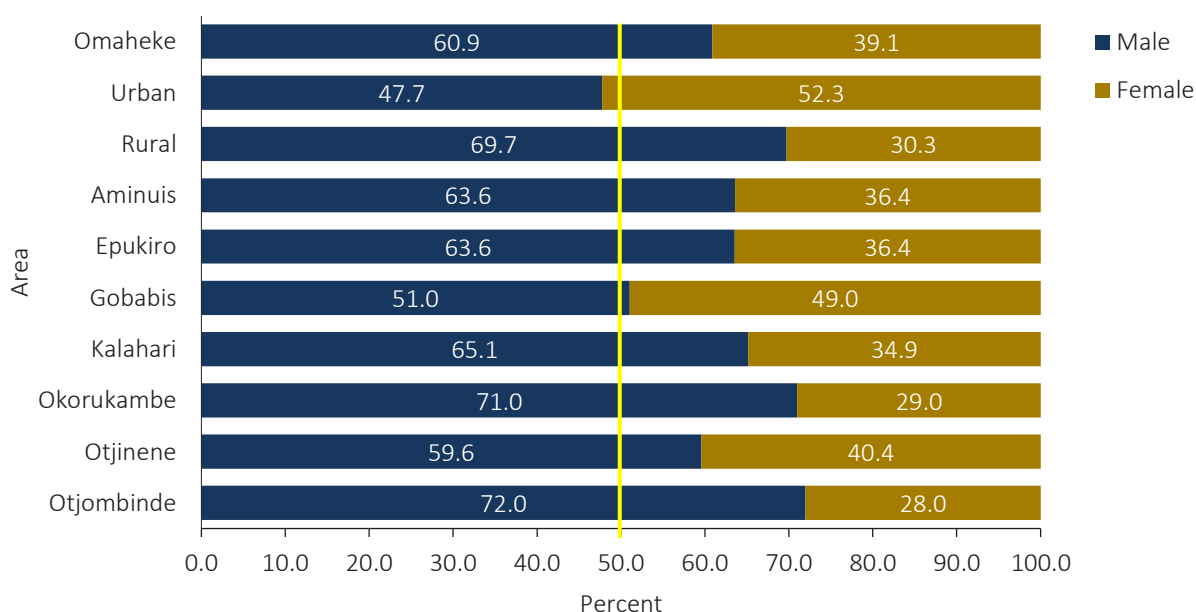


6.3. Household Headship

6.3.1. Sex of Household Head

Most households in Omaheke region were male headed (60.9%) while female headed households were 39.1 percent. This pattern was replicated in rural areas and all constituencies. However, in urban areas most households were led by females.

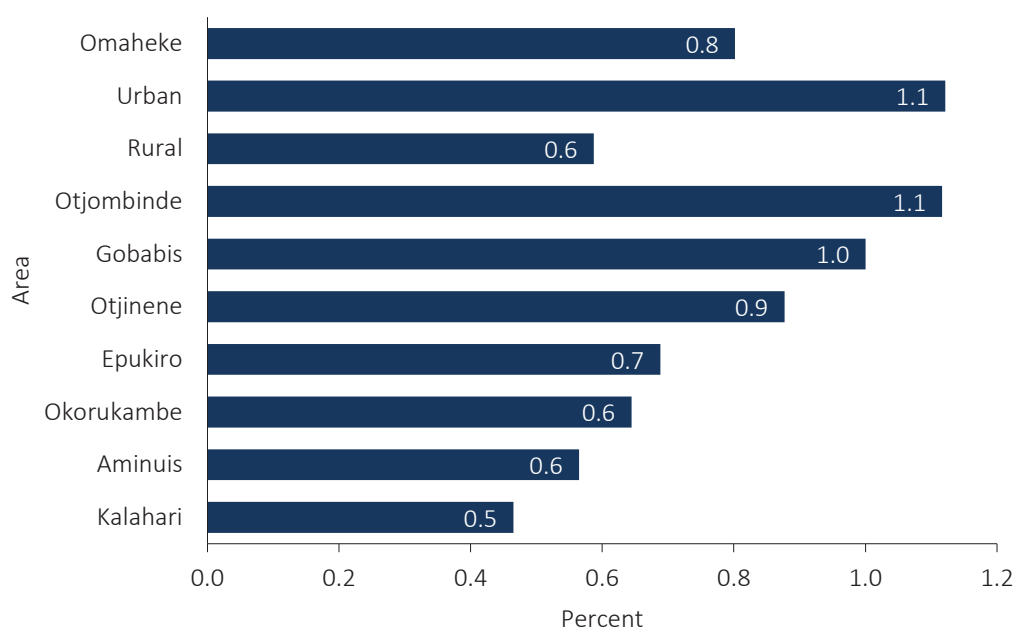
Figure 6.2: Percent distribution of household head by area and sex: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census



