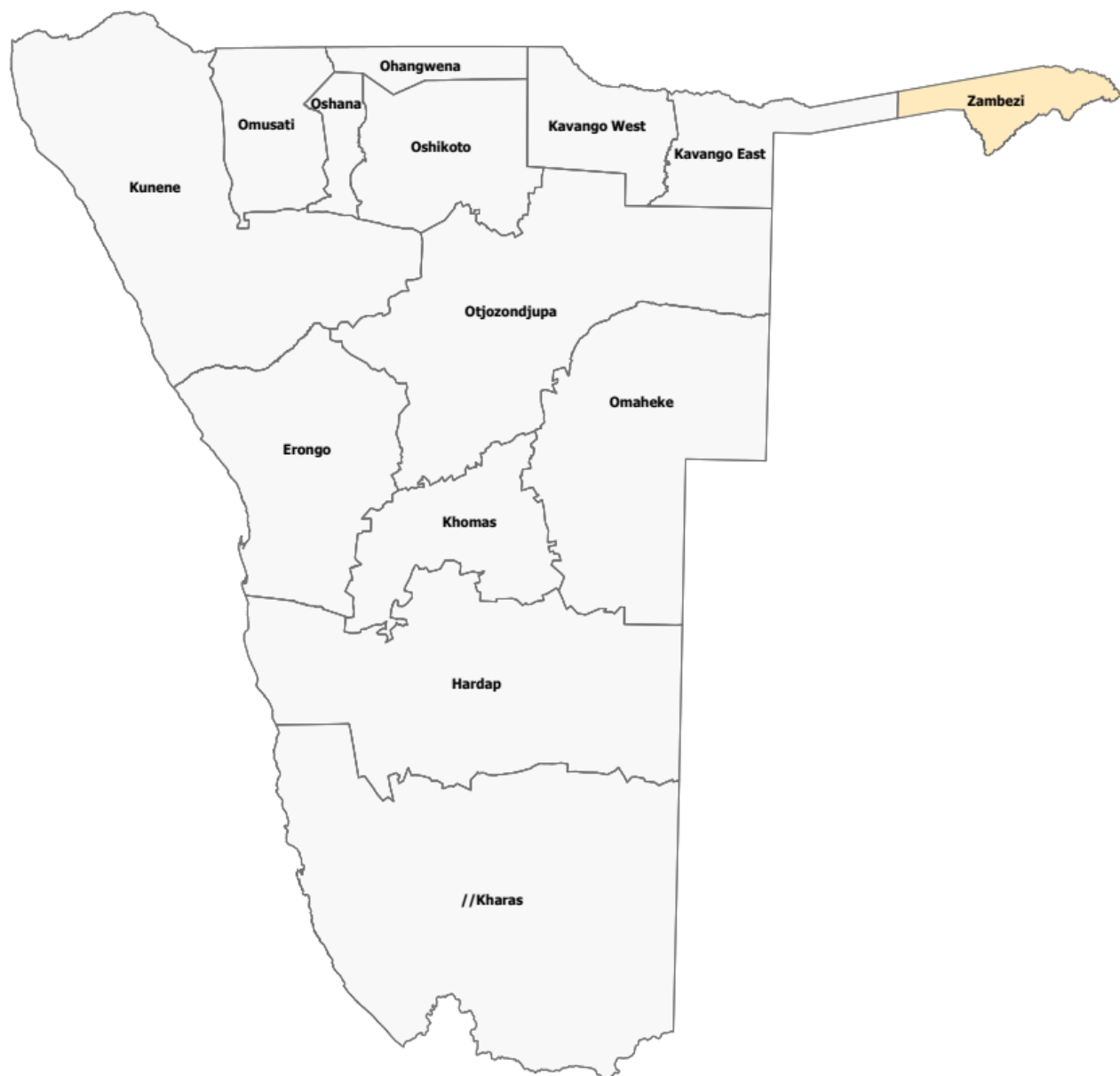

FOREWORD



The Government of the Republic of Namibia, through the Namibia Statistics Agency, conducted the fourth Namibia Population and Housing Census in September 2023 with the 24th of September 2023 being the census reference night (CRN). The Population and Housing Census (PHC) is the most comprehensive and reliable national data resource that provides critical input into national development planning and programs. The census further provides data to measure the impact of various development programs embarked upon by Government, NGOs, and other stakeholders in Namibia. The data produced from the 2023 census gave impetus to developing baselines for the national development plans such as the Sixth National Development Plan (6th NDP), and the Vision 2030.

This report highlights key findings from an initial analysis of the 2023 census data, concentrating on the **Zambezi region** at urban, rural, and constituency levels. The results are essential for guiding the Government, development partners, civil society organizations, and the public on aspects such as the region's population size, population distribution, and population composition among other factors. Also please take note that similar reports for the other thirteen regions were also produced and published.

Please note that some statistical indicators presented in this Regional Profile may differ slightly from those published in the 2023 Census Main Report. These insignificant differences are primarily due to revisions made after the release of the 2023 Census Main report and during further data validation and analysis at the regional level. Users are advised to interpret the figures in these regional reports with this context in mind.

I would like to express our sincere gratitude to all the partners who supported and contributed to the success of the 2023 Namibia Population and Housing Census. This includes the Government of the Republic of Namibia, various Ministries and Government institutions, Mobile Telecommunications Limited (MTC Namibia), Namibian Broadcasting Corporation (NBC), the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA), United Nations Economic Commission for Africa (UNECA), Statistics South Africa (Stats SA) and the United Kingdom's Office of National Statistics (ONS) for their invaluable support in numerous ways.

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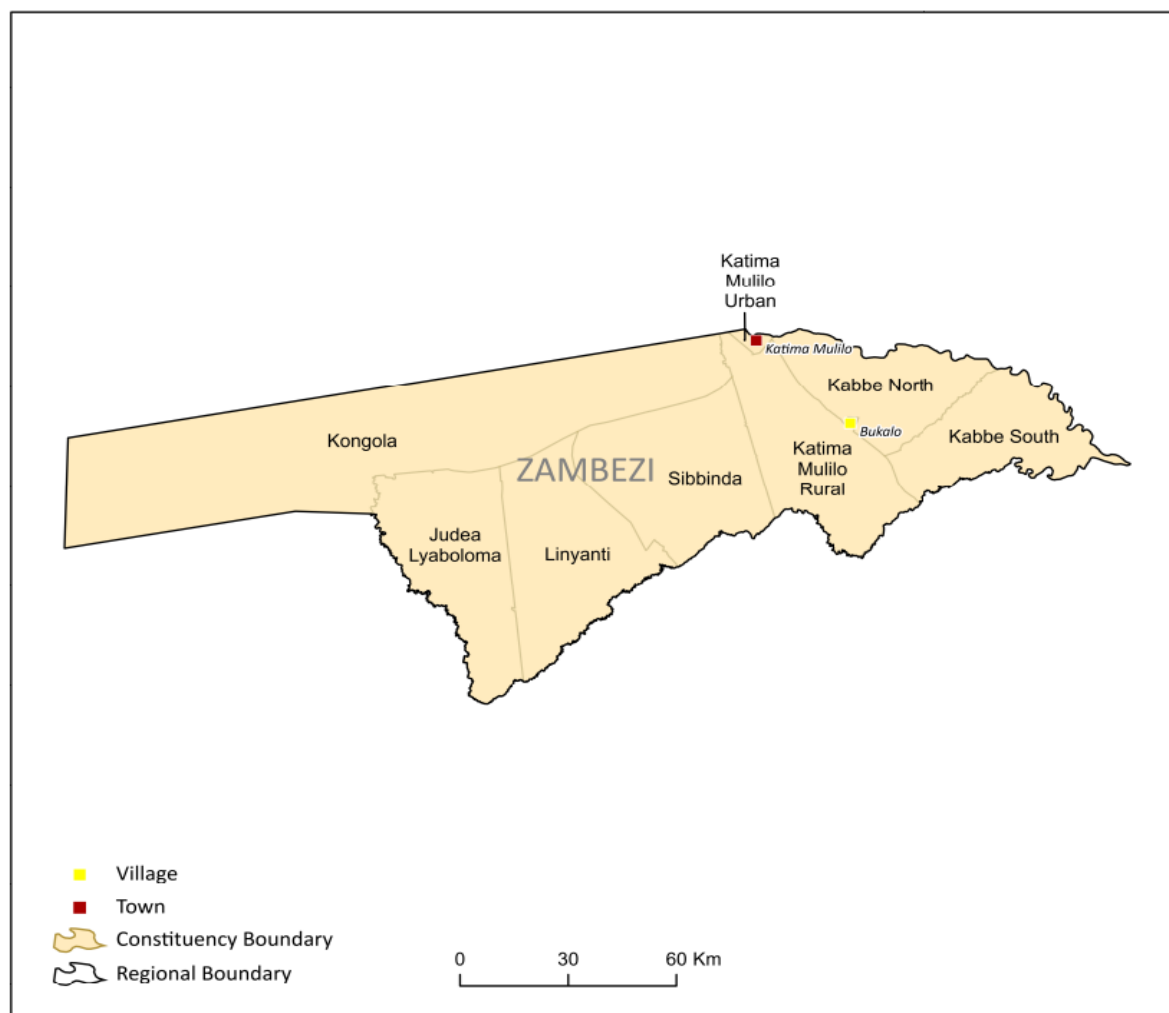

CHAPTER 1 : INTRODUCTION

The Namibia Statistics Agency (NSA) is mandated by Part III, Section 7, sub-section 2 (d) of the Statistics Act No.9 of 2011, to conduct Population and Housing Censuses every ten (10) years. This places a legal obligation on all NSA employees and stakeholders involved in the implementation of the Namibia 2023 Population and Housing Census (henceforth referred to as the 2023 Census) to record, process, analyze and disseminate responses received during the 2023 census enumeration truthfully and accurately. The Statistics Act, through Part VIII, Sections 44 and 45 underscores the importance of data security in that all personnel involved in the 2023 Census sign the Oath of Secrecy that ensures data collected in the 2023 Census that could be linked to individuals and households are kept strictly confidential.

The 2023 Census was the fourth undertaking since Namibia's independence in 1990, and the first spatially enabled digital census in the country. The first complete census was conducted in 1991, followed by the second and third censuses, conducted in 2001 and 2011 respectively.

The main objective of the 2023 Census is to provide up-to-date demographic and socio-economic statistical information about the population and their living conditions, necessary for evidence-based planning, decision-making, and policy formulation. The 2023 Census further, provides data for monitoring and evaluation of development programs at national, regional, and constituency levels while also providing the indicators to evaluate progress against national and international Agenda such as Vision 2030, National Development Plans (NDPs), Harambee Prosperity Plan, Sectoral Plans, Africa Agenda 2063 and the Agenda 2030 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The 2023 Census enumeration was carried out over three weeks from 18 September to 06 October 2023. The first week (18 – 23 September 2023) was dedicated to the household listing exercise and thereafter the enumeration of all persons and housing units took place from 24 September to 06 October 2023). The 2023 Census Reference Night (CRN) was the night of the 24 September 2023.

The 2023 Census targeted the population in conventional/ private households including those in institutions for example, in school hostels, army/ police barracks, hospitals wards, correctional facilities and special population groups such as the homeless, travelers, sea workers etc.

Therefore, the actual population presented in this report reflects the Namibia population on the CRN census in 2023.

This report presents highlights from basic analysis of the 2023 census data and presents results at regional, urban, rural and constituency levels.

1.1. Methodology

The 2023 Census adopted a de facto method of enumeration, which is the enumeration of all persons in the country at a particular point in time. The census project was implemented in three broad phases as per the international standards and best practices. as follows:

1.1.1. Pre-Enumeration phase

This phase covered census planning, census mapping, census tools development such as questionnaire development, edit rules, scripting of the questionnaire, Computer-assisted personal Interviews (CAPI) application development and testing, and the like. phase kicked off with the census mapping exercise in October 2019 and concluded with the census pilot in November 2021. The census mapping, in particular, entails visiting and enumerating all structures in the country including the collection of basic information on their use. The purpose of this exercise was to demarcate the entire country into uniquely defined units known as Enumeration Areas (EAs) in preparation for the census enumeration. A total of 8,738 EAs were demarcated nationally and formed the basis for all census logistics.

Similarly, the census pilot was undertaken to assess the readiness of all census tools, processes and logistical arrangements. The pilot was implemented in 109 purposively selected EAs (54 EAs from urban areas and 55 EAs from rural areas) across the country.

1.1.2. Enumeration phase

The enumeration phase comprised of the finalization of census tools, census publicity and advocacy, recruitment and training of field staff, transport and logistics, listing, main enumeration, and data transmission.

The main enumeration commenced country-wide from 25 September 2023 to 06 October 2023, however, with extensions for final verifications, the fieldwork only concluded officially on 05

November 2023. Three different questionnaires were administered: Form A for Private/conventional households and Form B for Institutional (School hostels, Army barracks, prisons, University hostel, etc.) households and Form C for Special populations (Hospitals - inpatient, hotels, travelers, homeless, etc.). Form A had individual/person records, household records, and mortality records. While Form B only had individual/personal records. In contrast, Form C had only 8 individual/person records.

The deployment comprised of assigning an Enumerator to an EA in urban areas, while in rural areas, two Enumerators were allocated to an EA in a sweeping mode. These field staff were supported by a team supervisor, constituency supervisor, constituency IT field technician, constituency fleet officer, constituency publicity officer, deputy regional census coordinator, and regional census coordinator. All these levels ensured daily data transmission from the field to the head office server to avoid loss of data.

Finally, to safeguard the quality of the 2023 Census data, a total quality assurance approach based on the Namibia Quality Assurance Framework for Statistics (NQAFS) was adopted. This approach ensured the quality of digital tile packages, printed maps, questionnaires, applications, field manuals, and training of all census staff. The census data quality assurance manual was developed to inform fieldwork procedures, plans, and guidelines. In addition, the census dashboard that extracts data from the central server was developed and used by the data monitoring team to check for data inconsistencies and flag out areas of concern during enumeration.

The summary checks on the data received from the central server were shared with the regional field staff and verification was carried out during data collection to ensure data quality. Furthermore, the NSA conducted a Post Enumeration Survey (PES) to measure the coverage and content error of Census data.

During enumeration, the census situation room was set up at the head office to provide overall management oversight of the enumeration progress using the census dashboard and daily regional reports. This platform provided an opportunity to timely resolve issues and challenges experienced in the field on a daily basis.

1.1.3. Post-Enumeration Phase

The post-enumeration activities include the data processing, release of preliminary results, and thematic analysis and dissemination of census results. The use of technology at all stages of the census enabled timely processing of census data and the production of reports. The quality of the census data can be affirmed by the results of Post Enumeration Surveys.

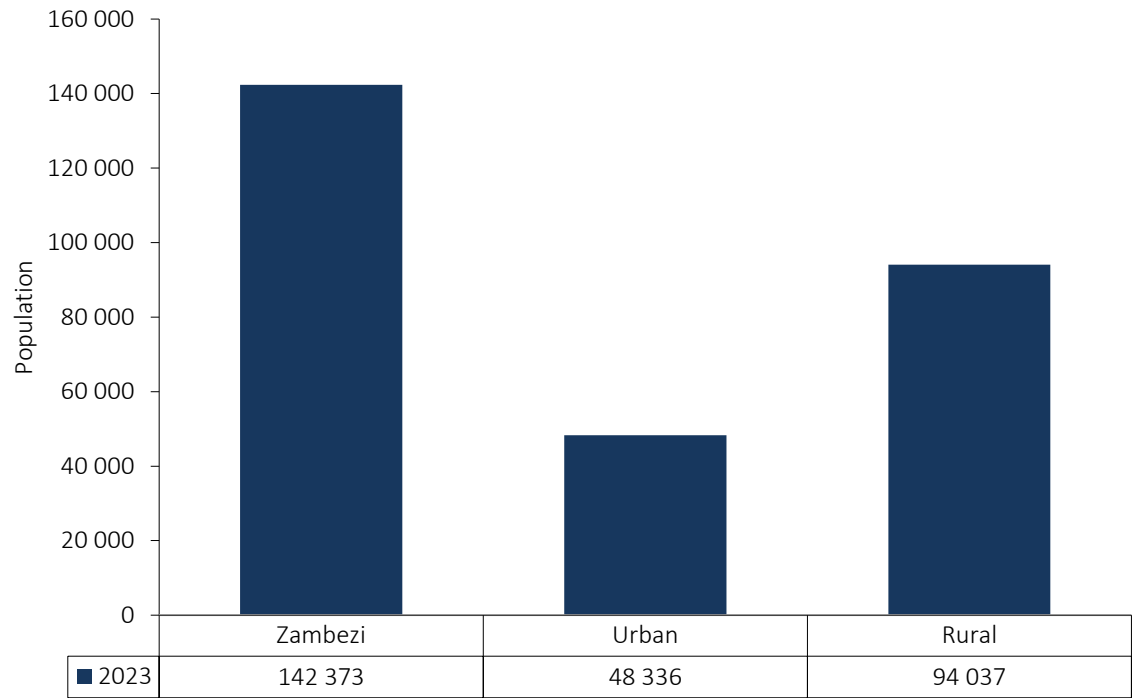
CHAPTER 2 : POPULATION SIZE, COMPOSITION AND DENSITY

This chapter presents highlights of the population characteristics related to size, growth and composition for Zambezi region based on the 2011 and 2023 census results.

2.1 Population size and Growth

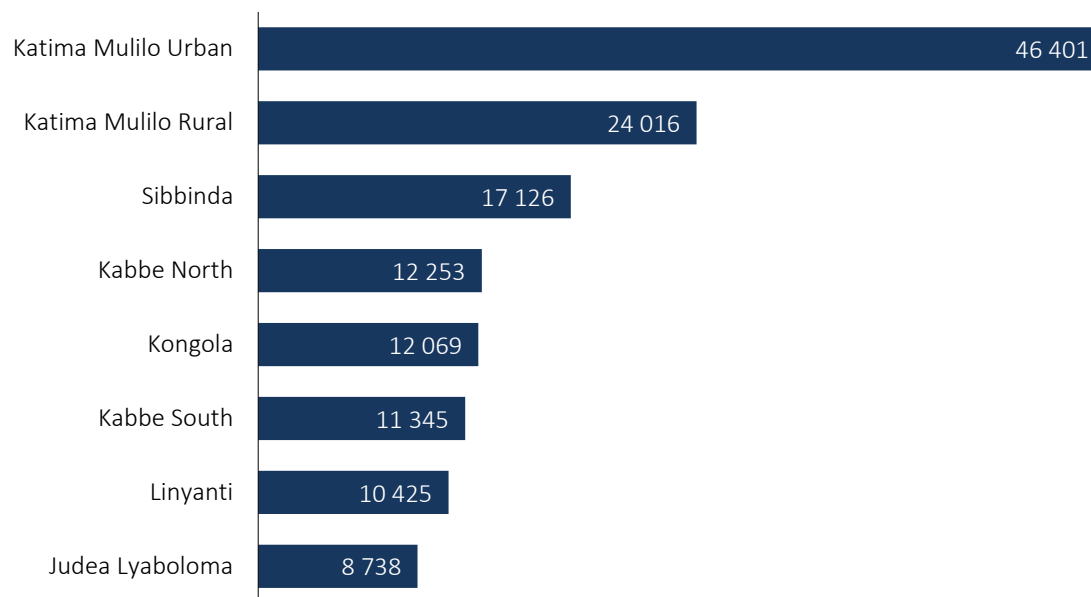
The population of Zambezi region was 142,373 in 2023. More people reside in rural areas (94,037) than urban (48,336) areas.