6.3.2. Household headed by children (17 years and below)

Households headed by children in Omaheke region were less than 1 percent. The same pattern was replicated across all areas except in urban areas (1.1%), Gobabis (1.0%) and Otjombinde (1.1%) constituencies.

Figure 6.3: Percent distribution of child-headed households by area and sex: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census

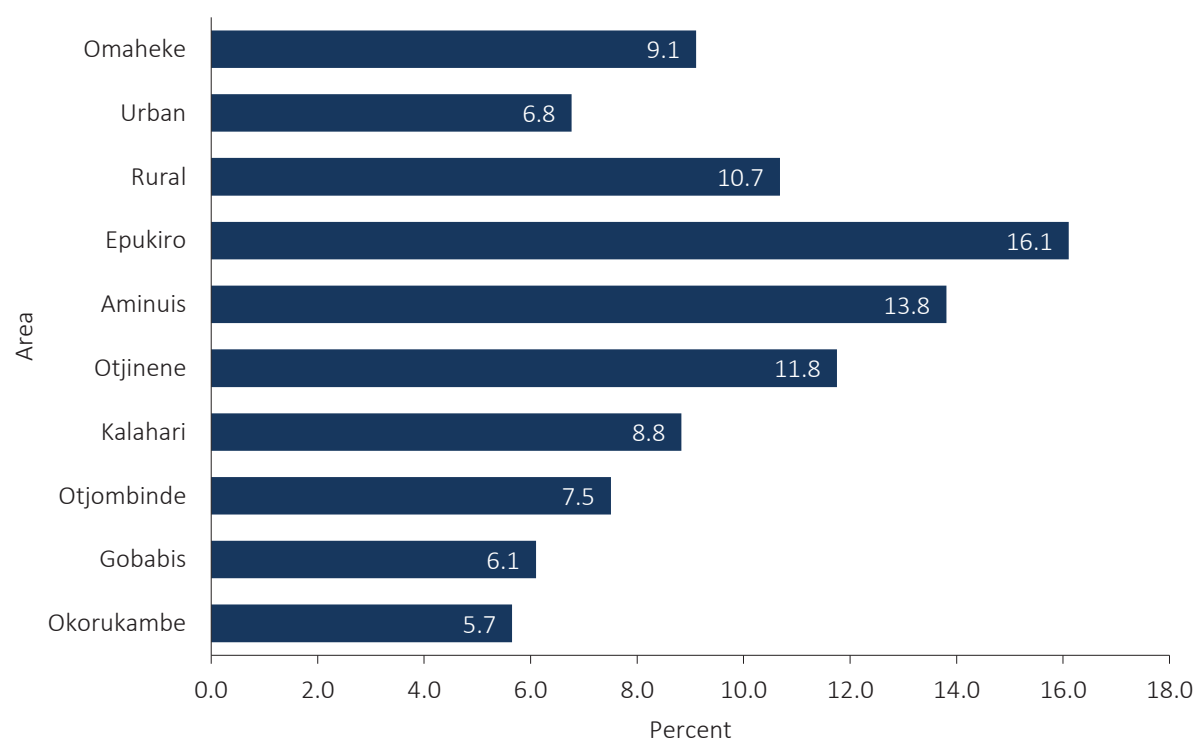


6.3.3. Households headed by persons with a lot of difficulty or cannot do at all in at least one domain

This sub-section presents information on the general health and functioning of the head of household based on six Washington Group (WG) short set of functional questions/ domains: namely seeing, hearing, communicating, walking or climbing stairs, remembering or concentrating, and self-care.

Households headed by persons with a lot of difficulty or cannot do at all in at least one domain were 9.1 percent in Omaheke region. Rural (10.7%) had a higher percentage than Urban (6.8%) areas. Furthermore, Epukiro (16.1%) had the highest percentage of households headed by persons with a lot of difficulty or cannot do at all in at least one domain while Okorukambe constituency had the least (5.7%).