Katima Mulilo Urban constituency had the highest population (46,401) in 2023, while Judea Lyaboloma constituency had the least population (8,738)

Figure 2.2: Population size by constituency: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census

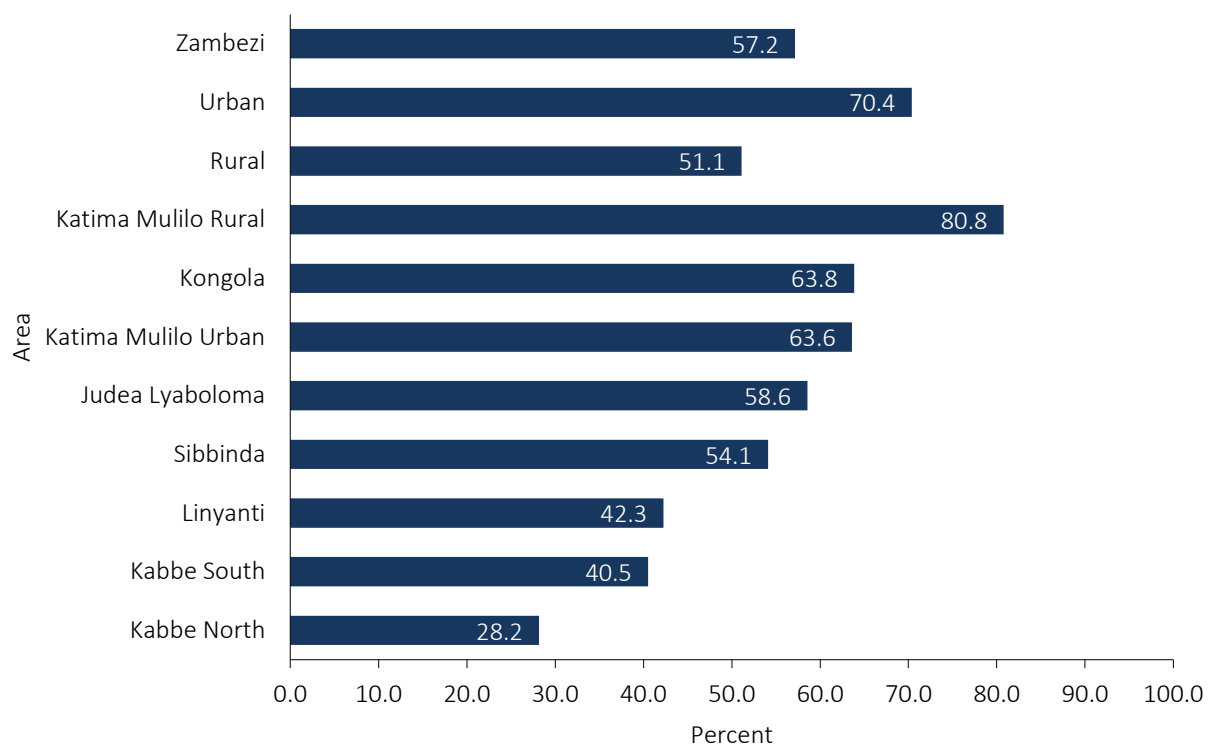


The population of Zambezi region increased by 57.2 percent between 2011 and 2023. Both the urban and rural population has increased significantly, by 70.4 and 51.1 percent, respectively. While the population increased in all the constituencies, the percentage changes varied significantly, ranging from 28.2 percent in Kabbe North to 80.8 percent in Katima Mulilo Rural.

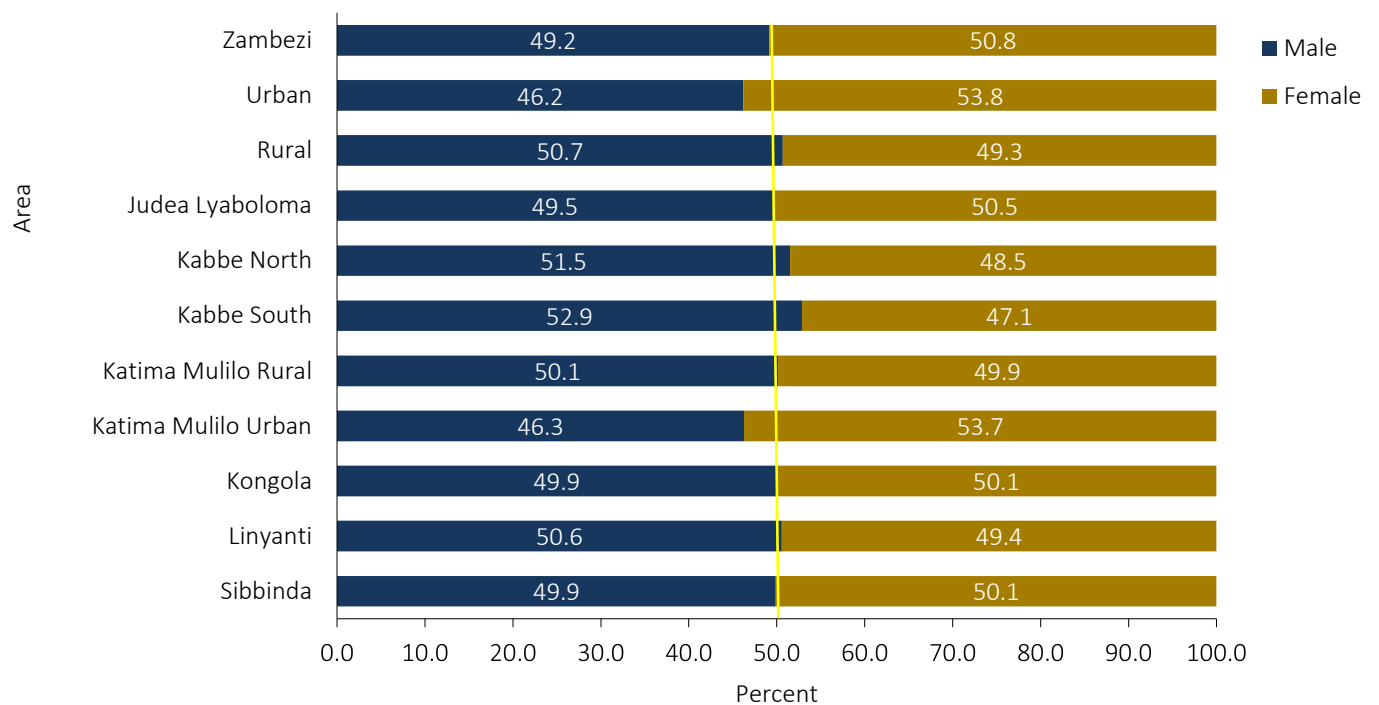
Figure 2.3: Percentage change in population size by area, 2011 – 2023: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census



2.2. Sex composition

There were slightly more females (50.8%) than males (49.2%) in Zambezi region, this pattern was replicated in urban areas with females (53.8%) and males (46.2%). However, there were more males (50.7%) in rural areas compared to females (49.3%)

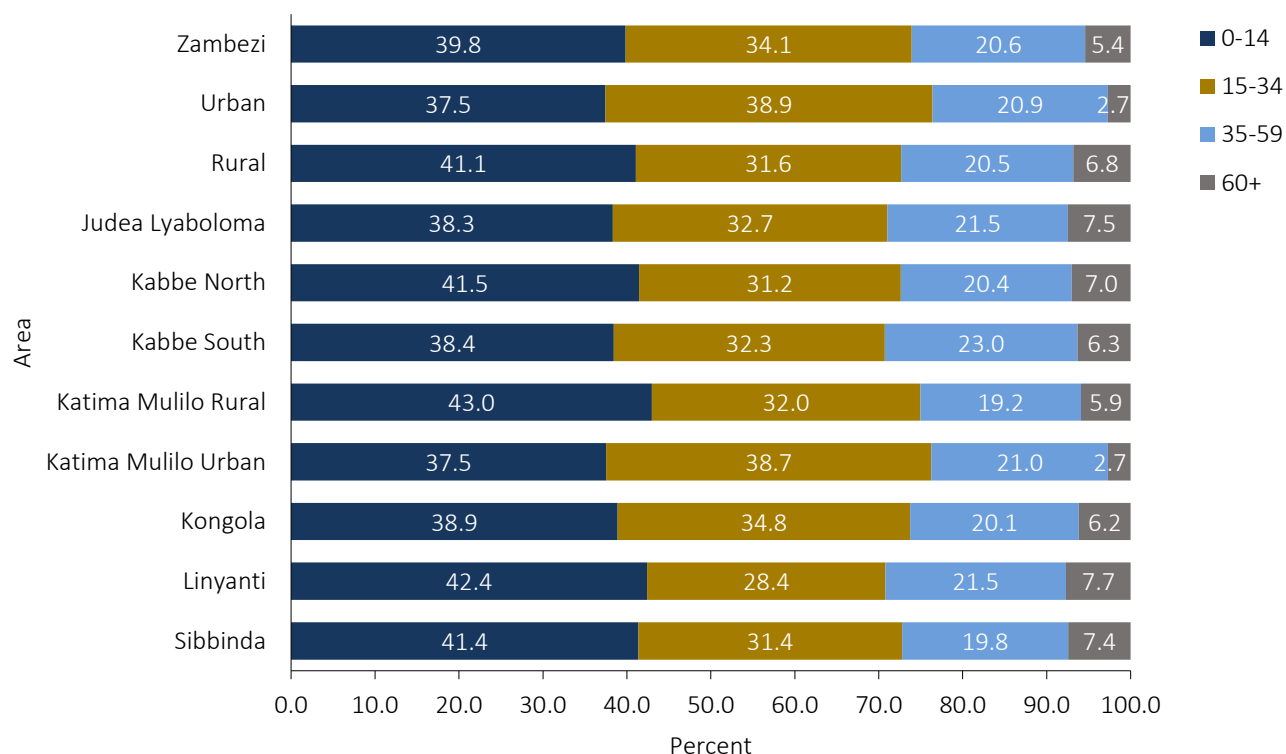
Figure 2.4: Percent population share [Composition] by area and sex: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census



2.3. Age structure

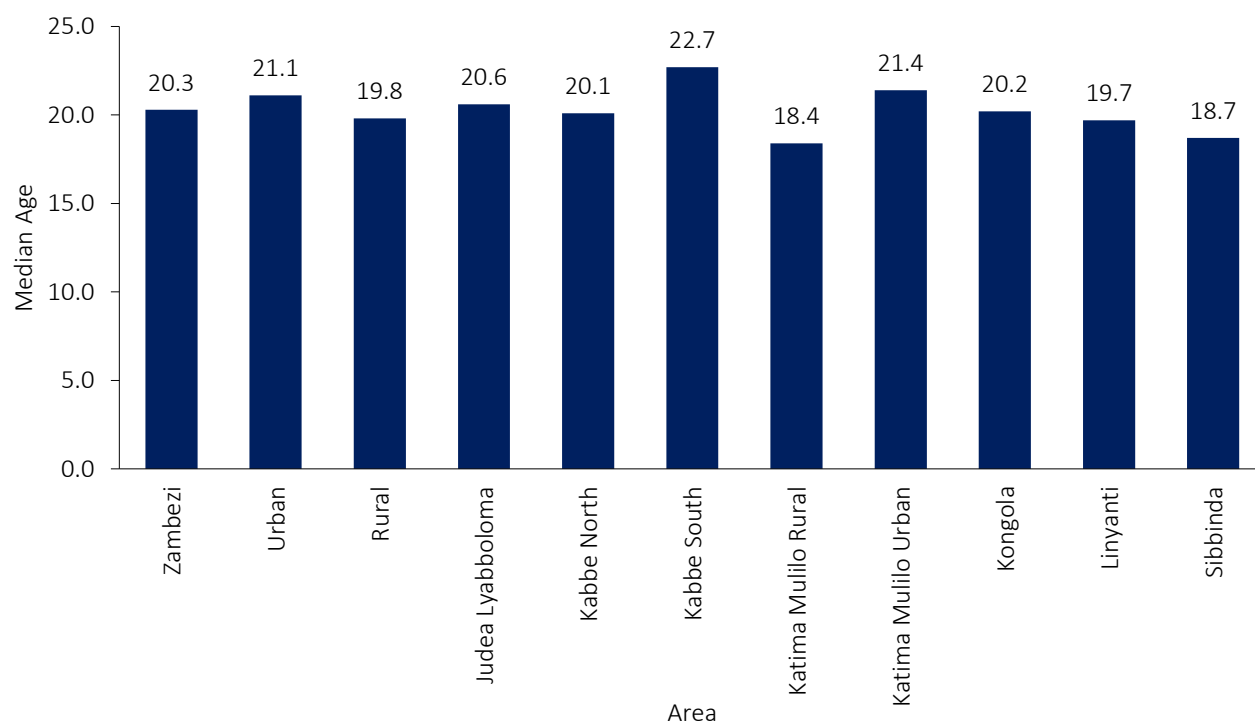
Zambezi region is dominated by the young and youthful population (0-14 and 15-34) with a percentage of 73.9 of the population. This overall pattern is replicated in all areas.

The median age of the population in Zambezi region was 20.3 years. The population was younger in rural (19.8 years) compared to urban (21.1 years) areas. However, significant variation was observed across the constituencies, the lowest being Katima Mulilo Rural (18.4 years) and the highest being Kabbe South (22.7 years).

2.4. Population density

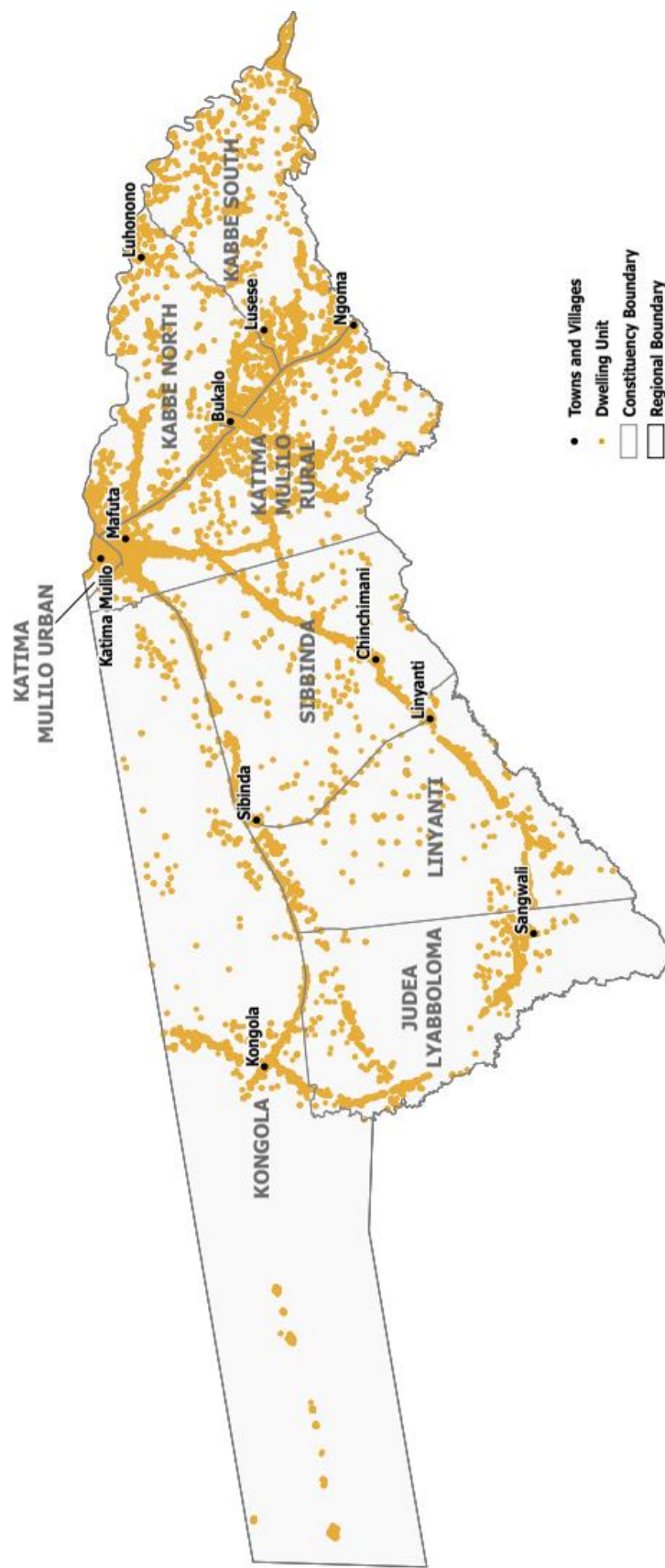
The population density of Zambezi region was 9.7 persons/ km². Katima Mulilo Urban constituency was the most densely populated (1,032.6 persons/ km²) and Kongola constituency was the least populated (2.3 persons/ km²). Kabbe North, Katima Mulilo Rural and Katima Mulilo Urban constituencies had population densities more than the regional density.

Most residential structures in Zambezi region are concentrated towards the eastern side with Katima Mulilo Urban and Katima Mulilo Rural areas showing the highest density of residential structures. This suggests that urban areas have a greater density compared to rural areas (with exception of Katima Mulilo Rural). Constituencies such as Sibbinda, Judea Lyaboloma and Linyanti have a moderate spread of residential structures.

Figure 2.7: Concentration of residential structures: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census



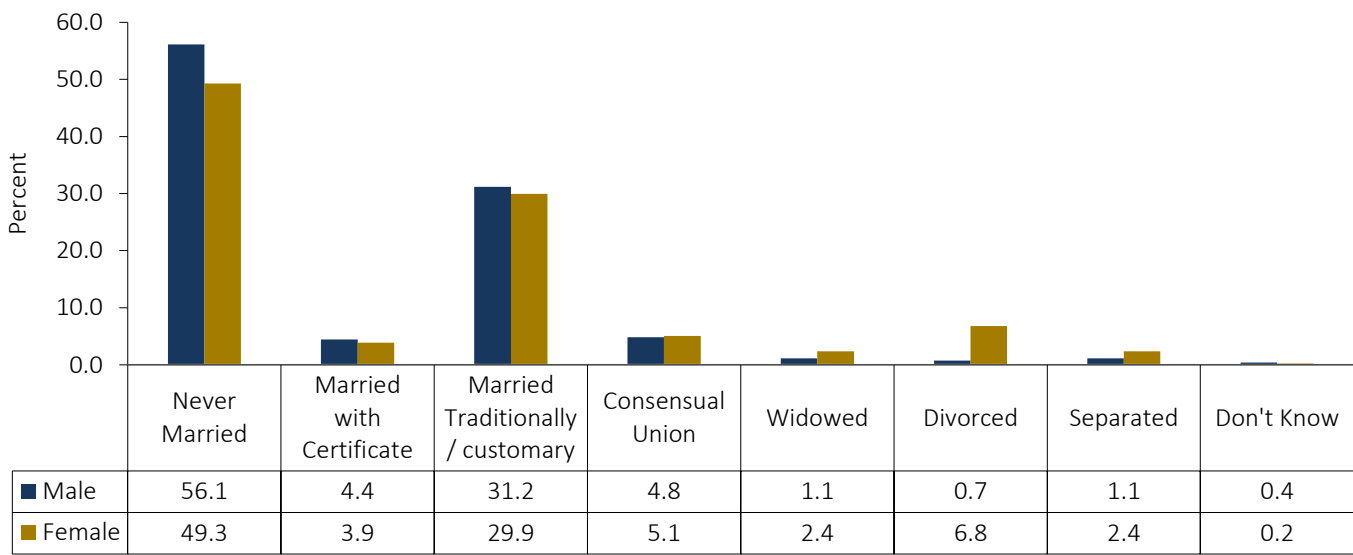
CHAPTER 3 : BACKGROUND CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

This chapter provides information on marital status, citizenship, birth registration, national ID, general health and functioning, albinism and orphanhood.