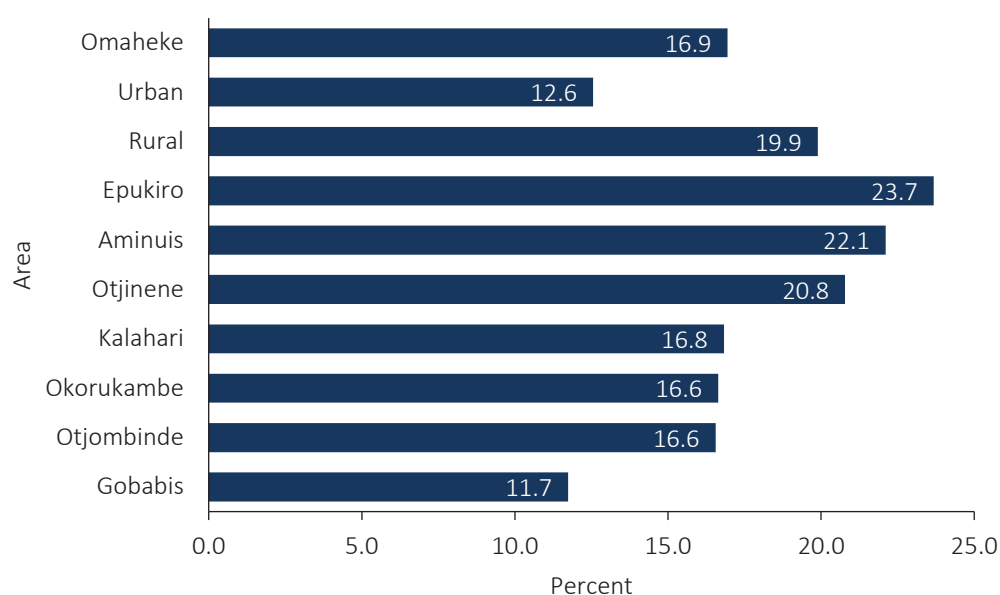
Figure 6.4: Percent distribution of households headed by persons with a lot of difficulty or cannot do at all in at least one domain by area: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census



6.3.4. Household headed by elderly persons (60 years and above)

In Omaheke region, households headed by elderly persons were 16.9 percent. Rural (19.9%) had more households headed by elderly than Urban (12.6%) areas. In addition, Epukiro (23.7%) had the highest number of households headed by elderly persons and Gobabis (11.7%) had the lowest at constituency level.

6.4. Household Main Source of Livelihood/ Survival

Information on the main source of livelihood/survival was collected to determine the livelihood or ways of survival of a household. The livelihood referred to here encompasses not only monetary income but also the primary products produced for consumption or sale.

Salaries and/or wages was the leading main source of livelihood/survival at 50.4 percent, followed by old age pension (13.9%) and this was the same trend observed in urban and rural areas.

6.5. Language spoken at home

This section focuses on the main language spoken which refers to the language usually spoken or most often spoken in the household.

In Omaheke region, Otjiherero (40.9%) was the most spoken language at home, followed by Khoekhoegowab (23.9%).

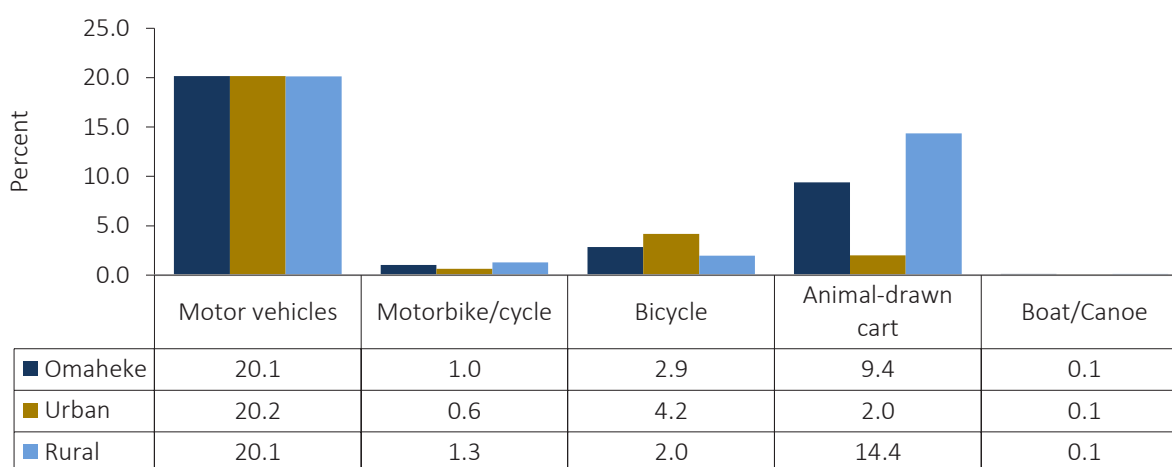
6.6. Household assets

Assets ownership is an important indicator of social welfare and living standards, and therefore households that own certain assets depict a certain standard of living. It should be noted that a household can own or have access to one or more assets.