3.1. Marital Status and Age at first marriage

In Zambezi region, 56.1 percent of the male population aged 15 years and above were never married, compared to 49.3 percent of females.

The median age at first marriage/ consensual union in Zambezi region was 25.5 years, with males having a higher median age (28.4 years) than females (23.0 years) and the same trend was observed across all areas.

3.2. Birth registration, National ID and Death Registration

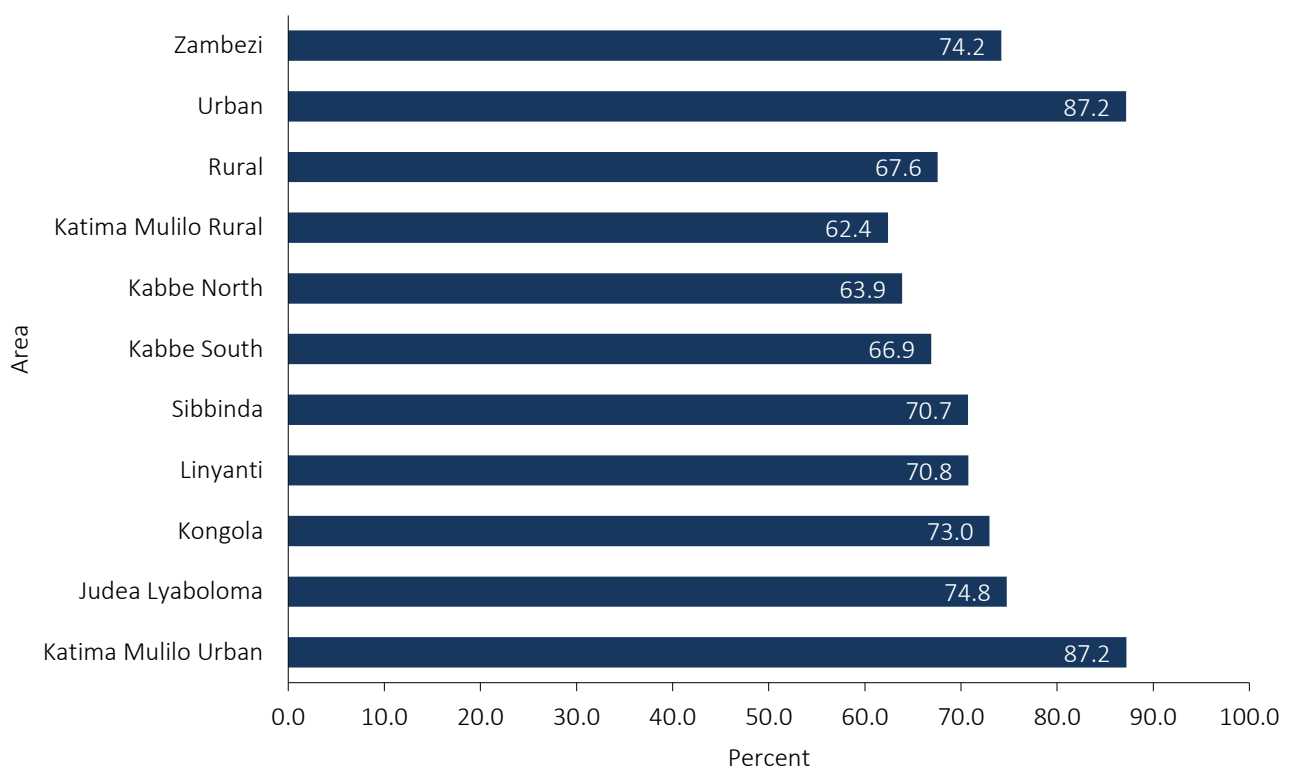
This section provides information on Namibian birth registration status, national ID and death registration.

3.2.1 Birth registration

This subsection provides information on Namibian birth registration status, which is needed to access social services, such as social grants and educational services.

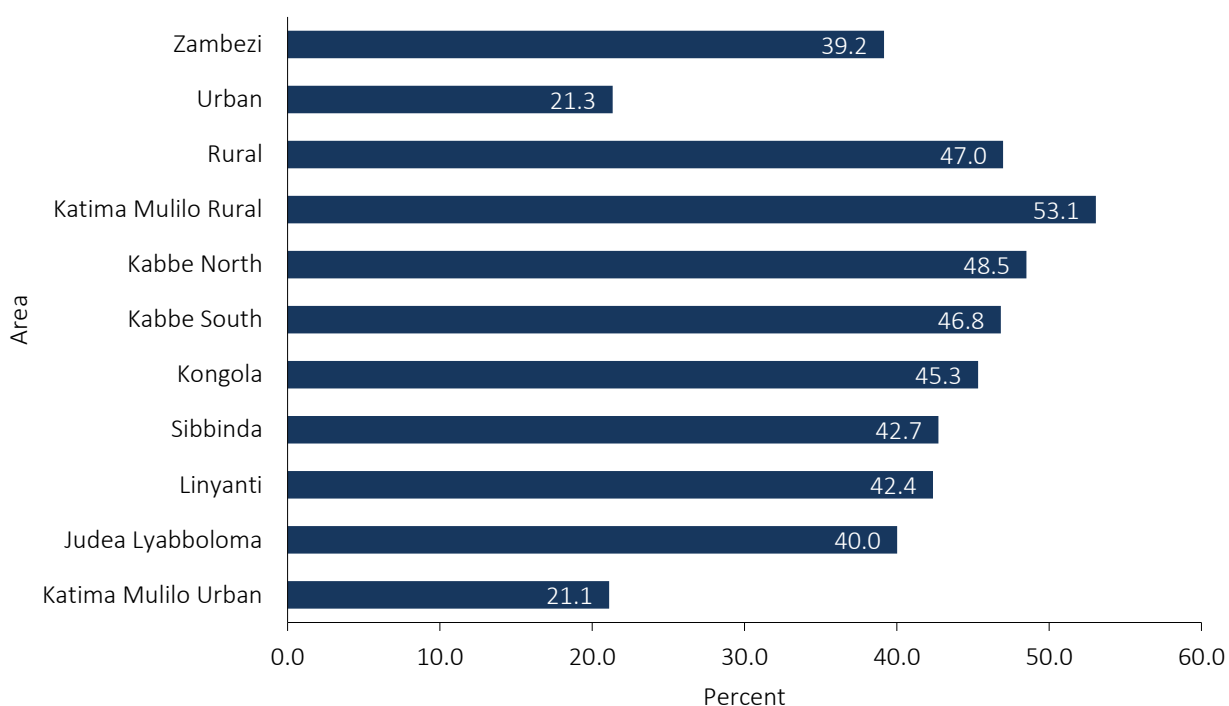
About 74 percent of the population in Zambezi region were issued with a birth certificate by the Namibian Government. At Constituency level Katima Mulilo Urban had the highest percentage of the population issued with birth certificates (87.2%), while Katima Mulilo Rural had the lowest percentage (62.4%).

There were 39.2 percent of children aged 0–4 years without birth certificate in Zambezi region. The percentage of children without birth certificates in rural (47.0 %) was significantly higher than urban (21.3%). At constituency level, Katima Mulilo Rural (53.1%) had the highest percentage while Katima Mulilo Urban (21.1%) the least.

Figure 3.3: Percent distribution of population aged 0 – 4 years without birth certificate by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census

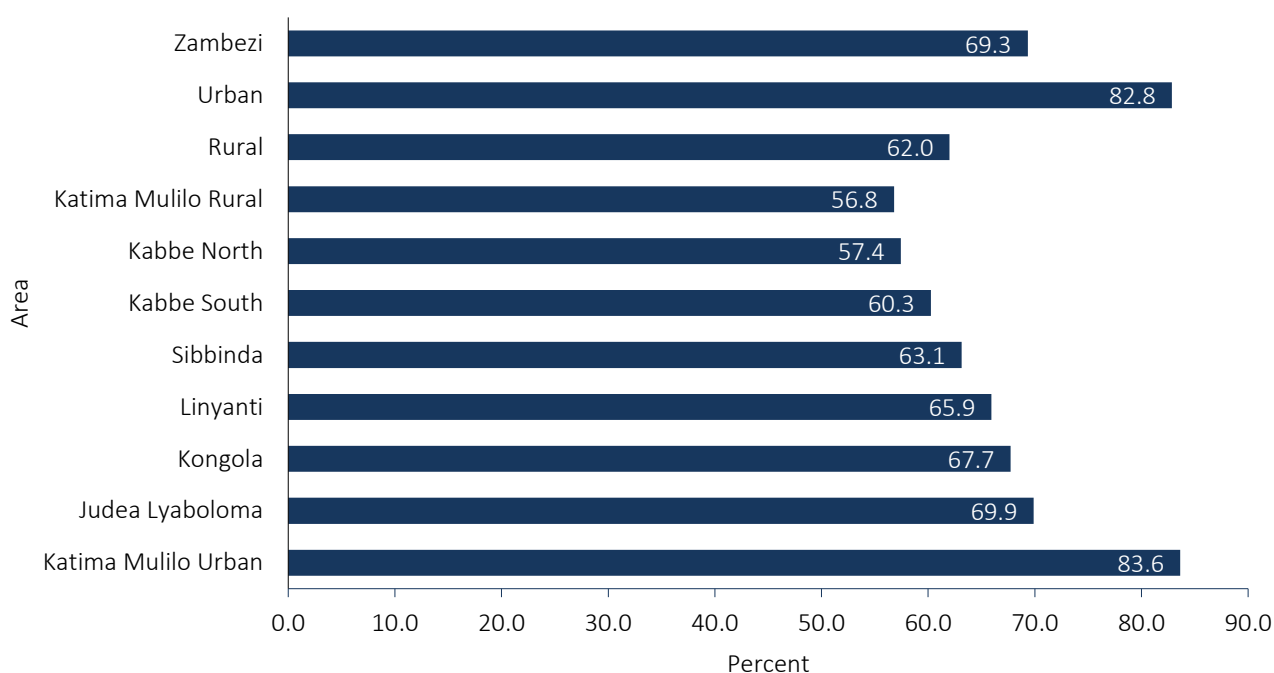


3.2.2. National Identification document (ID)

This section provides information that determines the coverage of Identification Documents (ID cards) in circulation. There are two types of ID: New blue/ pink (issued after independence) and SWA ID (issued before independence).

About 69 percent of the population aged 16 years and above in Zambezi region were issued with a new Namibian ID. Urban area (82.8%) had a higher percentage of ID holders compared to rural areas (62.0%). At the constituency level, Katima Mulilo Urban (83.6%) had the highest percentage, while Katima Mulilo Rural (56.8%) had the lowest of the population issued with a new Namibian ID card.

Figure 3.4: Percent distribution of population aged 16 years and above with new Namibian ID by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census

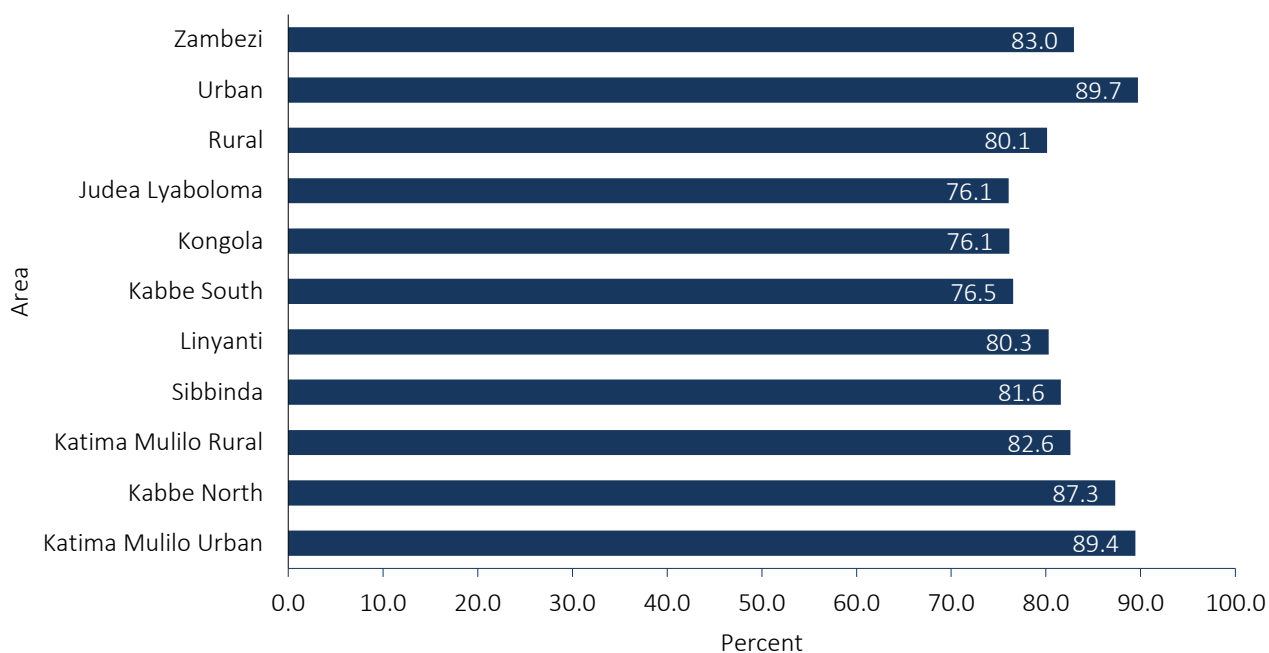

3.2.3. Death registration

83.0 percent of deaths reported in the Zambezi region were registered, and urban areas (89.7%) had more registered deaths than rural areas (80.1%). At constituency level, Katima Mulilo Urban (89.4%) recorded the highest percentage of registered deaths, while Kongola and Judea Lyaboloma (76.1% each) recorded the lowest death registration.

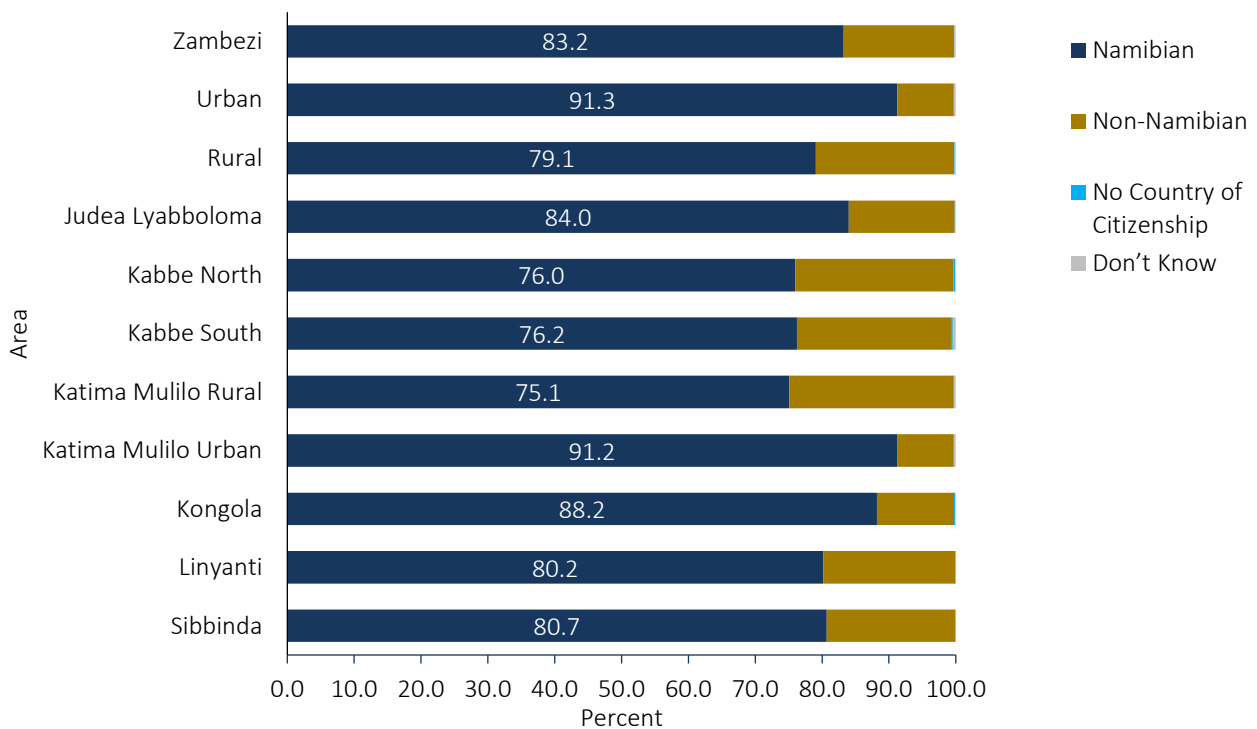
Figure 3.5: Registered deaths by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census



3.3. Citizenship

83.2 percent of the population in Zambezi were Namibian citizens. There was a significant percentage (more than 20%) of non-Namibian enumerated in Kabbe North, Kabbe South, and Katima Mulilo Rural.

Note: No country of citizenship - means that a person does not officially belong to any country. They don't have the legal status of being a citizen of any country. This situation can happen if someone is stateless, meaning they aren't recognized as a citizen by any country.

Among Namibia's neighbouring countries, the majority of the non-Namibian citizens were from Zambia (86.3%), followed by Angolan national (8.2%) and Zimbabwe national (2.7%).

3.4. Ethnicity

This section reflects population by the top 10 ethnic groups and sex.

The Masubia ethnic group accounts for the highest percentage of the population with 33.8 percent, followed by Mafwe (26.3%) and Other African Nationality (14.4%).

3.5. Difficulty in performing activities

This section aims to provide information on the general health and functioning of the population for persons aged five years and older based on six Washington Group (WG) short set of functional questions/ domains; namely seeing, hearing, communicating, walking or climbing stairs, remembering or concentrating, and selfcare

More than 90 percent of the population in Zambezi region had no difficulty in performing an activity in five of the six measured domains, except for “Seeing” which had a lower percentage of 89.7.

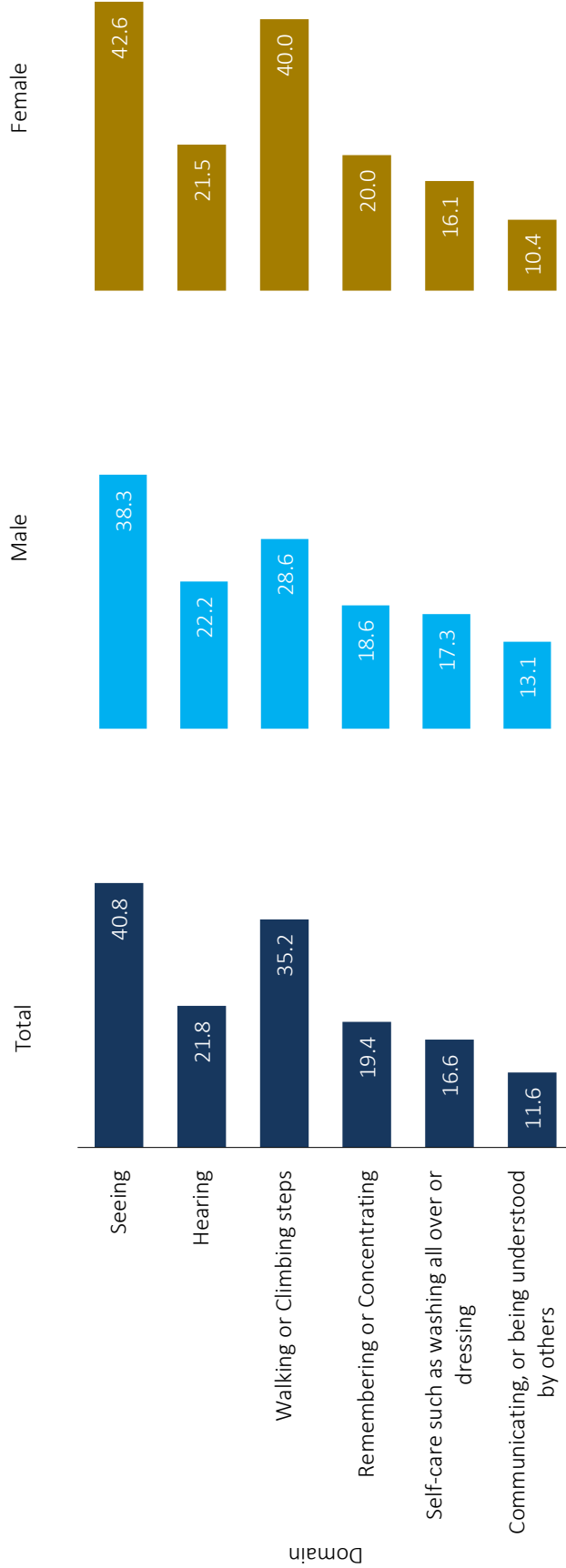

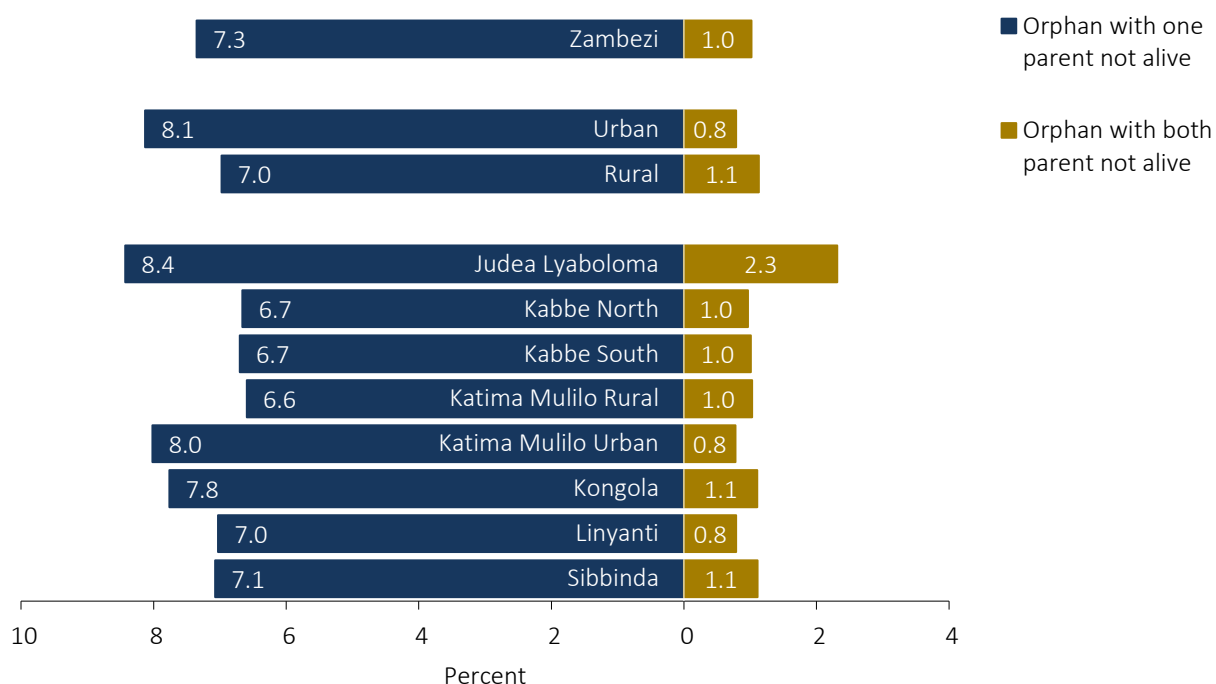

3.7. Orphanhood

Information on orphanhood was collected to provide information on the number of orphans. The term orphanhood refers to persons aged 17 years and below who have lost either one or both parents.

In Zambezi region, 7.3 percent of children lost one parent, while 1.0 percent lost both parents. Orphanhood was more prevalent in rural areas (1.1% with both parents not alive) than in urban areas (0.8% with both parents not alive). At constituency level, Judea Lyaboloma (2.3%) had the highest percentage of orphans without both parents while Linyanti and Katima Mulilo Urban (0.8% each) had the least.

CHAPTER 4 : SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

The chapter focuses on the socioeconomic characteristics of the population providing essential information for decision-making, planning, and monitoring of development programs and policies.

4.1. Information and Communication Technology (ICT)

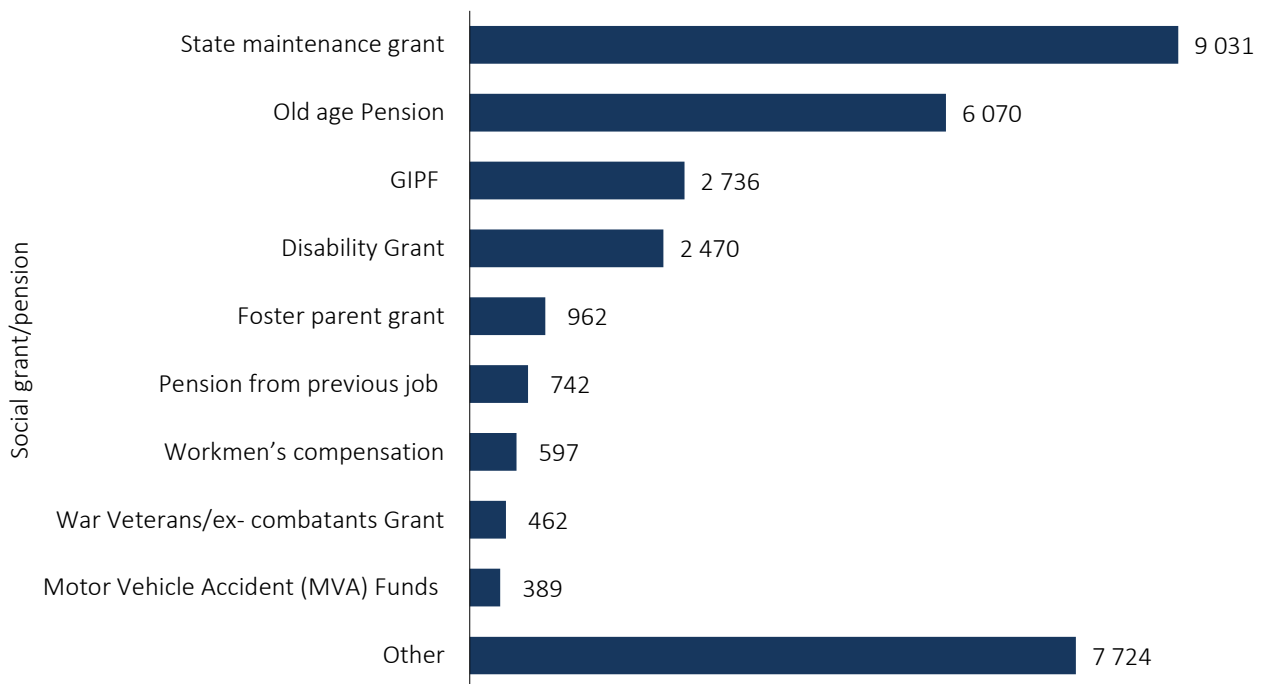
This section provides valuable information on ICT which is required by institutions that deal with ICT infrastructure and regulations.

Most persons aged 3 years and above in Zambezi region access information through SMS (43.5%). The same pattern is observed in urban areas (56.7%) and rural areas (36.6%).

4.2. Social grants/pension.

The figure shows that 9,031 of those receiving social grants/ pensions receive state maintenance (0-17 years), followed by old age pension for the elderly aged 60 years or older (6,070).

4.3. Sports activities

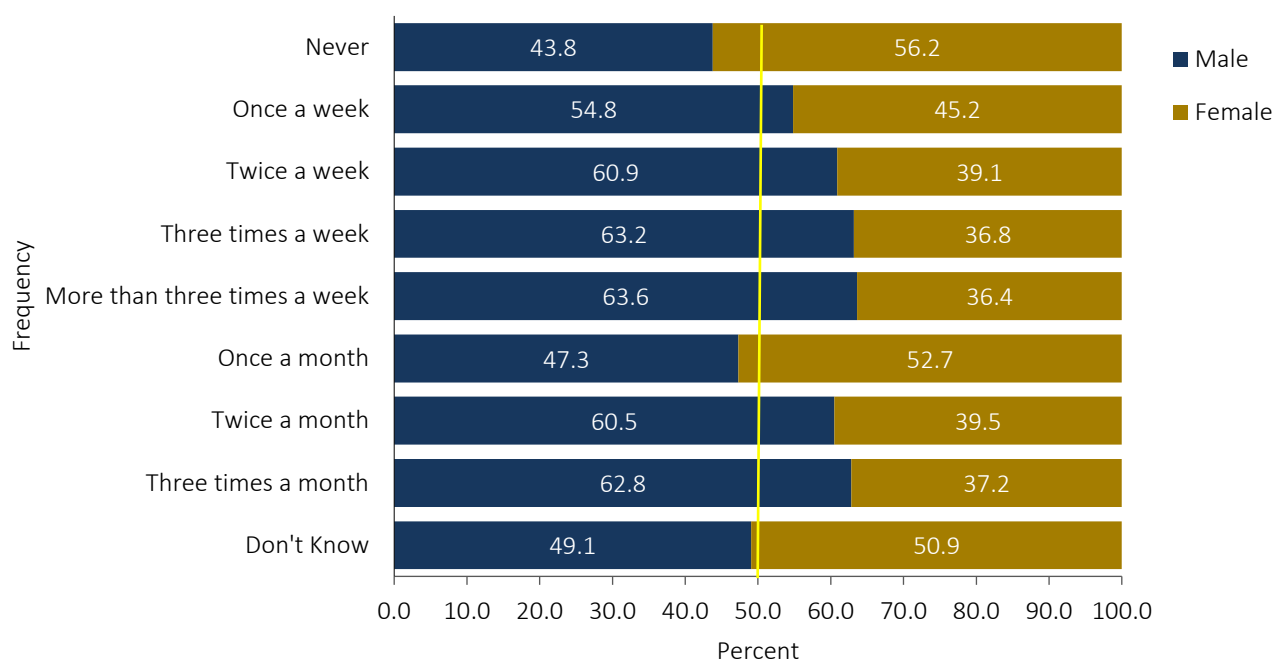
A significant percentage of the population aged 4 years and above Never (68.2%) participated in sports activities for 30 minutes or more at the time of the 2023 census in Zambezi region.

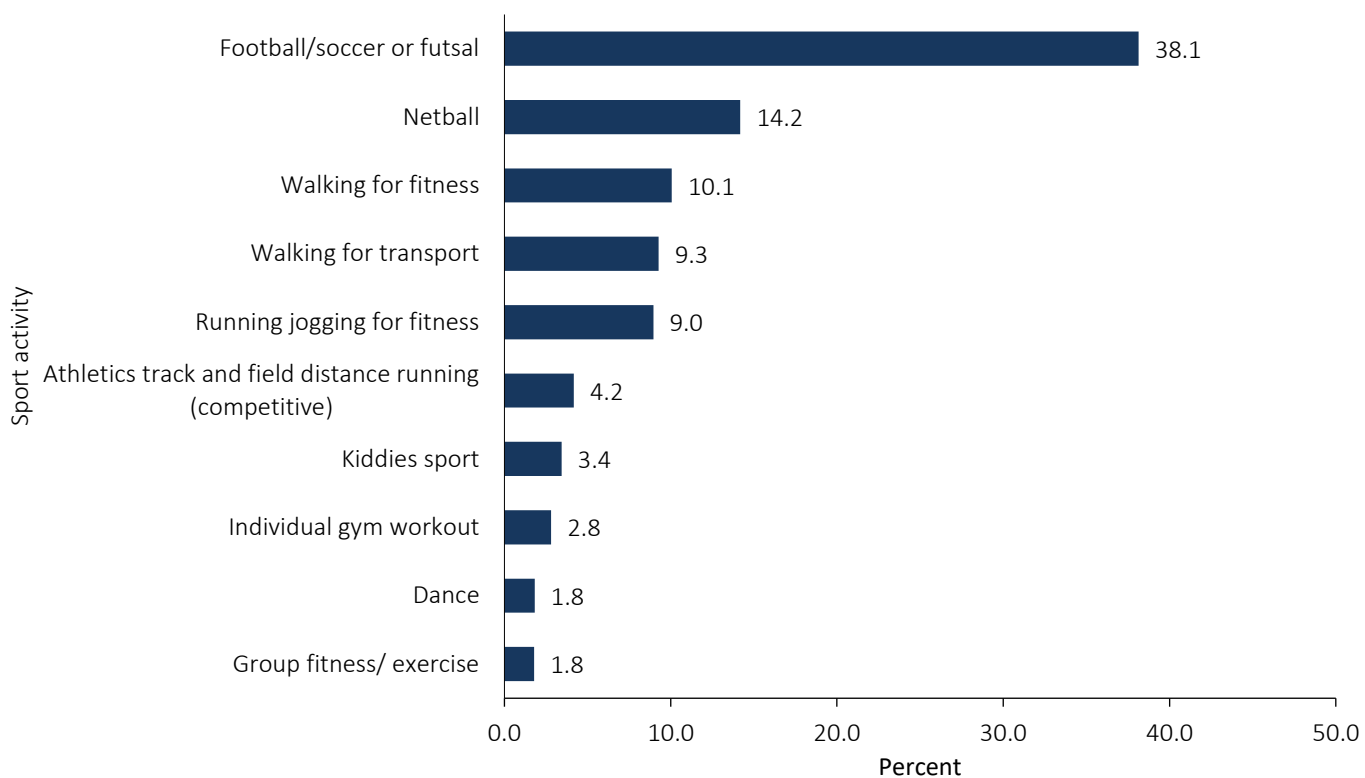
Overall, there are more males participating in sports activities than females. Moreover, the percentage of females (56.2%) who did not participate in sports activities was higher compared to males (43.8%).

Figure 4.3: Percent distribution of population aged 4 years and above participating in top ten primary sport activities: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census



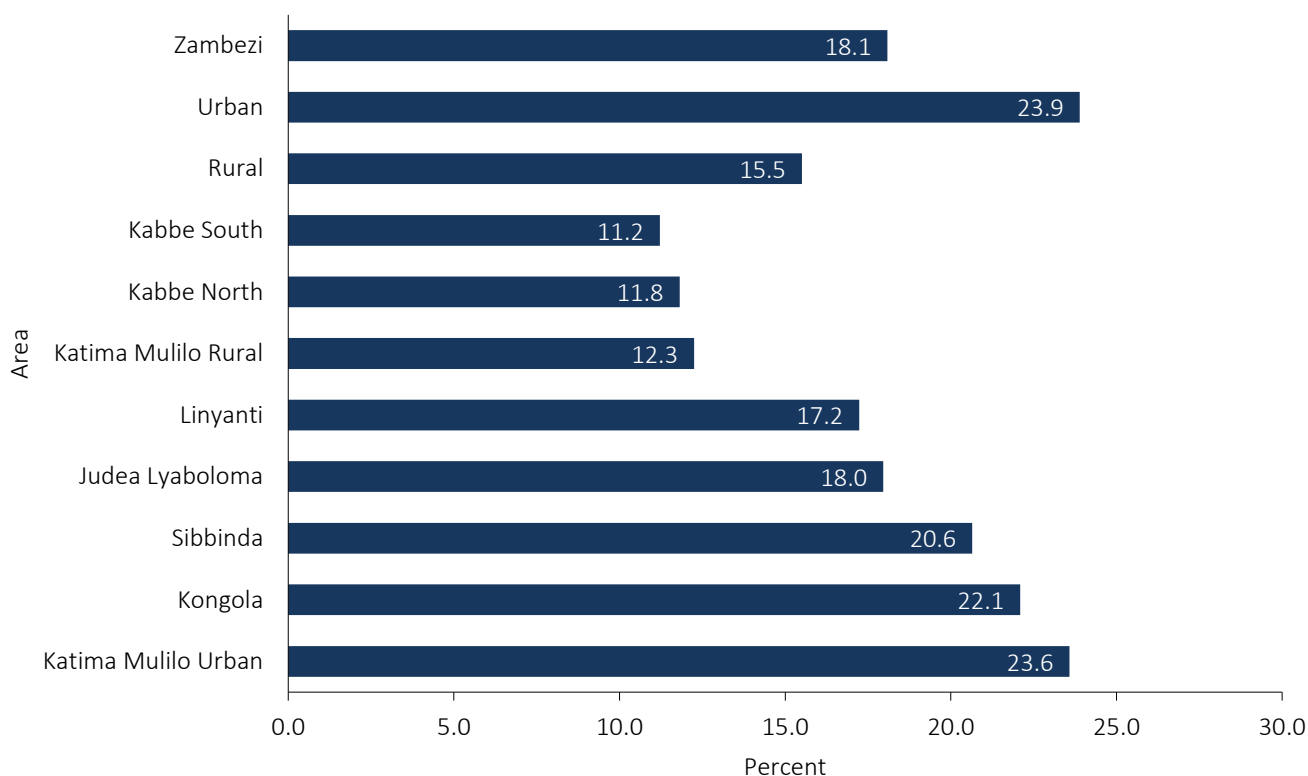
4.4. Early Childhood Development (ECD), Literacy and Education

4.4.1. ECD

This section presents information on ECD attendance and the main reason for not attending for children aged 0 – 5 years.

Overall, 18.1 percent of the population aged 0-5 years were enrolled in ECD programmes. Urban areas (23.9%) had a higher percentage of children enrolled in ECD programmes compared to rural areas (15.5%).