6.6.1. Transportation assets

Motorcars (20.1%) were the most owned transportation asset in Omaheke region, and a similar pattern was observed in both urban and rural households.

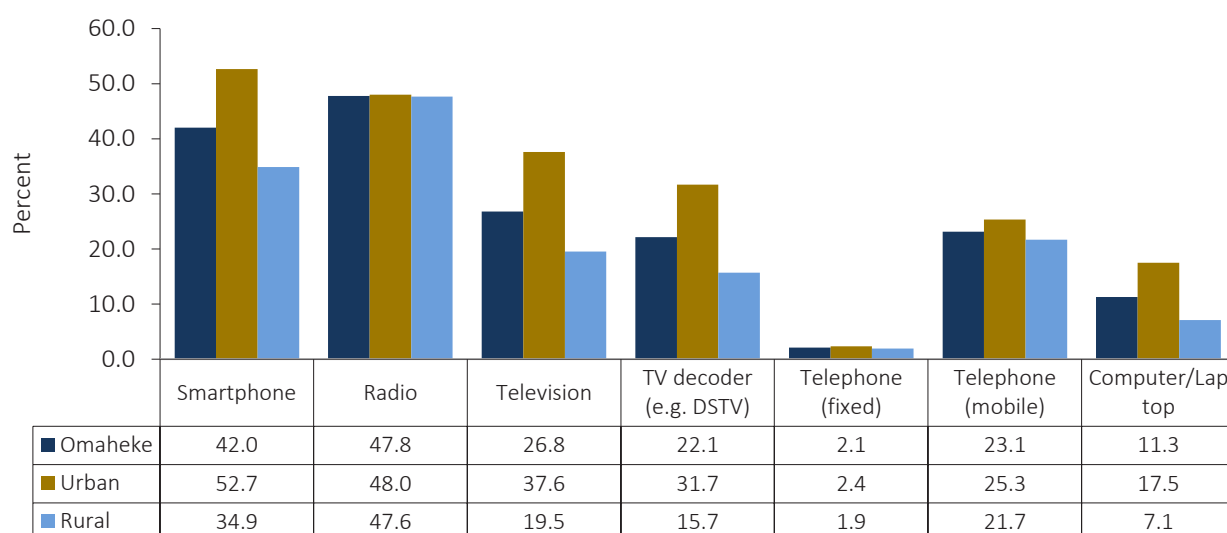
Figure 6.6: Percent distribution of households who owned selected transportation assets by area: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census



6.6.2. Communication assets

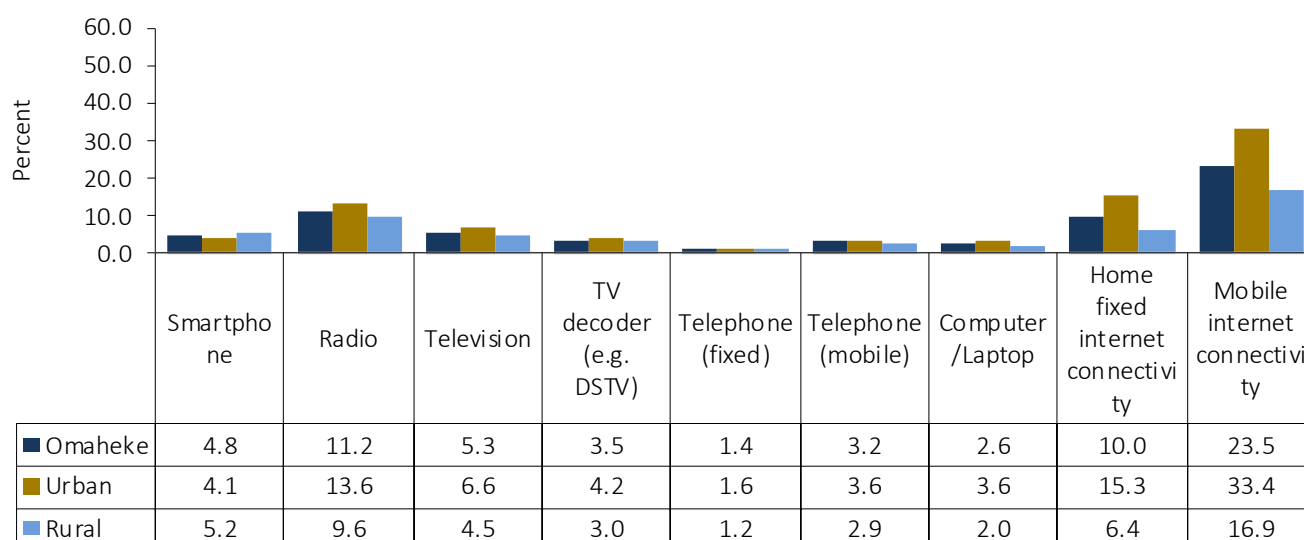
Most of the households in Omaheke region owned radio (47.8%) followed by smartphone (42.0%) and television (26.8%). Smartphones (52.7%) were the most owned asset in urban areas while radio (47.6%) was the most owned asset in rural areas.

Figure 6.8: Percent distribution of households with access to selected communication assets by area: Omaheke region, Namibia, 2023 Census

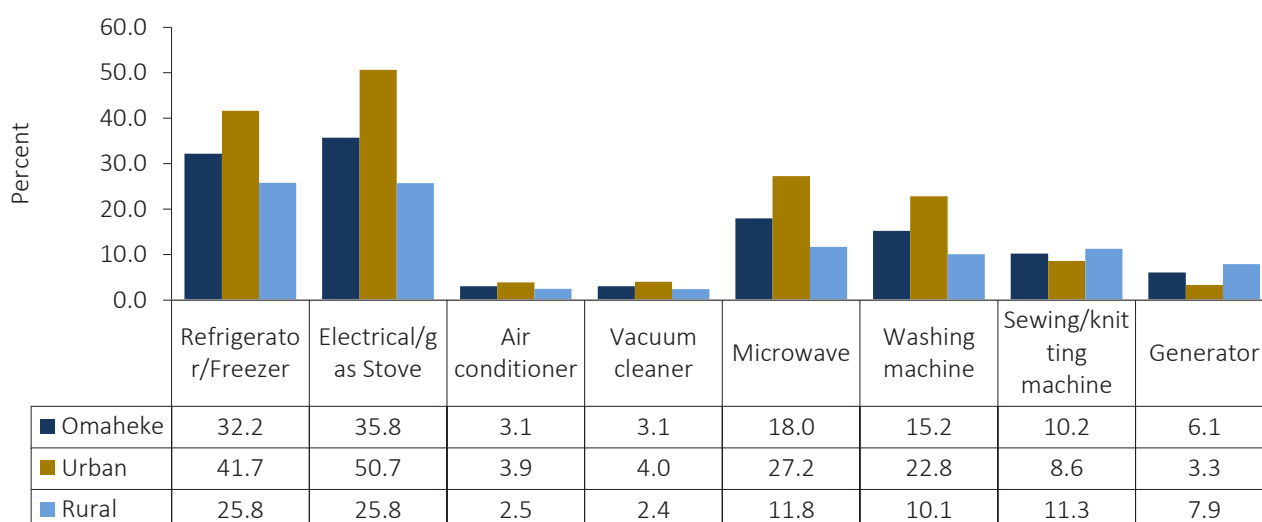

6.6.3. Housing Utilities

Electrical/gas stoves (35.8%) followed by refrigerators/freezers (32.2%) were the most owned housing utilities in Omaheke region. This was the same trend observed in urban areas, while in rural, refrigerators/freezers and electrical/gas stoves (25.8% each) were the most owned housing utilities.

6.7. Type of housing unit

In Omaheke region 36.2 percent of the households were formal dwellings. However, informal dwellings (46.8%) were the highest type of housing unit in the region. The regional pattern is replicated in urban and rural. However, significant variation was observed across constituencies where formal dwellings were predominant in Aminuis (41.7%), Epukiro (35.3%) and Okorukambe (51.2%).