In Zambezi region, the primary reason for not attending ECD programmes was 'Too young to attend' (67.0%), while 19.9 percent were not attending due to financial constraints and about 10.0 percent were due to 'Distance to ECD centre'. This pattern was observed across all areas in the region.

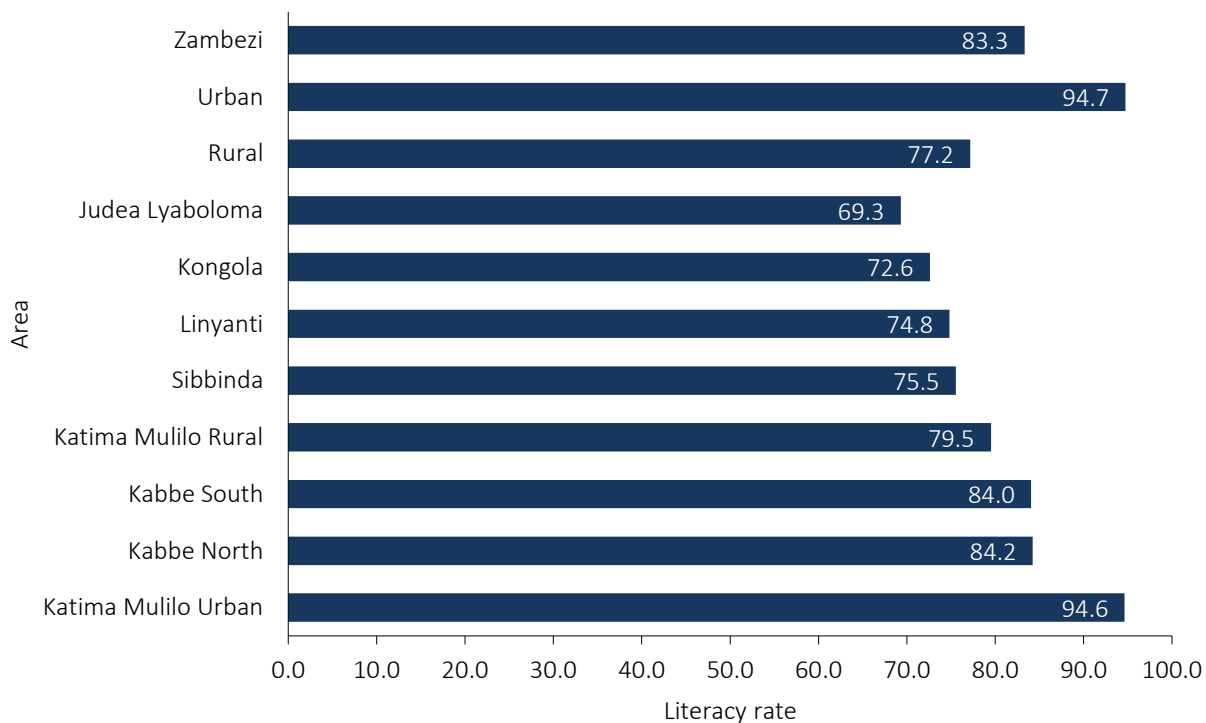

4.4.2. Literacy

Overall, 83.3 percent of persons aged 15 years and above in Zambezi region can read and write. Literacy rate was higher in urban (94.7%) than in rural (77.2%) areas. At constituency level, Katima Mulilo Urban (94.6%) had the highest literacy rate while Judea Lyaboloma (69.3%) had the lowest.

Figure 4.5: Literacy rate for population aged 15 years and above by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, Census 2023



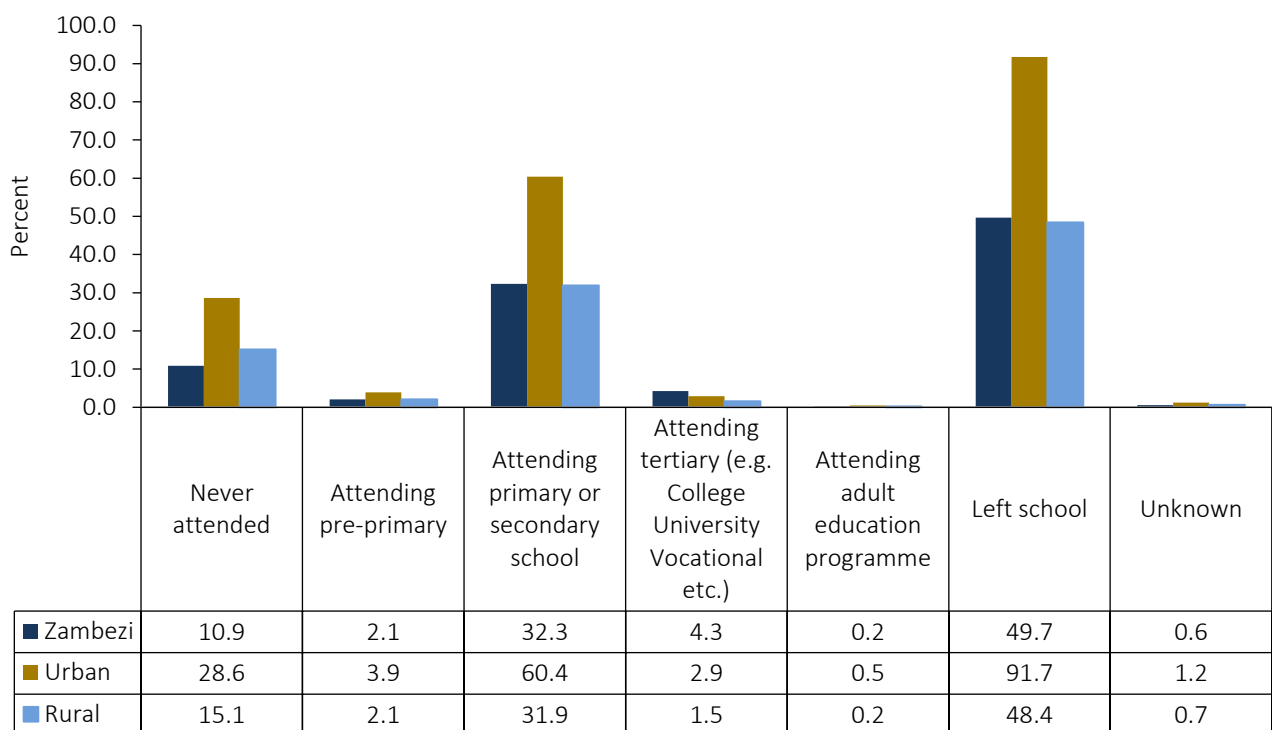
4.4.3. Education

This section presents information on education for persons aged 6 years and above.

4.4.3.1. School Attendance

The largest percentage (49.7%) of the population aged 6 years and above have left school, followed by 32.3 percent who were attending primary or secondary school. Additionally, urban areas (91.7%) had a higher percentage of population who left school compared to rural (48.4%).

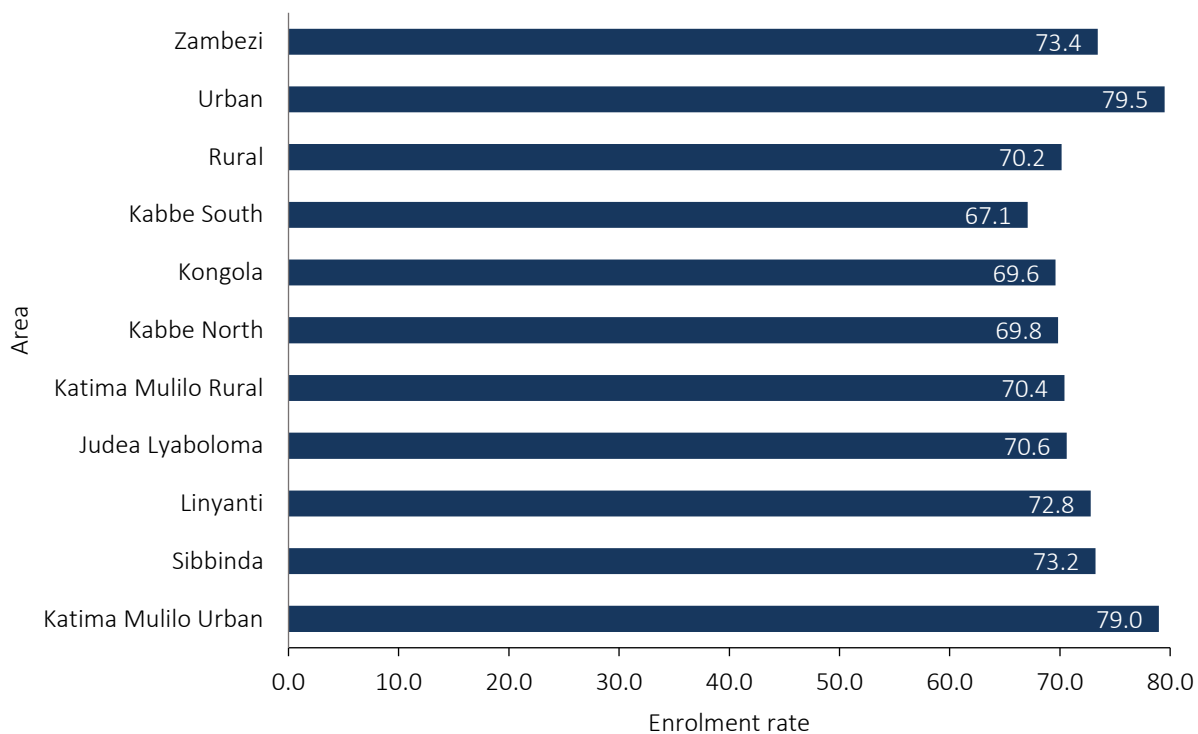
Figure 4.6: Percent distribution of the population aged 6 years and above by area and school attendance: Zambezi region, Namibia, Census 2023



4.4.3.2. School Enrolment

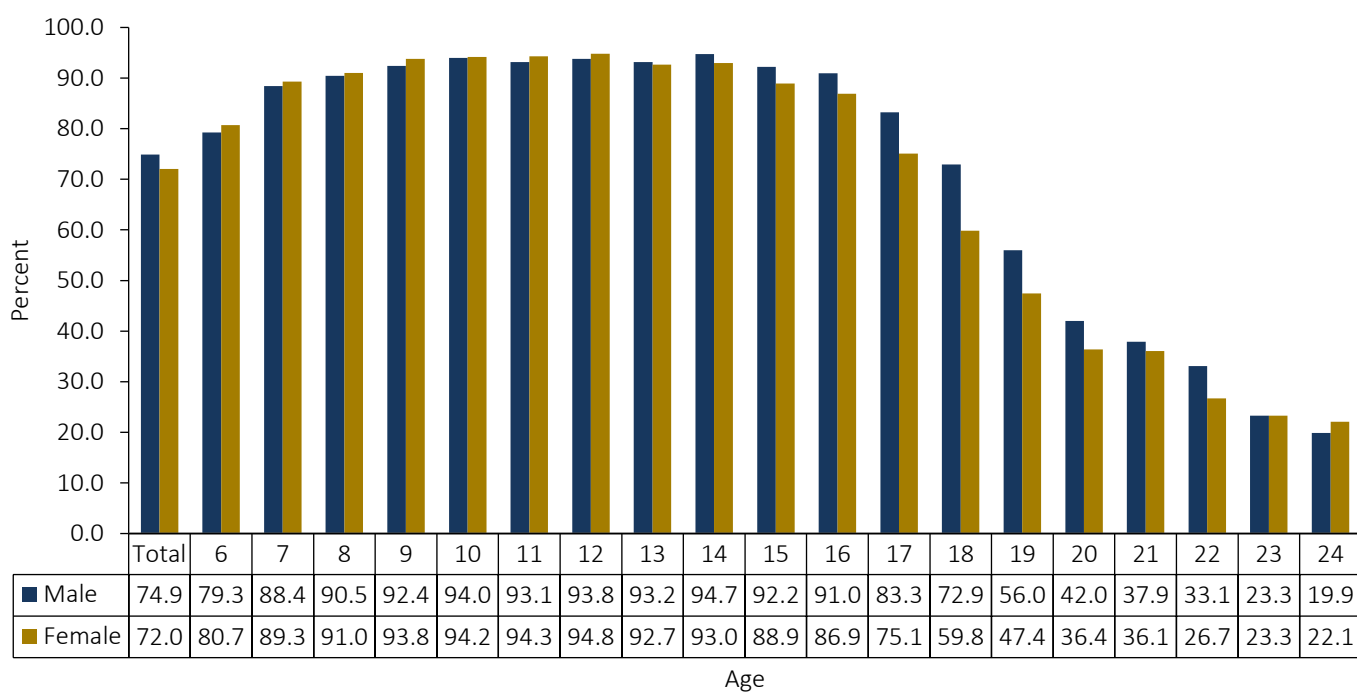
The school enrolment rate in Zambezi region was 73.4 percent. The enrolment rate was higher in urban (79.5%) than rural (70.2%) areas. Moreover, at constituency level, Katima Mulilo Urban (79.0%) had the highest enrolment rate while Kabbe South (67.1%) had the lowest enrolment rate.

Overall, school enrolment rates were high for the ages of 7 to 16 years and declined thereafter. About 75 percent of the population aged 6 – 24 years were enrolled in school. The pattern does not vary significantly by sex from age 6 to 13 years. However, from age 14 to 22 years the males have a higher enrolment rate compared to females.

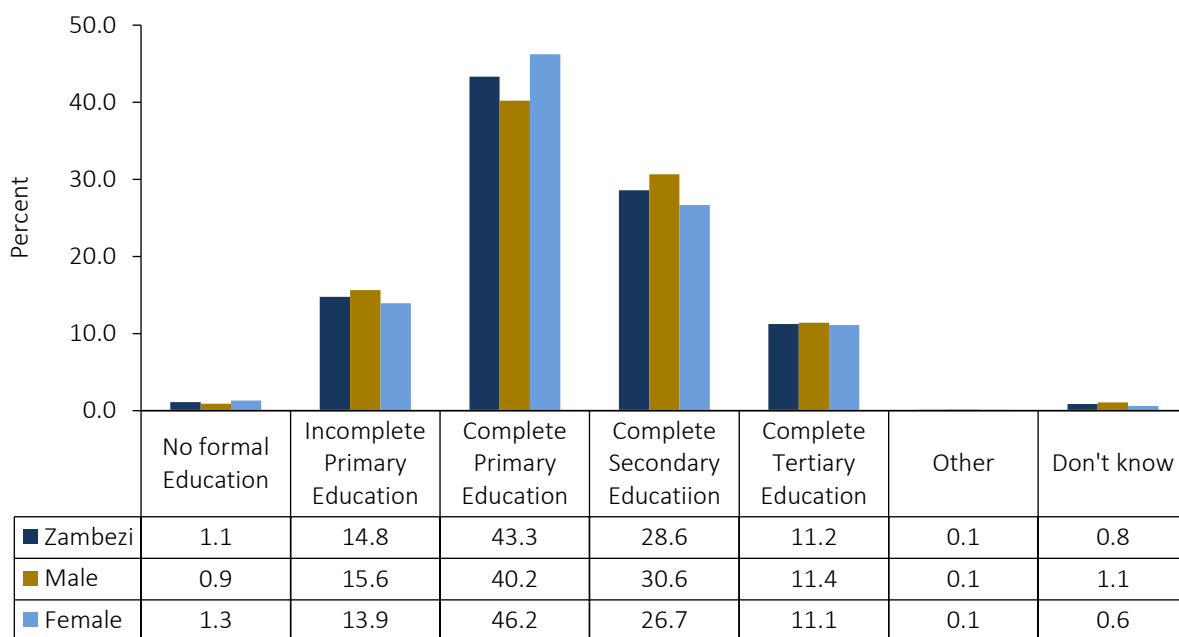
Figure 4.8: Enrolment rate for school going population (6 – 24 years) by sex and age: Zambezi region, Namibia, Census 2023



4.4.3.3. Educational Attainment

The largest percentage (43.3%) of the population aged 15 years and above in Zambezi region had completed primary education and 28.6 percent had completed secondary education. Furthermore, 11.2 percent completed tertiary education.

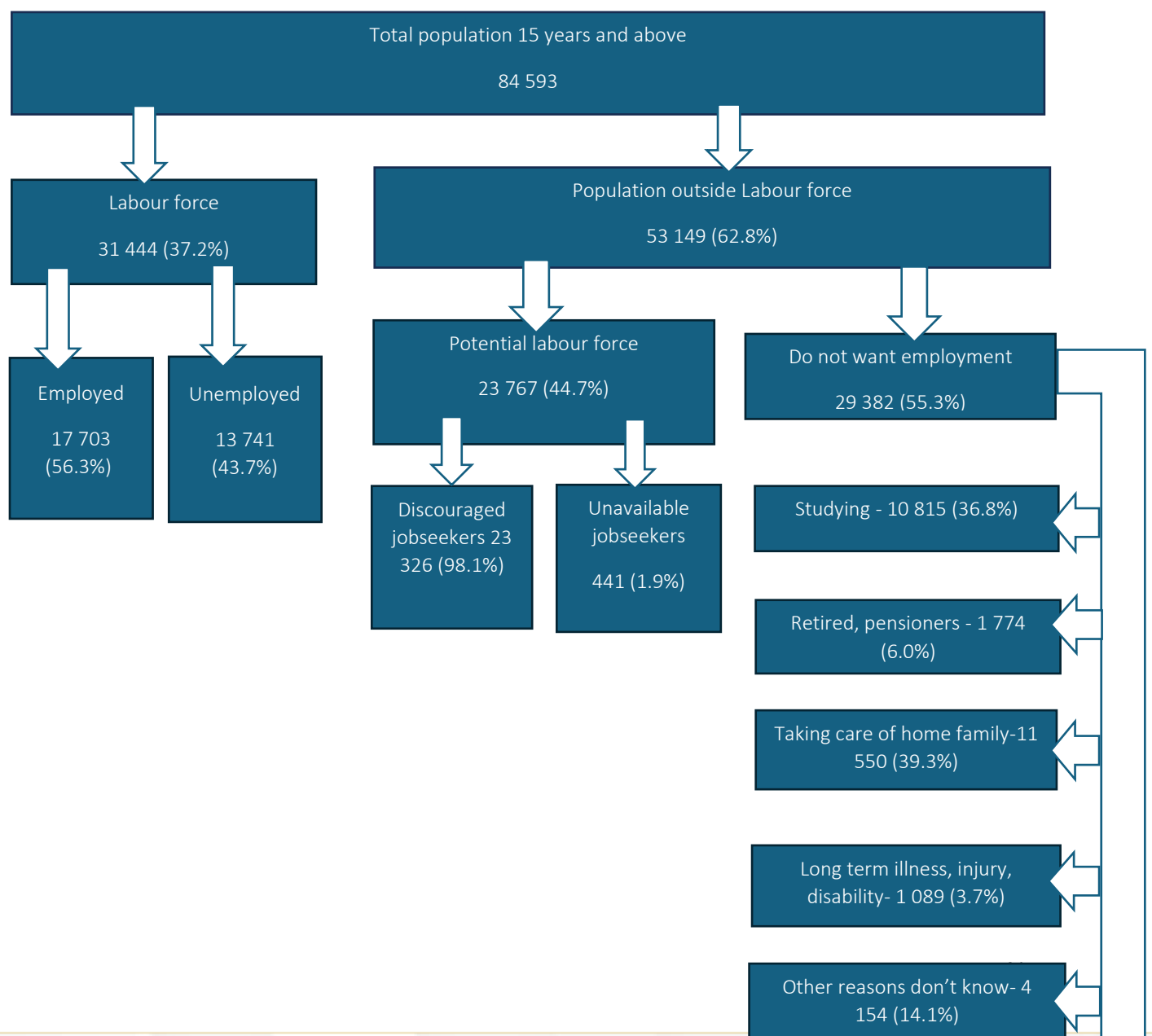
4.5. Labour Force Characteristics

The 2023 PHC adopted the ICLS 19 resolution 1 standard questions as set up by the ILO to measure the economic activity status. The 19th ICLS was to update the previous standards on statistics of the economically active population, employment, and unemployment (13th ICLS, 1982) by setting up a new framework for work and labor market statistics. This section provides an overview of

economic activity. Detailed statistics are presented in the Namibia 2023 PHC Labour Force thematic report.