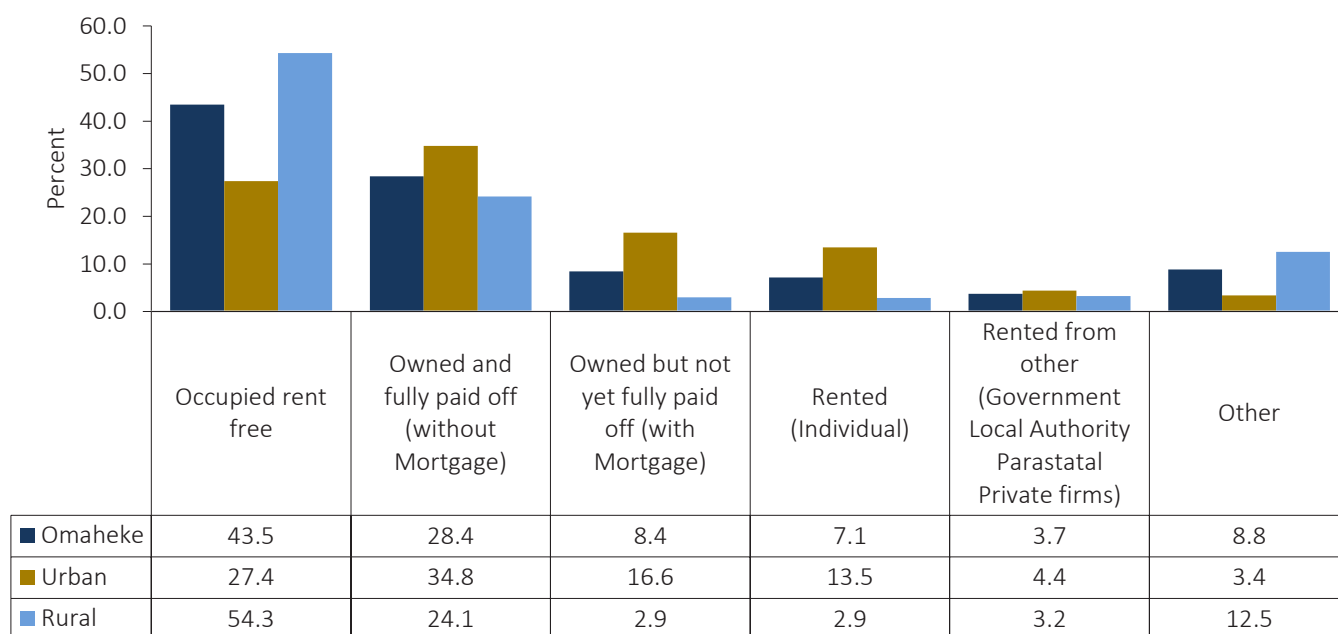

6.8. Tenure status

Most households in Omaheke region occupied dwelling units that were rent free (43.5%). This was the same trend observed in rural areas (54.3%) while households owned and fully paid off without mortgage were predominant in urban areas (34.8%).

6.9. Main Construction Materials

The section presents information on the materials used to construct walls, floors, and roofs, which are important indicators of the socio-economic conditions and welfare of households.

6.9.1. Materials used for outer walls

In Omaheke region, 56.4 percent of household's outer walls were made from corrugated iron/zinc followed by cement blocks/bricks/stone (37.3%). The same trend was observed in all areas in the region except for Okorukambe constituency that recorded the highest percentage of household's walls made from cement blocks/bricks/stone (53.5%).

6.10. Amenities

The section presents information on the main sources of energy, water supply and sanitation, and waste disposal of households.

6.10.1. Source of energy

Information gathered from private households on energy usage for cooking and lighting offers valuable insights into social conditions and development.

Electricity (35.4%) was the most used main source of energy for lighting, followed by battery lamp / torch/ cellphone (19.0%) in Omaheke region. A similar trend was observed in urban, however in rural areas, solar energy (30.5%) was the most used main source of energy for lighting.

6.10.2. Water Supply and Sanitation

This section covers the main source of water for cooking, drinking, type of toilet facility and means of waste disposal. Inadequate access to safe water and poor sanitation are public health concerns because they create conditions conducive to the spread of diseases. Information on the type of toilet facilities for households was also collected during the census to find out the level of access to proper toilet facilities in the region.

Most of the households (90.2%) in Omaheke region use safe water for cooking. However, the main source of water for cooking was boreholes/ boreholes with tank covered (36.2%). Most households in urban areas used piped water inside (39.1%), while in rural areas most households used water from boreholes/boreholes with tank covered (59.8%).

ANNEX I : DEFINITION OF CONCEPTS

Dwelling unit

- Dwelling unit is a building/ structure where households live. It's a place of residence occupied by one or more households.
- Sometimes a household can occupy more than one building/ structure. On the other hand, households can occupy only part of the buildings/ structure; in that case, that building/ structure becomes the Dwelling unit for all households within it. Buildings/ structures can be classified into dwelling units, living quarters other than dwelling units (institutions) and non-dwelling units.

Institutions

An institution can be defined as sets of premises in a permanent structure or structures designed to accommodate groups of persons who are bound by either a common public objective or a common personal interests. Institutions can be categorized into two groups, i.e. residential and non-residential institutions.

- Residential institutions include institutions where people may be allowed to reside for certain period of time for learning or employment purposes.
- Non-residential institutions include institutions such as hotel/ lodges, police holding cells hospitals, etc. These groups of people cannot be said to belong to a conventional household since they do not meet the same criteria as that of a household.

Households (Conventional/ Private)

A household usually consists: (1) of one or more persons, related or unrelated, (2) who live together in the same house/ homestead/ compound, but not necessarily in the same dwelling unit, (3) who have the same or common catering or eating arrangements (cook and eat together), and (4) who are answerable to the same head of household.

Homestead

It is an isolated compound with one or more structures and usually inhabited by one or more households. In most cases homesteads will be surrounded by fences, hedges, wall etc. A homestead may contain a traditional dwelling or a group of traditional dwellings. A traditional dwelling will thus be considered a homestead. However, a wall/fence or hedge need not necessarily surround a homestead. For instance, boys' quarters, garage, kitchen etc. may be part of a homestead whether or not they are surrounded by a fence/ wall, etc. During interviews, you will visit homesteads and identify the structures, dwelling units and households in homesteads.

Household members

Refers to all persons who were actually present in the household on the census reference night, including visitors except those attending social events (Birthday parties, weddings, funerals etc.), employees on night shift and resident domestic servants and their families.

Head of household

The head of household is the person of either sex who is looked upon by other members of the household as their leader or main decision-maker. If she/he was absent on the CRN, the next responsible adult member (acting head of household) should be considered as the head.

Note: a head of household should be 12 years and above.

Usual Member

Usual member refers to persons who have been living in the household for 6 months or more, or intend to stay in the household for the next 6 months.

Census Reference Night (CRN)

All interviews must relate to CRN, except for selected parts of the questionnaire, in this case an alternative reference is stated (e.g. some questions in Section E have a reference of last 7 days). The CRN was the night of 24 September 2023.

De Facto

A de-facto method enumerates all persons found within the borders of a particular country at a particular point in time (i.e. CRN).

De Jure

A de jure method interviews all persons who are usually living within the border of a particular country or household, even if they were not present during the time of the census.

Sex ratio

Sex ratio is the proportion of males per 100 females in a given population.

Marital status

Refers to the legal and social status of an individual in relation to marriage. It indicates whether a person is married, never married, divorced, widowed, or in a consensual union (living together as if married/cohabitating).

Median age at first marriage/consensual union

Refers to the age at which half of the persons or a group of persons in a population get married/consensual union for the first time, providing a central point that is less influenced by extreme values.

Albinism

Is a rare, non-contagious, genetically inherited condition characterized by reduced or no melanin production, resulting in light skin, hair, and eyes, vision impairment, and sensitivity to sunlight (WHO).

Orphanhood Refers to persons aged 17 years and below who have lost either one or both parents.

Literacy

Is the ability to read and write with understanding in any language. All persons aged 15 years and above were asked whether they can read and write in any language with understanding, but no test was administered to determine the level of literacy.

Formal education

Refers to any regular formal educational institution, public or private for systematic of any level of education.

School attendance

Is defined as a full-time attendance at any regular educational institution, public or private, for systematic instruction for longer than a year.

School enrolment

Refers to the school-going population aged 6 to 24 years who were attending school, excluding those attending adult education.

Educational attainment

Refers to the highest level of education completed (refers to a complete cycle whether it was pass or fail).

Household size

Is the average number of persons in the household.

Head of household

Is a person, of either sex who is looked upon by other members of the household as their leader or main decision-maker.

Tenure

Refers to the conditions that govern individuals' rights to occupy dwelling units.