In Zambezi region, the working-age population was 84,593 of which 31,444 were in the labour force. The percentage of the labour force that were unemployed is 43.7 percent. In addition, 98.1 percent of the potential labour force were discouraged job seekers.

Figure 4.10: Population aged 15 years and above by activity status: Zambezi region, Namibia, Census 2023

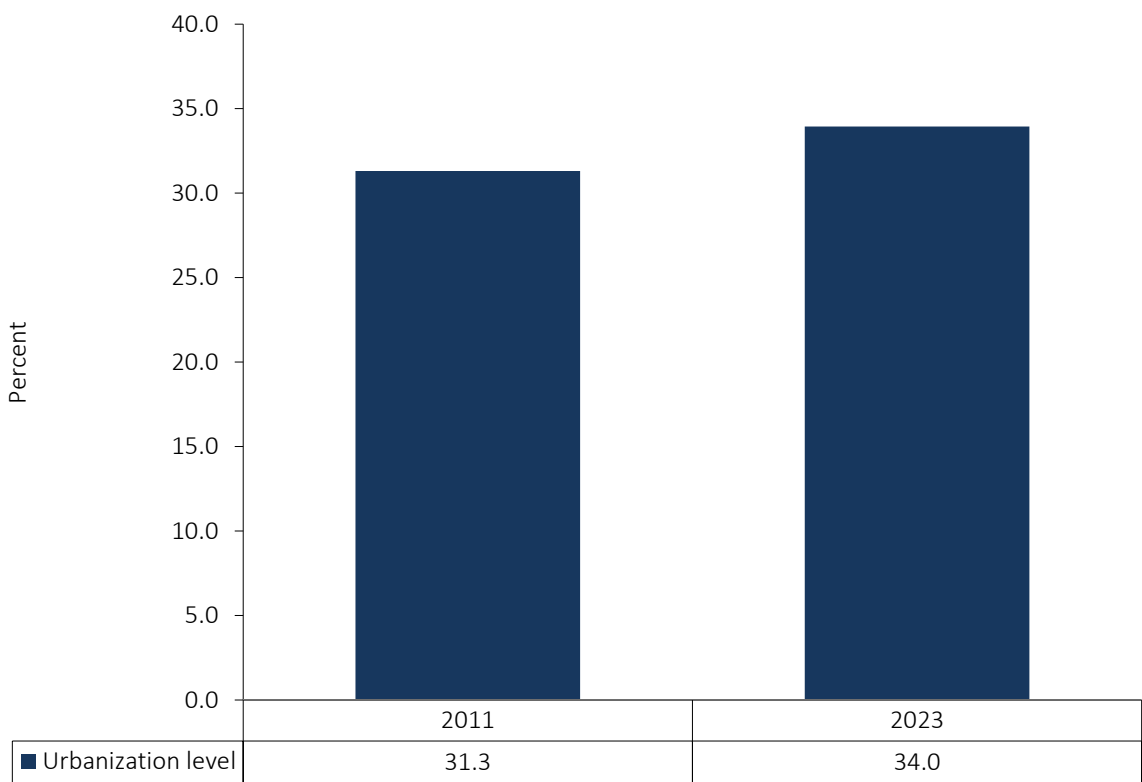


4.6. Urbanization

The level of urbanization indicates the relative number of inhabitants in urban areas compared to rural areas.

Urbanization increased by 2.7 percent from 31.3 percent in 2011 to 34.0 in 2023 in Zambezi region.

In Zambezi region, Katima Mulilo was the most populous town during the two census years, 2011 and 2023 with 28,362 and 46,401 persons, respectively. Bukalo had the highest population increase (97.9%) and the highest annual growth rate at 5.7.

CHAPTER 5 : POPULATION DYNAMICS

This chapter analyses component of population change: fertility and mortality, presented at regional, urban/ rural and constituency levels.

5.1. Fertility

This section presents the basic direct fertility indicators such as Crude Birth Rate (CBR), age at first live birth and birth delivery assistance for women aged 15 – 49 years.

5.1.1. Crude Birth Rate (CBR)

Women in Zambezi Region gave birth to 4,978 babies in the year preceding the census, and this is equivalent to the CBR of 35.0 births per 1,000 population. At the Constituency level, Katima Mulilo Rural had the highest CBR of 39.2 births per 1,000 population while, Kabbe South recorded the lowest CBR of 29.5 births per 1,000 population.

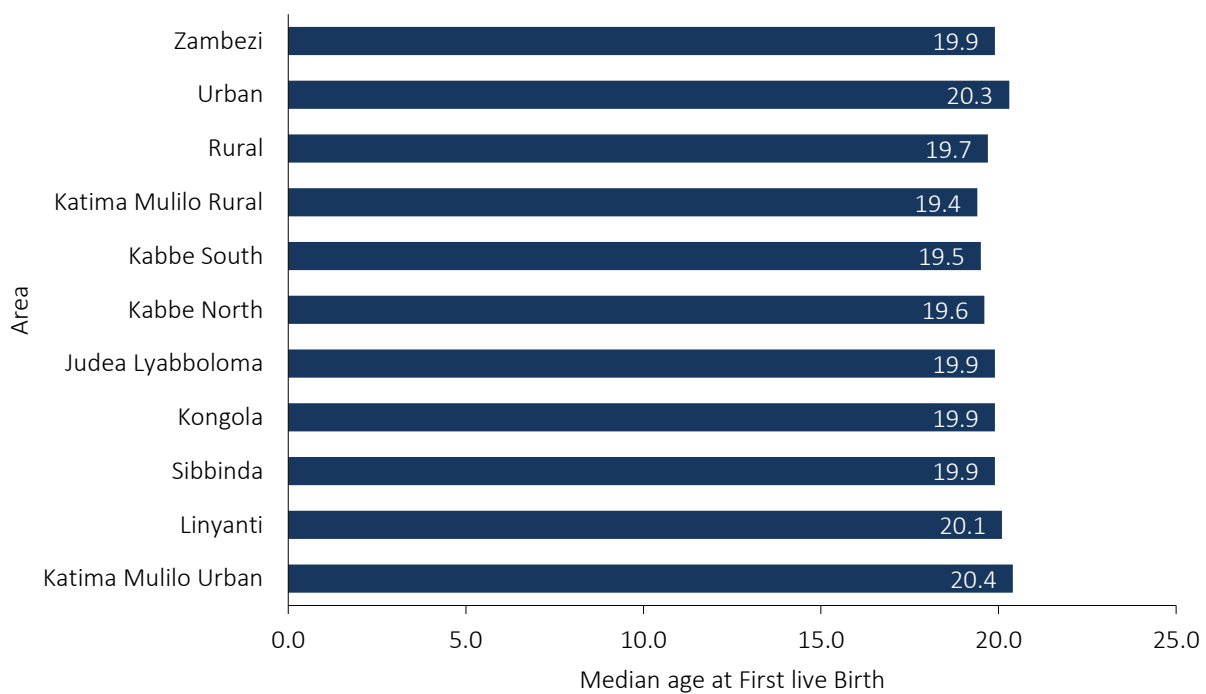

5.1.2. Age at First Live Birth

In Zambezi region, the median age of mothers at first live birth was 19.9 years. Mothers in rural (19.7 years) gave birth at a younger age compared to mothers in urban (20.3 years) areas. Moreover, at constituency level, the median age at first live birth in Katima Mulilo Urban (20.4 years) is the highest while, Katima Mulilo Rural (19.4 years) is the least.

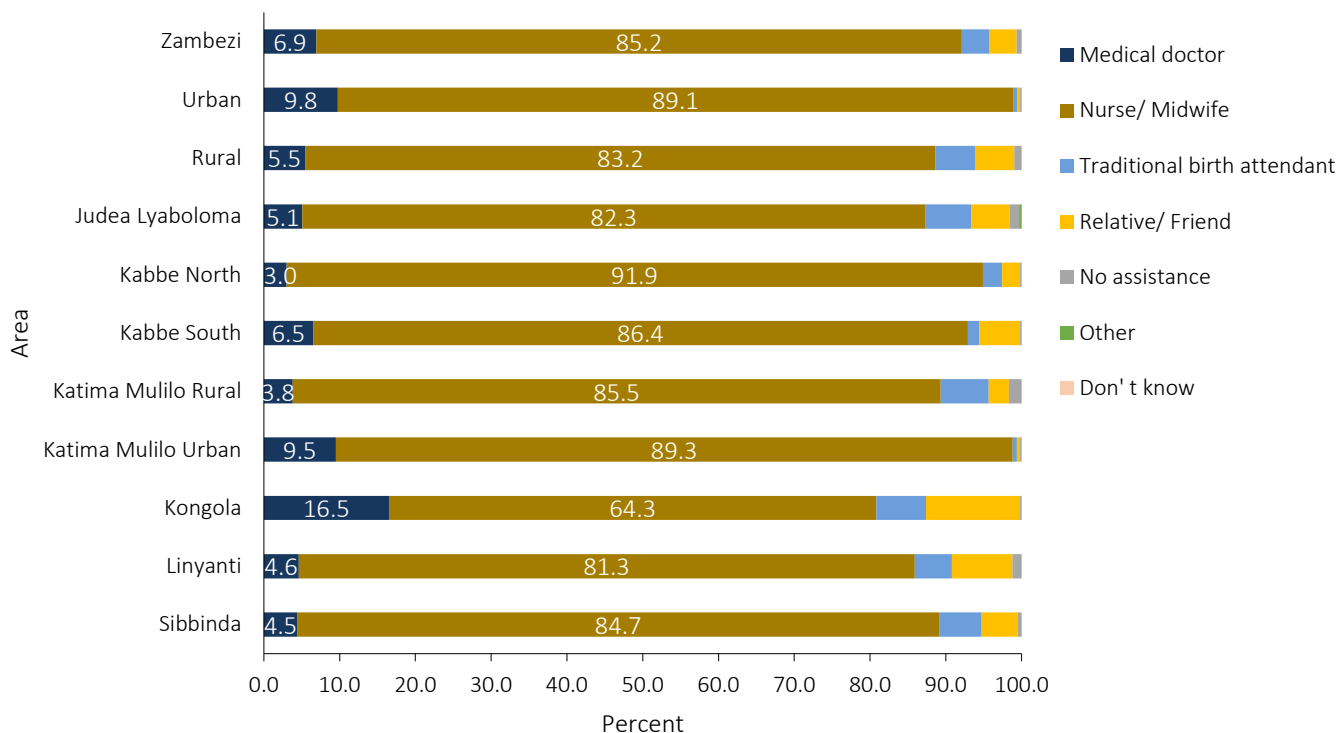
Figure 5.1: Median age of mother at first live birth by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census



5.1.3. Birth Delivery Assistance

About 92 percent of the births in Zambezi region were assisted by medical professionals (medical doctors and nurse/ midwives) and this overall pattern is replicated in most areas, except for rural areas, Judea Lyaboloma, Kongola, Linyanti and Sibbinda constituencies who have less than 90 percent of births attended by medical professionals. However, it is worth noting that birth deliveries assisted by (non-medical professionals) relative/ Friend were the highest in Kongola.

5.2. Mortality

This section provides information on deaths that occurred in the household in the last 12 months (October 2022 to September 2023) as well as the direct estimates of Crude Death Rates (CDR) which portray the overall mortality pattern in the country.

5.2.1. Crude Death Rate (CDR)

There were 916 deaths reported in the year preceding the Census, Table 5.2 shows that for every 1,000 people in Zambezi region, there were 6.4 deaths. The CDR was higher in rural (6.8 deaths per 1,000 population) than urban areas (5.6 deaths per 1,000 population). The highest CDR was recorded in Judea Lyaboloma (8.1 deaths per 1,000 population) while the lowest was in Katima Mulilo Urban constituency (5.7 deaths per 1,000 population).

5.2.2. Reported deaths

Deaths reported in Zambezi region were prevalent among infants (under the age of one year) with more male (82) deaths compared to females (61), and among the elderly aged 80 years and above with more female deaths.

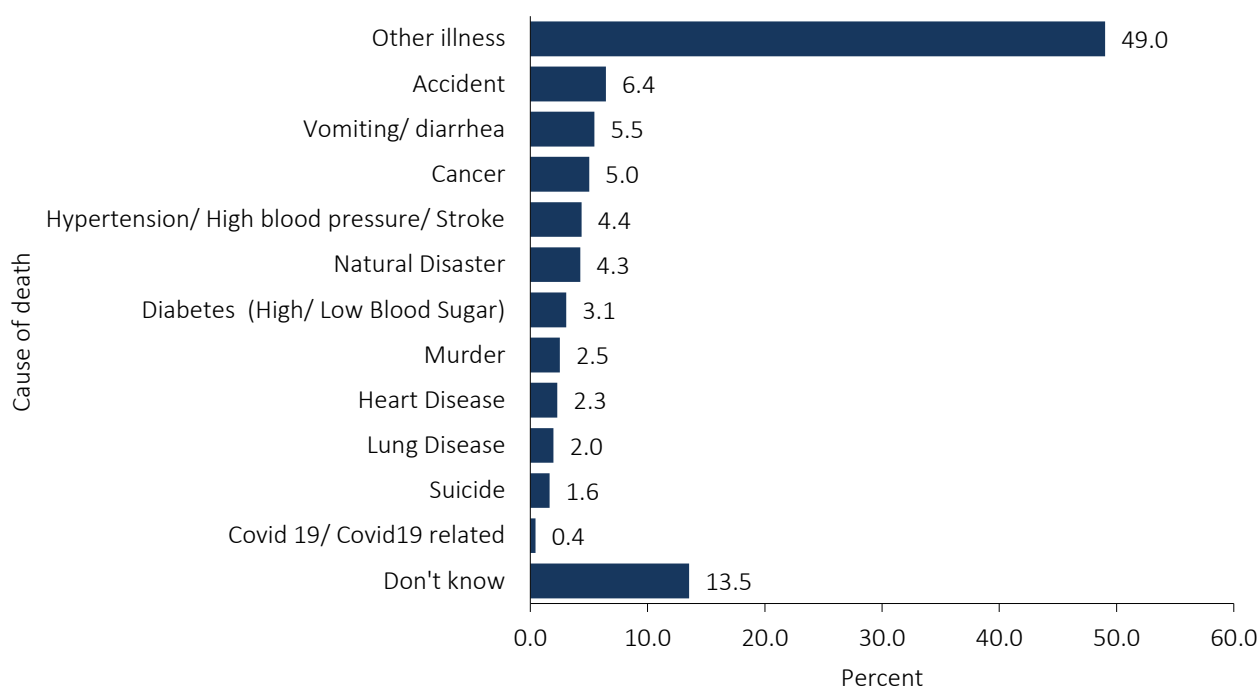

5.2.3. Causes of death

In Zambezi region, the highest cause of deaths was other illness (49.0%) while Covid 19/ Covid 19 related (0.4%) was the least cause of deaths.

CHAPTER 6 : HOUSEHOLDS AND HOUSING CHARACTERISTICS

This chapter provides information on household characteristics, particularly on household size, head of household, main source of income/ livelihood, main language spoken at home, and assets. Furthermore, it analyses the characteristics of housing (type of housing, tenure, building materials), covering all structures used as dwelling units and amenities.

6.1. Number of households

The number of households in Zambezi increased by 75.2 percent between 2011 and 2023. The number of households in urban areas increased significantly by 82.3 percent. At constituency level, Katima Mulilo Rural (93.1%) had the highest increase in the number of households.

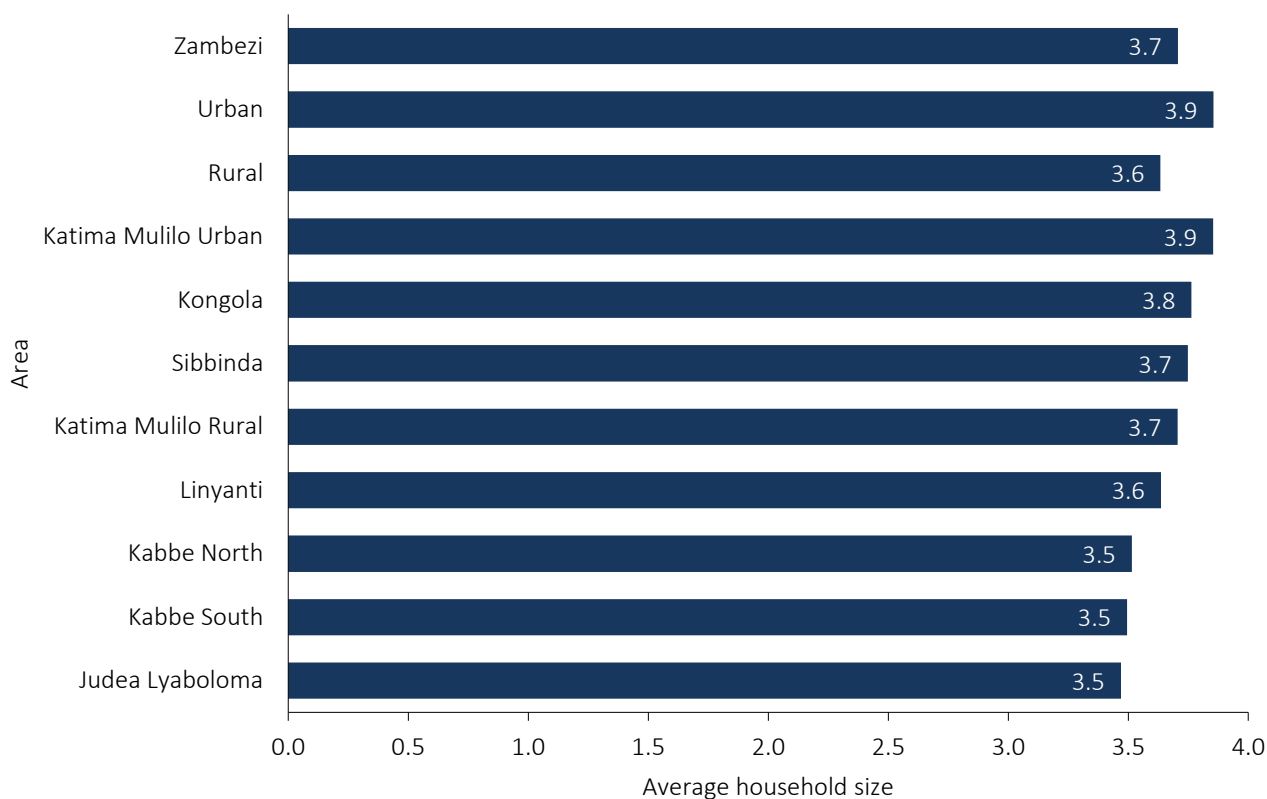

6.2. Household size

In Zambezi, the average household size was 3.7 persons in 2023. The urban household size was higher than that of rural areas with 3.9 and 3.6 persons, respectively. At constituency level, Katima Mulilo Urban recorded the highest household size with 3.9 persons, while Kabbe South, Kabbe North and Judea Lyaboloma constituencies recorded the lowest (3.5 persons) average household size.

Figure 6.1: Average household size by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census



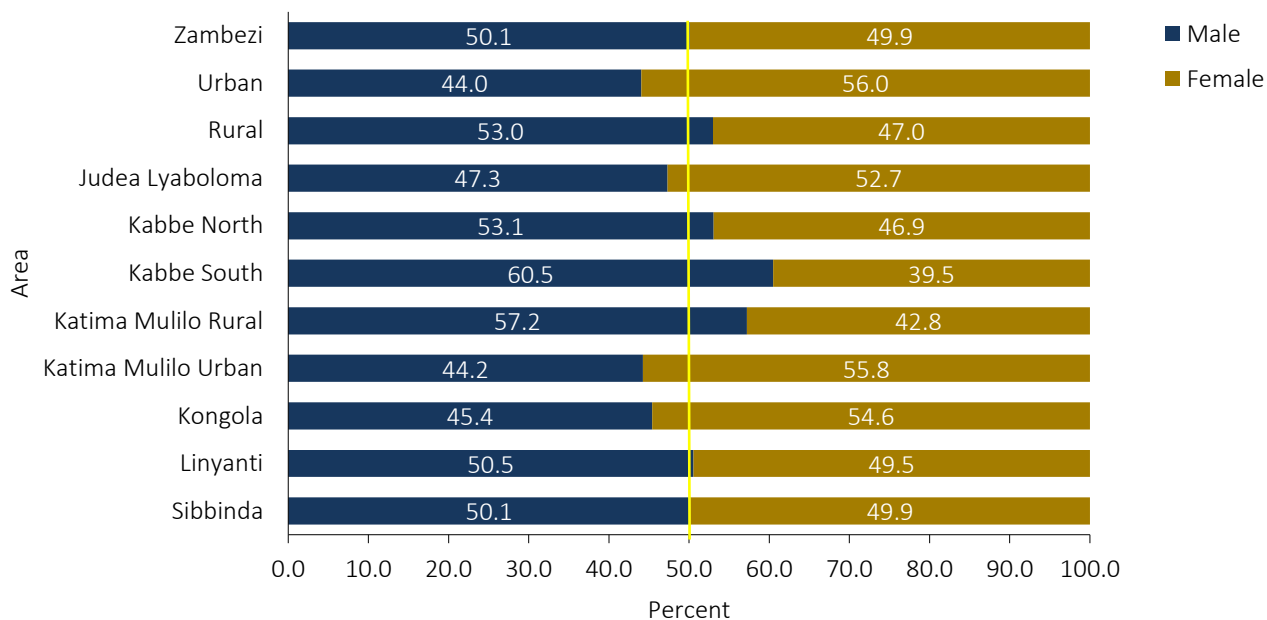
6.3. Household Headship

The head of household is a person, of either sex who is looked upon by other members of the household as their leader or main decision-maker.

6.3.1. Sex of Household Head

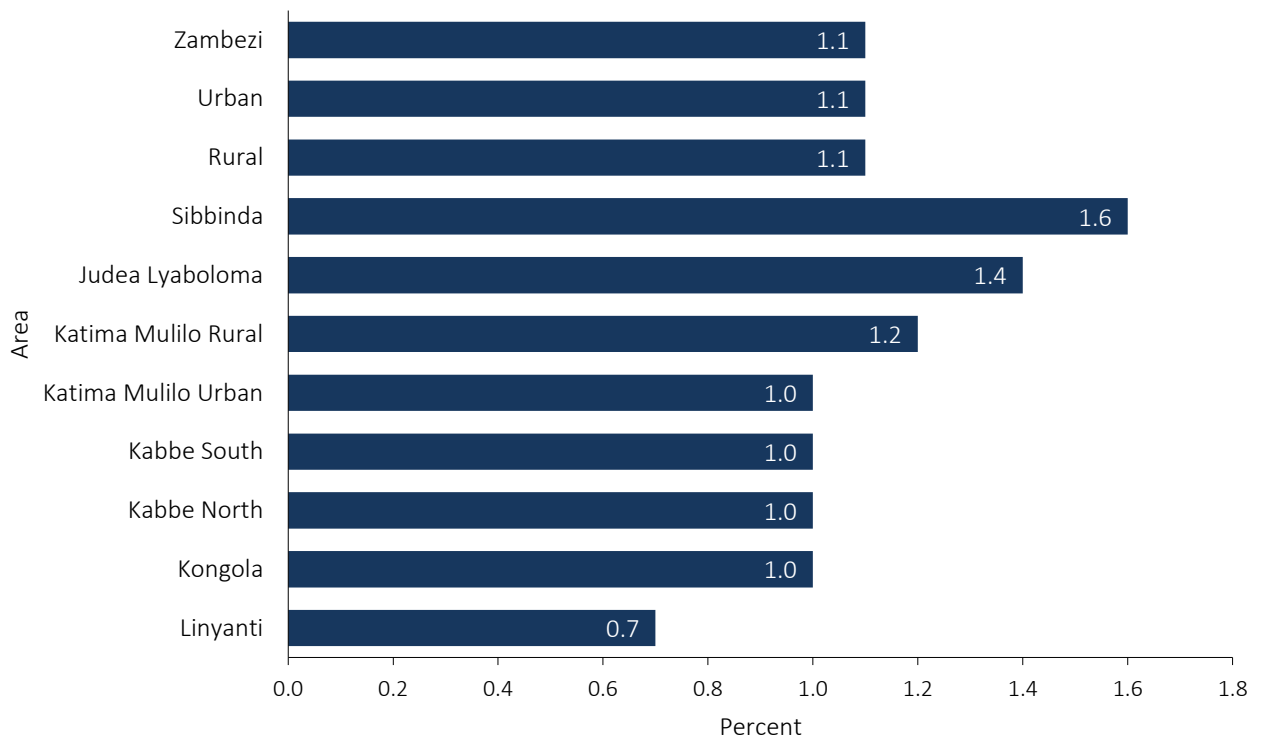
Figure 6.2: Percent distribution of household head by area and sex: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census

Figure 6.2 shows that the households in Zambezi region were almost equally headed by males (50.1%) and females (49.9%). Most households in urban areas were headed by females (56.0%) while rural households were mostly headed by males (53.0%). Most constituencies had their households headed by males except for Judea Lyaboloma, Katima Mulilo Urban and Kongola.

6.3.2. Household headed by children (17 years and below)

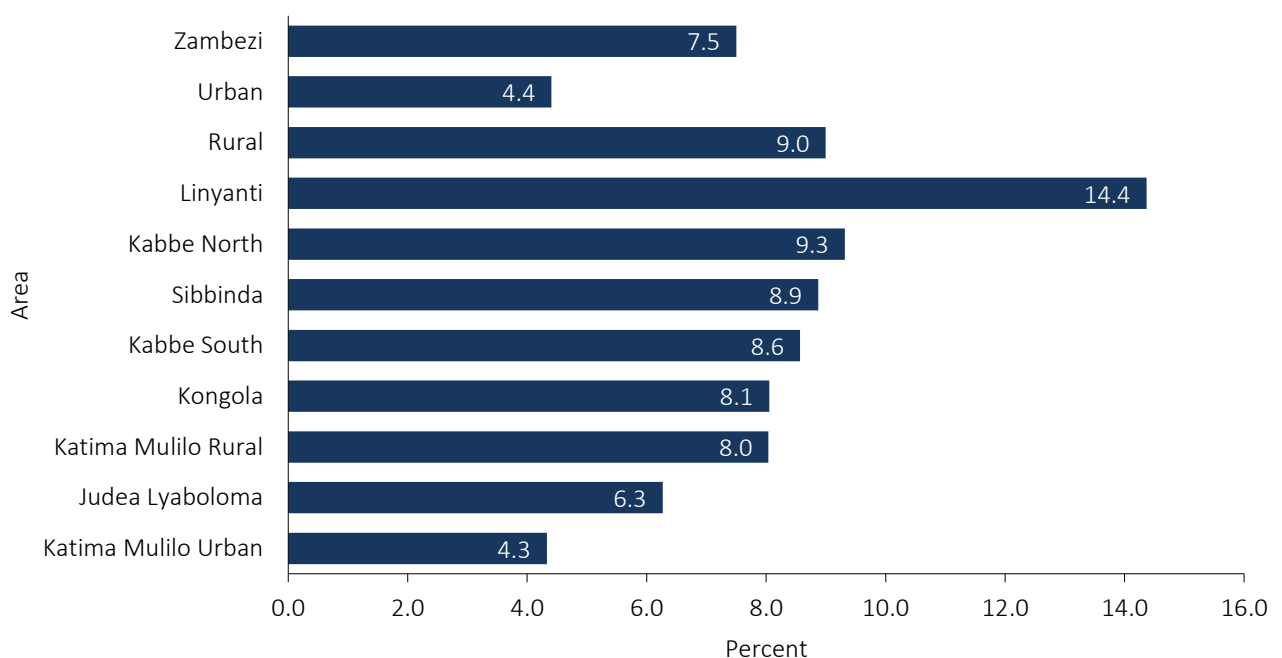
Figure 6.3: Percent distribution of child-headed households by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census

Figure 6.3 shows that almost 1 percent of households in Zambezi were headed by children. Urban and rural areas as well as the constituencies had a similar pattern as the region except for Sibbinda which had close to 2 percent of households headed by children.

6.3.3. Household headed by persons with a lot of difficulty or cannot do at all in at least one domain

This sub-section presents information on the general health and functioning of the head of household based on six Washington Group (WG) short set of functional questions/ domains: namely seeing, hearing, communicating, walking or climbing stairs, remembering or concentrating, and self-care. Households headed by persons with a lot of difficulty or cannot do an activity at all in at least one domain were 7.5 percent in Zambezi region. A higher percentage of households headed by persons with a lot of difficulty or cannot do an activity at all in at least one domain was observed in rural areas (9.0%) than urban areas (4.4%). Furthermore, Linyanti constituency (14.4%) had the highest percentage of households headed by persons with a lot of difficulty or cannot do an activity at all in at least one domain while Katima Mulilo Urban constituency (4.3%) had the least.

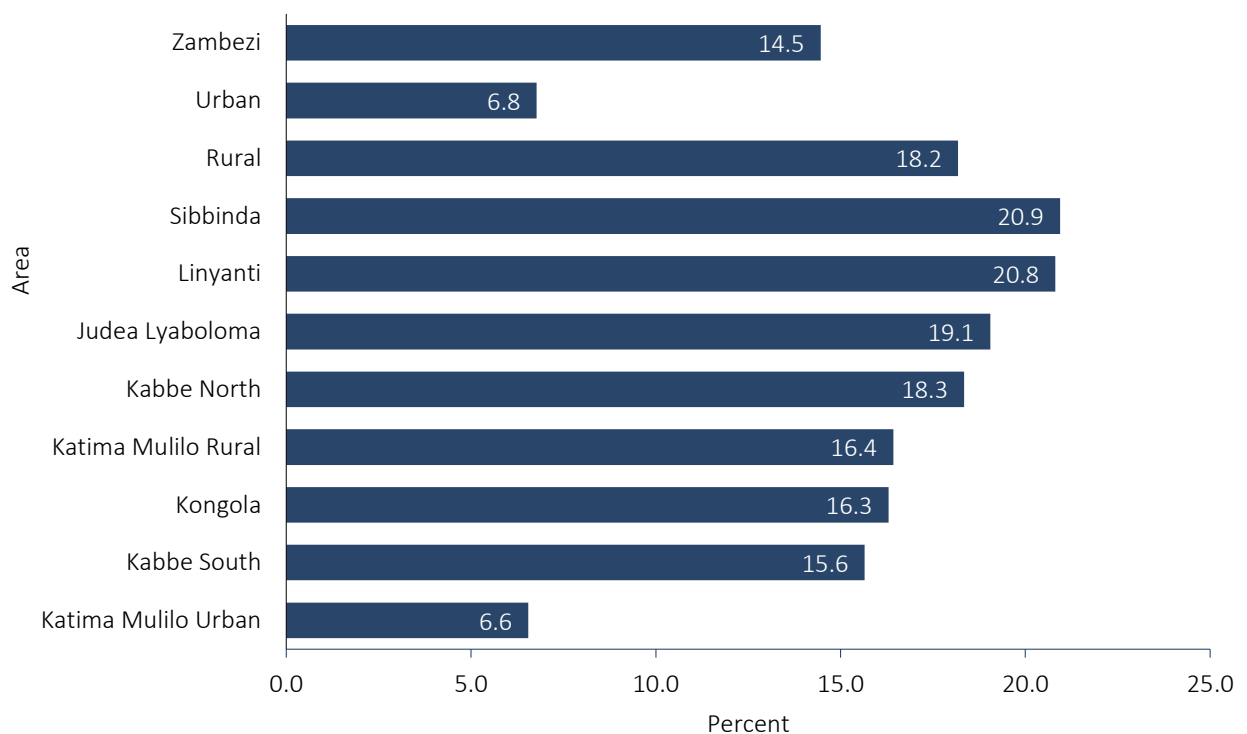
Figure 6.4: Distribution of households headed by persons with a lot of difficulty or cannot do at all in at least one domain by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census



6.3.4. Household headed by elderly persons (60 years and above)

Figure 6.5 shows that 14.5 percent of households were headed by elderly persons, with rural areas (18.2%) recording a higher percentage than urban areas (6.8%). At constituency level Sibbinda (20.9%) followed by Linyanti (20.8%) recorded the highest number of households headed by elderly persons.

6.4 Household Main Source of Livelihood/ Survival

Information on the main source of livelihood/ survival determines the livelihood or ways of survival of a household. Livelihood referred to here is not only in monetary terms but can also be the main products being produced for consumption/ sale.

Table 6.2 shows that most households depended on salaries and/or wages (37.8%) as their main source of livelihood/ survival, while the least main source of income was Cash remittances domestic (not including alimony/child support) (1.0%).

6.5. Language Spoken at home

This section focuses on the main language spoken at home which refers to the language usually spoken or most often spoken in the household.

Results presented in table 6.3 show that Sisubiya (30.5%) was the most spoken language in the region followed by Silozi (Sikololo) with 25.8 percent, while Kwe/kxoe/Mbarakwengo was the least spoken language at home amongst the top ten language spoken at home in Zambezi region

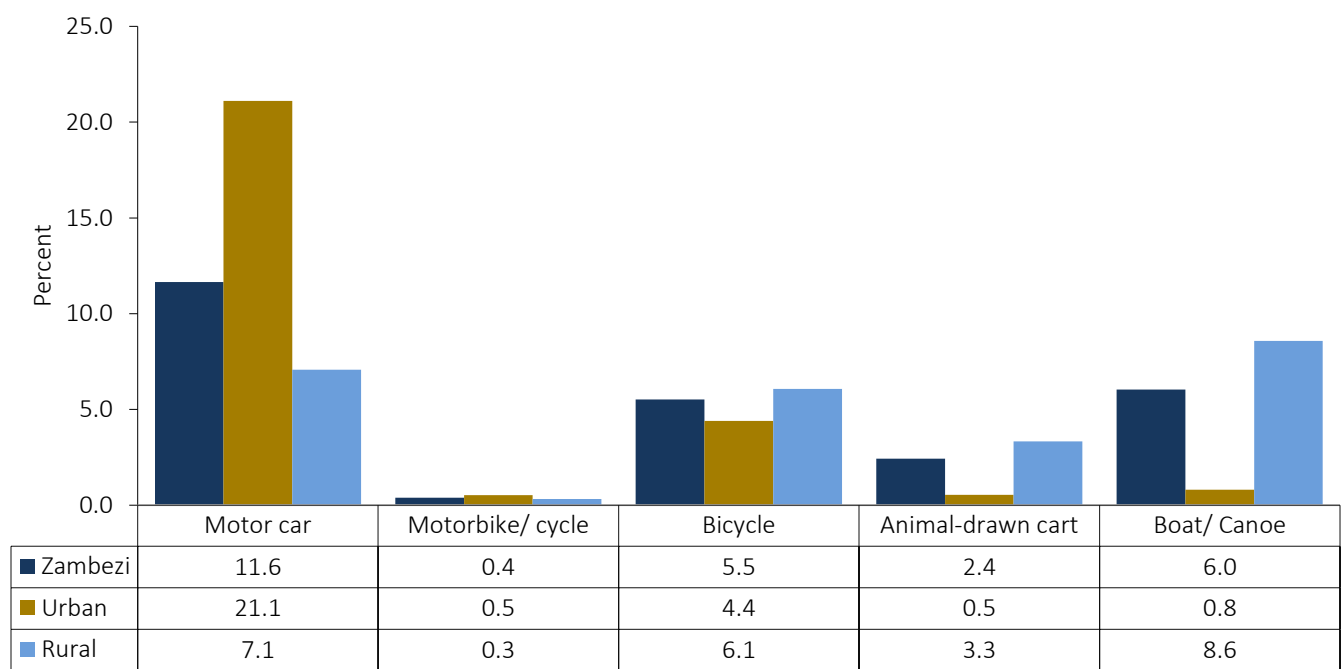
6.6. Household assets

Assets ownership is an important indicator of social welfare and living standards, and therefore households that own certain assets depict a certain standard of living. It should be noted that a household can own or have access to one or more assets.

6.6.1. Transportation assets

In Zambezi, about 12 percent of the households owned motor cars as part of their transportation assets, with more in urban areas (21.1%) compared to rural areas (7.1%).

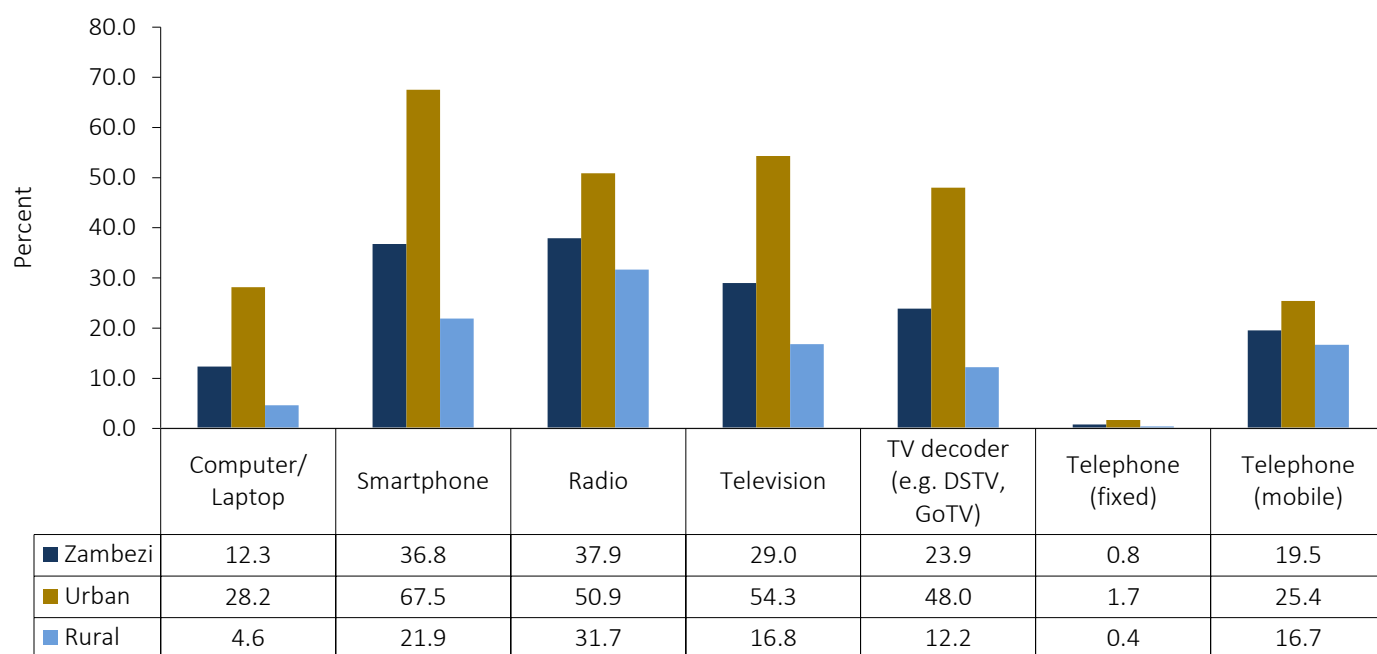
Figure 6.6: Percent distribution of households who owned selected transportation assets by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census



6.6.2. Communication assets

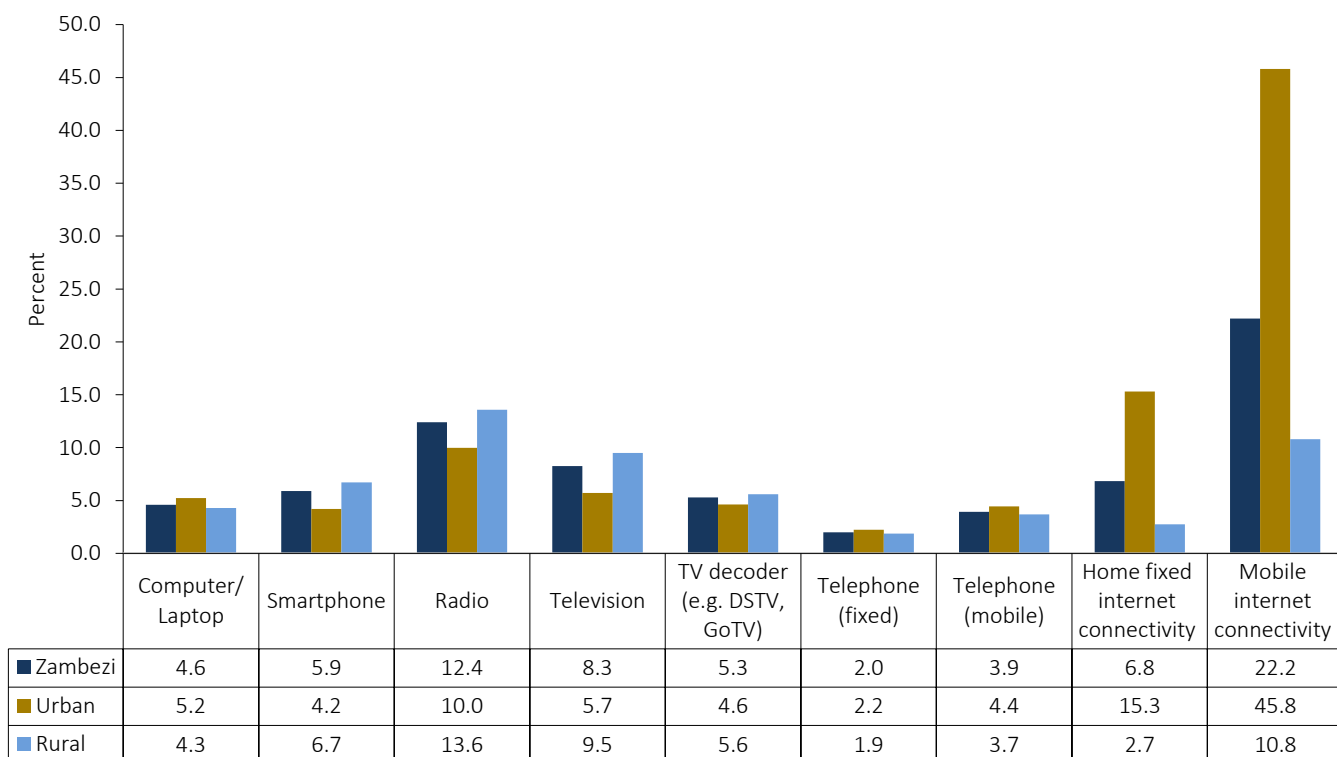
Most households in Zambezi region owned radios (37.9%). In urban areas, most households owned smartphones (67.5%) while most rural households owned radios (31.7%).

Figure 6.8: Percent distribution of households with access to selected communication assets by area: Zambezi region, Namibia, 2023 Census

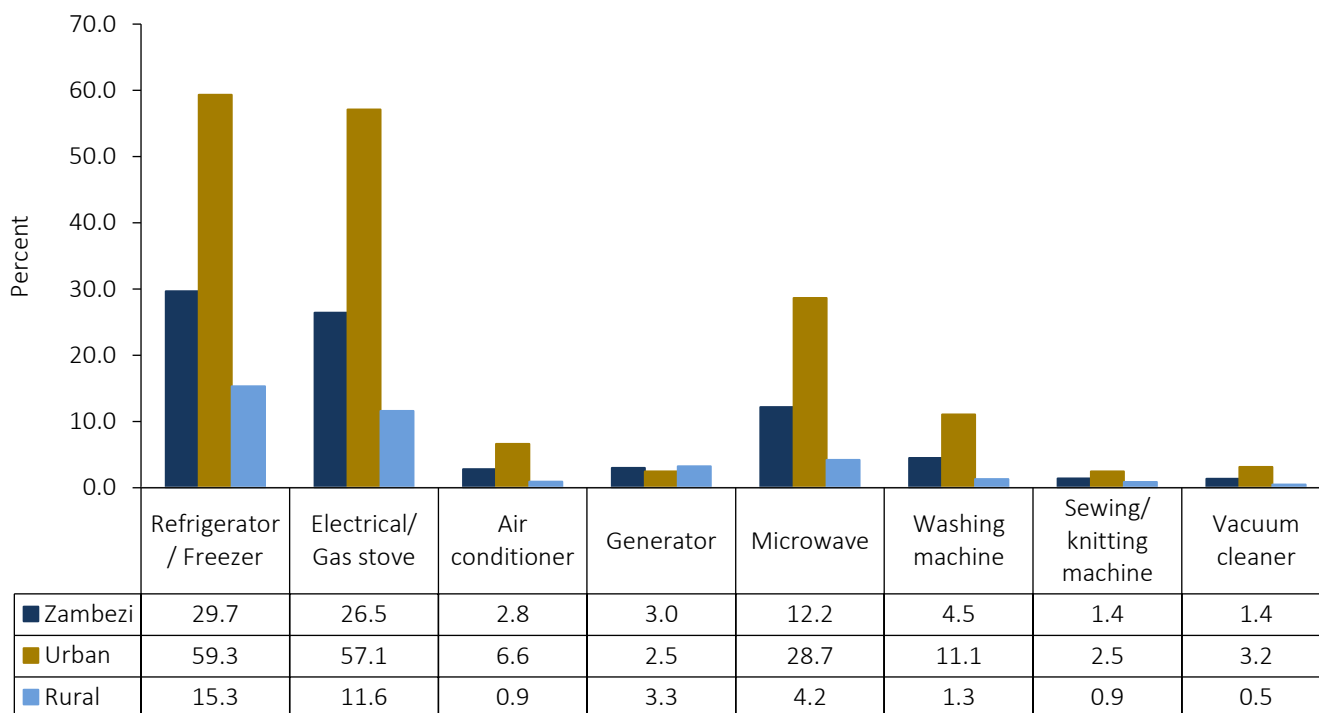

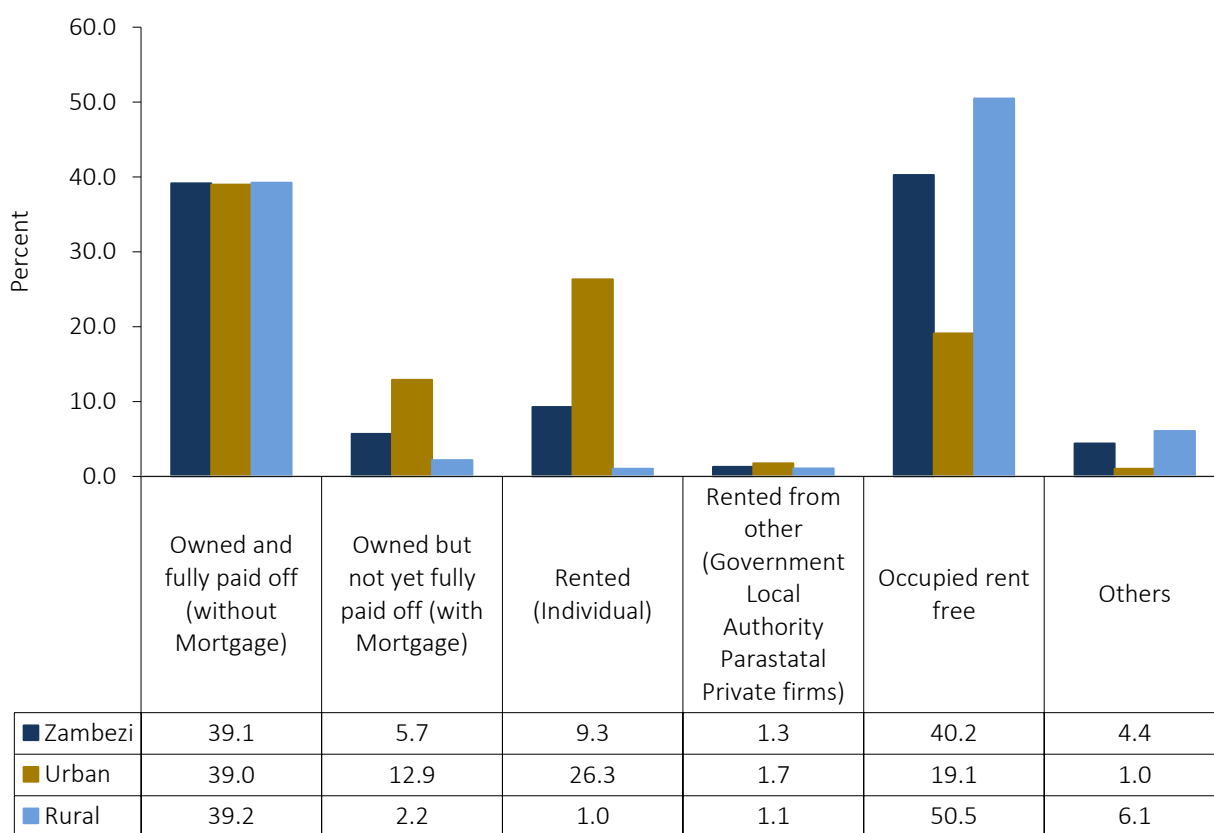

6.8. Tenure status

Most households in Zambezi occupied dwelling units that were rent free (40.2%), and this was the same in rural areas. While household owned and fully paid off without mortgage (39.2%) were predominant in rural areas.

6.9. Main Construction Materials

The section presents information on the materials used to construct walls, floors, and roofs, which are important indicators of the socio-economic conditions and welfare of households.

6.9.1. Materials used for outer wall

Table 6.5 shows that, 44.1 percent of household's outer walls in Zambezi were made from mud/ clay bricks followed by Sticks with mud/ Clay/ Cow dung (25.2%). However Urban areas household's outer walls were mostly made from Cement block/ Bricks/ Stones (42.2%). At constituency level, Katima Mulilo Urban recorded the highest percentage of household's outer walls made from Cement block/ Bricks/ Stones (42.1%).

6.9.2. Materials used for the floor

The main material used for floors in Zambezi households was mud/clay, with 49.3 percent. The same trend was observed for rural areas (60.9%) as compared to urban areas (25.5%). However at constituency level, Katima Mulilo Urban main material used for floors was Tiles (Ceramic/ Wood/ Plastic (30.8%).

6.9.3. Materials used for roof

In Zambezi, the main material used for roofing was households was Corrugated iron/ Zinc sheet with 77.7 percent. The same trend was observed for all areas.

6.10. Amenities

This section provides information about main sources of energy, water supply and sanitation, and waste disposal of households.

6.10.1 Source of energy

Information gathered from private households on energy usage for cooking and lighting offers valuable insights into social conditions and development.

In Zambezi, Battery Lamp/ Torch/ Cellphone (49.5%) was the highest used main source of energy for lighting. However Urban areas depend more on electricity (68.7%) for lighting, while rural areas mostly use Battery Lamp/ Torch/ Cellphone (63.4%).

6.10.2. Water Supply and Sanitation

This section covers the main source of water for cooking, drinking, type of toilet facility and means of waste disposal. Inadequate access to safe water and poor sanitation are public health concerns because they create conditions conducive to the spread of diseases. Information on the type of toilet facilities for households was also collected during the census to find out the level of access to proper toilet facilities in the region.

In Zambezi, 84.4 percent of households used safe water for cooking. However, the main source of water for cooking was piped water inside (26.5%). Most households in urban areas used piped water inside (50.3%), while in rural areas most households used water from boreholes/boreholes with tank covered (30.7%). It's worth mentioning that only 37.1 percent of the households in Kabbe South uses safe water for cooking.

Majority of households (84.2%) in Zambezi region used safe water for drinking. However, the main source of water for drinking was piped water inside (26.4%). Most households in urban areas used piped water inside (50.2%), while in rural areas most households used water from boreholes/ boreholes with tank covered (30.6%). More than 60 percent of the households in Kabbe south drink water from the unsafe sources.

Table 6.12 shows that 77.5 percent of the households in the region do not have toilet facilities while only 18.4 percent use flush toilets. The percentage of households with no toilet facility is much higher in rural areas (88.6%) compared to urban (54.5%) areas.

6.10.3 Garbage or Waste Disposal

Table 6.13 shows that the most common means of waste disposal in Zambezi region was dumping in the field/ bush (32.3%) followed by burning (20.9%). This trend is observed in rural areas however in urban areas most common means of disposal was “Regularly collected” waste with 49.3 percent.

ANNEX I: Definition of concepts

Dwelling unit

- Dwelling unit is a building/ structure where households live. It's a place of residence occupied by one or more households.
- Sometimes a household can occupy more than one building/ structure. On the other hand, households can occupy only part of the buildings/ structure; in that case, that building/ structure becomes the Dwelling unit for all households within it. Buildings/ structures can be classified into dwelling units, living quarters other than dwelling units (institutions) and non-dwelling units.

Institutions

An institution can be defined as sets of premises in a permanent structure or structures designed to accommodate groups of persons who are bound by either a common public objective or a common personal interests. Institutions can be categorized into two groups, i.e. residential and non-residential institutions.

- Residential institutions include institutions where people may be allowed to reside for certain period of time for learning or employment purposes.
- Non-residential institutions include institutions such as hotel/lodges, police holding cells hospitals, etc. These groups of people cannot be said to belong to a conventional household since they do not meet the same criteria as that of a household.

Households (Conventional/ Private)

A household usually consists: (1) of one or more persons, related or unrelated, (2) who live together in the same house/ homestead/ compound, but not necessarily in the same dwelling unit, (3) who have the same or common catering or eating arrangements (cook and eat together), and (4) who are answerable to the same head of household.

Homestead

It is an isolated compound with one or more structures, and usually inhabited by one or more households. In most cases homesteads will be surrounded by fences, hedges, wall etc. A homestead may contain a traditional dwelling or a group of traditional dwellings. A traditional dwelling will thus be considered a homestead. However, a wall/ fence or hedge need not necessarily surround a homestead. For instance, boys' quarters, garage, kitchen etc. may be part of a homestead whether or not they are surrounded by a fence/ wall, etc. During interviews, you will visit homesteads and identify the structures, dwelling units and households in homesteads.

Household members

Refers to all persons who were actually present in the household on the census reference night, including visitors except those attending social events (Birthday parties, weddings, funerals etc.), employees on night shift and resident domestic servants and their families.

Head of household

The head of household is the person of either sex who is looked upon by other members of the household as their leader or main decision-maker. If she/ he was absent on the CRN, the next responsible adult member (**acting head of household**) should be considered as the head.

***Note:** a head of household should be 12 years and above.*

Usual Member

Usual member refers to persons who have been living in the household for 6 months or more, or intend to stay in the household for the next 6 months.

Census Reference Night (CRN)

All interviews must relate to CRN, except for selected parts of the questionnaire, in this case an alternative reference is stated (e.g. some questions in Section E have a reference of last 7 days). The CRN was the night of 24 September 2023.

De Facto

A de-facto method enumerates all persons found within the borders of a particular country at a particular point in time (i.e. CRN).

De Jure

A de jure method interviews all persons who are usually living within the border of a particular country or household, even if they were not present during the time of the census.

Sex ratio

Sex ratio is the proportion of males per 100 females in a given population.

Marital status

Refers to the legal and social status of an individual in relation to marriage. It indicates whether a person is married, never married, divorced, widowed, or in a consensual union (living together as if married/ cohabitating).

Median age at first marriage/ consensual union

Refers to the age at which half of the persons or a group of persons in a population get married/ consensual union for the first time, providing a central point that is less influenced by extreme values.

Albinism

Is a rare, non-contagious, genetically inherited condition characterized by reduced or no melanin production, resulting in light skin, hair, and eyes, vision impairment, and sensitivity to sunlight (WHO).

Orphanhood

Refers to persons aged 17 years and below who have lost either one or both parents.

Literacy

Is the ability to read and write with understanding in any language. All persons aged 15 years and above were asked whether they can read and write in any language with understanding, but no test was administered to determine the level of literacy.

Formal education

Refers to any regular formal educational institution, public or private for systematic of any level of education.

School attendance

Is defined as a full-time attendance at any regular educational institution, public or private, for systematic instruction for longer than a year.

School enrolment

Refers to the school-going population aged 6 to 24 years who were attending school, excluding those attending adult education.

Educational attainment

Refers to the highest level of education completed (refers to a complete cycle whether it was pass or fail).

Household size

Is the average number of persons in the household.

Head of household

Is a person, of either sex who is looked upon by other members of the household as their leader or main decision-maker.

Tenure

Refers to the conditions that govern individuals' rights to occupy dwelling units.
